



To determine the prevalence of rheumatic diseases within the British Bangladeshi population, he has initiated free health screening events held at community hubs.

It provides comprehensive screenings for autoimmune arthritis to make it possible for many community members to receive early diagnoses and prompt treatment, significantly improving their longterm health outcomes. Understanding the financial barriers faced by many Bangladeshi students, Dr. Mazumder established a fund specifically aimed at providing financial assistance to those in need. This fund covers tuition fees, textbooks, and other essential educational resources. Dr. Mazumder's contributions to medical research are equally noteworthy. He has published many papers in prestigious medical journals.

He is actively involved in training the next generation of physicians, serving as a GMC-approved Educational Supervisor for the Medicine and Rheumatology Trainees. He is an examiner of MRCP exam. He wrote a chapter for the upcoming 5th edition of the Oxford Textbook of Rheumatology. His outstanding contributions to Rheumatology and Acute Medicine, merged with his benevolent aptitude for patient care, made him a deserving recipient of the Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians (FRCP) London.

Mohammed Afruz Miah BEM, affectionately known as "Oldham's Running Man", is a shining example of how personal transformation can ignite community change. Once a maths tutor facing serious health challenges, Afruz embraced running to turn his life around and in doing so, he discovered a powerful way to serve others.

What began as daily jogs soon grew into headline endurance feats. From running 313 kilometres from Oldham to London while fasting in Ramadan(twice), to climbing Mount Kilimanjaro, skydiving, 24hr fitness challenges and recently completing the Miles4Humanity challenge 10 km every day for a year, actually 386 which is a record!

Afruz has pushed himself to extraordinary limits. Each step was dedicated to raising funds and awareness for those most in need, especially through his close work with Global Relief Trust and local and national charities in the UK!

Beyond his running, Afruz has personally travelled to deliver humanitarian aid in war-torn areas and regions struck by natural disasters standing side by side with communities in crisis. His relentless efforts have raised over £750,000 for Palestine to date and an astonishing over £3 million for causes worldwide.

His tireless dedication has not gone unnoticed. In 2022, Afruz was awarded the British Empire Medal (BEM) in recognition of his outstanding charitable work. He was further honoured with invitations to represent his community on the national stage taking part in the Queen's Platinum Jubilee torchlit procession and being among the select few invited inside Westminster Abbey for the historic Coronation of King Charles III. Sitting just metres from the royal procession, Afruz's journey from Oldham's streets to Britain's grandest ceremony became a symbol of hope and inspiration for countless others.

And his journey is far from over. Afruz has a calendar of forthcoming challenges, including international marathons, bold new cycling adventures, and a series of creative "out-of-the-box" endurance feats each one designed to inspire, to unite and to raise even more for those most in need.

Through every challenge, Afruz carries a simple but powerful message: faith, fitness and fundraising can change lives. He continues to inspire young people, families, and communities across the UK and beyond proving that one person's determination really can move mountains, cross finish lines, and light the way for others.

Mr Miah is an eminent business personality and established social worker. Harun Miah plays a vital role in the field of social services. He is associated closely with many socio-cultural and social welfare organisations both inside and outside the country. Harun Miah is one of the Trustees of London based Bangladesh Centre, member of the Bangladesh Welfare Association UK, Member of the Golapgonj Education Trust, Founder member of Al Emdad High School and College, Chairman of Al-Emdad Degree College Trust UK. Director of UK Bangladesh Catalysts of Commerce & Industry (UKBCCI). He is also a Permanent Member of Sylhet Club Limited.

He was also the treasurer of the Golden Jubilee Celebration Committee of Al Emdad High School and College. He personally contributed and helped raise over £100,000 and continuing to raise till now for Al-Emdad, as well as being a member of the British Cheque Cashers Association and UKMTA.

Mr Miah owns a number of business under the Kushaira name which includes "Kushaira Financial Services Limited worldwide money transfer and bureau de change and Kushaira Travels Ltd, IATA, ATOL & Biman Approve also Kushiara Cash and Carry" in Commercial Road East London. In addition he is also the owner of Bangla Frozen Food Ltd. Md Harun Miah has not only worked hard in the UK to distinguish himself but also has worked relentlessly in his home country of Bangladesh.

He is a Director of Shahjalala Islami Bank in Bangladesh and has been appointed as Vice Chairman of the bank from 2010 to 2013 and 2016 to 2017 respectively. He is also a director of Shahjalal Islami Bank Security Limited. He holds directorship in Pritom Hotel Dhaka and current Chair of the organisation. He is director of the Windsor Hotel & Resort Ltd.He is director of the Syldon Hospital. He is also the owner of Kushiara International Travels in Bangladesh. Mr Miah has been a long serving pillar of the community not only as a distinguished social worker. He is also working with to fundrising Stenhagen Mosque in Uppsala Sweden. # **Abdus Samad**

# **Sector:** Entrepreneur/Philantraphy

Abdus Samad is an outstanding British entrepreneur, philanthropist, and community leader whose lifelong dedication to philanthropy, education, and business-led community development has had a transformative impact across both the UK and Bangladesh. Mr. Samad has consistently demonstrated how private enterprise can be a powerful force for public good.

A pioneer in the early online food tech scene in London, Mr. Samad launched CurryLondon.co.uk in 2005—an innovative platform that digitised food delivery services well ahead of its time. His entrepreneurial journey has since evolved across multiple sectors, including hospitality, insurance, private hire, real estate, and technology.

As CEO of Vantage Accident Management Group (VAMG) since 2009. In 2015, he founded Medx-UK Ltd, a private hire vehicle rental company that became a lifeline during the COVID-19 pandemic, offering rent-free vehicles to over 80 drivers facing financial hardship. Through Al-Baraka Investment Ltd, he has supported a portfolio of residential and commercial developments designed to stimulate local economic activity and provide affordable housing options. In 2014 he was one of the co-founder of Love2laundry, online laundry service operating in United Kingdom, Ireland, USA, UAE, Pakistan, and in Netherlands.

His most ambitious and socially impactful venture to date is Futuredesh, launched in 2024. This FinTech platform supports over 700 rural entrepreneurs and farmers across Bangladesh through an innovative shared-profit model. The initiative, backed by 130 socially conscious investors, is helping to build a circular rural economy that focuses on contract farming, manufacturing, retail, and textiles. The project places particular emphasis on empowering women, young people, and smallholders, offering not just financial inclusion but also capacity-building and sustainable livelihoods.

Mr. Samad's dedication to education and youth empowerment is equally noteworthy. He has played a key role in supporting institutions in Bangladesh through Abdus Samad Foundation including Kalam & Samad High School, the AFK Trust Islamic Education Centre, and the Ansarun Nessa Orphanage. His contributions have provided hundreds of underprivileged children with access to quality education, safe housing, and better life opportunities.

In the UK, Mr. Samad has shown exemplary civic leadership. As Chairperson of the Bengali Workers Association (2014-2019) and Director of the West Euston Project Ltd, he implemented programmes in elderly care, women's empowerment, healthy eating, and entrepreneurial training for BAME youth. These efforts have directly addressed issues of social isolation, inequality, and economic exclusion in some of London's most deprived communities.

His political and diplomatic engagement further reinforces his commitment to community-building. As Vice President of Conservative Friends of Bangladesh, Mr. Samad has championed UK-Bangladesh relations through participation in delegations, social action projects, and cultural exchange initiatives. His work has helped strengthen diaspora ties and promote mutual understanding between communities. A committed humanitarian, Mr. Samad has supported emergency relief efforts across multiple global crises, including the Grenfell Tower Fire, the COVID-19 pandemic, and international aid responses in Gaza, Morocco, Pakistan, and Syria. He works closely with respected charitable organisations such as Fountain of Mercy and CAP Foundation, helping deliver aid where it is needed most.

He is not only a successful business leader but also a role model for socially conscious leadership within the British Bangladeshi community and beyond.

# Cllr Nadia Shah

# **Sector:** Politics/ Philantraphy

First British Bangladeshi Female Mayor for the UK (Camden) and a Global Advocate for Mental Health & Inclusive Public Service, Nadia Shah is not just a local leader — she is a global change maker. With a career grounded in compassion, advocacy, and fearless innovation, Nadia has become one of the UK's most impactful public servants. Her work in international mental health, refugee support, and community-led leadership has improved the lives of some of the world's most vulnerable people — from Camden to Bangladesh, from refugee camps in Myanmar to earthquake zones in Turkey. Born and raised in Camden, London, Nadia made history as the first British Bangladeshi woman to serve as Mayor of Camden (2016-2017). But beyond the title, it was her focus on children's mental health that defined her term. Partnering with the Anna Freud National Centre for Children and Families, she raised a considerable amount to fund SmartGyms a cutting edge therapeutic tools now used in schools across the UK to improve children's mental wellbeing, behaviour, and learning outcomes.

Nadia led a delegation to Bangladesh to highlight the urgent need for mental health services in schools and communities and helped integrate therapeutic mental health education into the national curriculum, and higher education institutions to train drs and nurses, and helped establish Sylhet's first dedicated mental health centre. Her international work didn't stop there. When Rohingya refugees arrived in Bangladesh, fleeing genocide and sexual violence in Myanmar, Nadia was on the ground — working with NGOs and medical teams to implement the delivery of antenatal care, trauma counselling, and psychological support for amongst 80,000 women and children. delivered in local dialects and cultural contexts, ensuring dignity and respect.

Following devastating floods in Bangladesh, she co-chaired emer-

gency meetings with UK diaspora leaders and raised funds to deliver food, medical aid, and home reconstruction. After the 2023 Turkey earthquake, she led a female-led humanitarian convoy to Adana province, distributing female hygiene kits, building a playground in a refugee camp, and delivering trauma-informed support to children.

All this global work is underpinned by Nadia's relentless commitment to the people of Camden. She has served in senior Cabinet roles for over a decade, leading on Equalities, Youth Employment, Rough Sleeping, Safer Communities, and more. Amongst much more She has recently Secured over £5 million annually for Camden's voluntary and community sector Helped make Camden a Borough of Sanctuary for refugees Launched the Camden Equity Network and "Black on Board" to drive inclusive leadership Pioneered policies for violence against women and girls, community safety, and anti-racism.

Chairs the Interfaith Leaders Network - ensuring cohesion between faith leaders Her leadership style is defined by presence. Whether connecting the UK with networks abroad, sitting with families affected by trauma, or coordinating international aid responses, Nadia leads with empathy, not ego.

She believes, "It's not about programmes. It's about people." And she lives that every day.

As a powerful advocate for mental health and cross-cultural public service, Nadia Shah represents a new kind of leadership: one rooted in lived experience, informed by community voices, and driven by a deep belief in human dignity. Whether rebuilding lives after war and disaster, or opening doors for young people and women close to home, Nadia's work is reshaping what public service can look like 'compassionate, inclusive, and global.


Dr. Ahmed's philanthropic commitments extend to healthcare institutions as well. He is a Life Member of the Beani


Sherin's political career began in 2023, when she became the first British Bangladeshi to become a Borough Councillor. She also made history by winning a

Football has always been a central part of Yasmin's life. As a young girl, she loved the game but, at just 13, she stopped playing due to a lack of safe and supportive opportunities for girls. At the time, sessions with female coaches simply didn't exist in her community. Being the only girl in a male dominated space, Yasmin had to give up the sport she loved.

Two decades later, Yasmin wanted to reconnect with something that once brought her joy. At the age of 33, she decided to look for a place to play football when looking for a place she came across a post on the Muslimah Sports Association (MSA) Facebook page offering one final place on an FA Level 1 Coaching Course. Without hesitation, she signed up and started her coaching journey.

From that moment, Yasmin committed herself to transforming opportunities for women and girls in football particularly those from minority communities. She began by volunteering, growing sessions from just five participants to a regular group of 25. One of her most significant early achievements was entering the first South Asian female team, with Muslim players, into the Super 5 Women's League, an inspiring milestone in representation and inclusivity. Today, Yasmin is the Female Development Officer and Head Coach at Frenford & MSA WFC. She coaches over 120 girls every week, providing safe, welcoming spaces for players to develop their skills and confidence.


Yasmin is also an FA Community Champion, a role in which she has successfully recruited and mentored more than 60 female coaches. Many of these women are now delivering sessions in their own communities, further multiplying Yasmin's impact and helping to grow the grassroots game.



In 1983, he took a bold step into entrepreneurship by starting my first business venture.

Over the years, he developed several enterprises, but his proudest achievement in business was founding Roshni Restaurant in 1998. For two decades, Roshni became known for its quality food, hospitality, and community spirit. It was not just a restaurant but a place of connection and pride for many.

His vision has always gone beyond business. He believes deeply in giving back to his homeland and to society. He contributed to the establishment of the first Habiganj Diabetics Hospital, helping provide essential healthcare to countless patients.

In 2014, in memory of his beloved parents,he founded the AK Education Trust. Every year, the trust provides hundreds of scholarships and school supplies to underprivileged children in Nabiganj thana. Education is close to his heart, and he is also a proud supporter of the Homeland IDL School and College, whose students consistently excel in their studies and progress to higher education.

Eyarun Nessa is a British Bangladeshi woman whose journey from a deprived council estate in Yorkshire to national recognition has been defined by breaking barriers and amplifying unheard voices.

The eldest of six siblings, she grew up carrying duty and sacrifice, often putting a band-aid over her own struggles and leading without a blueprint. Married for over 20 years to her husband from Bangladesh, she has also navigated cultural and linguistic complexities that sharpened her resilience and deepened her commitment to others.

From coding rooms to football pitches, Eyarun has broken new ground at every step. She entered computer programming as the only British Bangladeshi woman at the time, navigating a male-dominated space where she faced microaggressions and subtle biases but refused to be diminished.

She carried that same fire into sport working with Bradford City Football Club and completing the Yorkshire Three Peaks, expanding representation for South Asian women. Her achievements were recognised with the Asian Sporting Heritage Award, cementing her role as a pioneer.

Today, she is recognised as a community powerhouse: shaping strategy, championing inclusion, and

leading creative projects that unite thousands across Bradford and beyond. As a Co-Founder, CEO, and board member, she has worked with the NHS, local councils, schools, mosques, and the voluntary sector


to break down barriers and build belonging. Her leadership has been honoured with a Bradford 2025 Community Pillar nomination. She has also hosted British Bangladeshi award events and was featured by Walker Morris, one of the UK's leading law firms, in a programme that spotlighted inspiring leaders who are challenging stereotypes and driving change across the country.

With a strong background in filming, editing, and photography, Eyarun is the only British Bangladeshi woman in her area working professionally in digital storytelling. She is the founder and director of her own filming organisation, through which she has produced powerful work capturing and celebrating Bangladeshi heritage for the next generation - work that has been widely well received by the Bradford 2025 City of Culture and screened at the National Science and Media Museum.

And with that strength, she is opening doors for others and rewriting what it means to be a British Bangladeshi woman today.


Currently, Mr. Quayum is the Chairman and Found-

Mish Rahman (Mohammed Misbhaur Rahman) is a trailblazing political organiser and one of the most prominent British Bangladeshis in UK politics. In 2020, he made history as the first British Bangladeshi elected to the Labour Party's National Executive Committee (NEC), representing grassroots members on the party's highest ruling body. A lifelong champion for social justice, Rahman is a respected community leader, national campaigner, and voice for the working class, with an unwavering commitment to antiracism, equality, anti-austerity and anti-war activism. Born and raised in Walsall, West Midlands whose family originate from Fokir Para, Osmani Nogor, Rahman was the first student of Sylheti heritage to attend Queen Mary's Grammar School in its 500-year

At 19, he co-founded the Bangladeshi Youth Organisation in Walsall, creating a vital institution to empower disadvantaged young people in the face of institutional racism and poverty. In the early 2000s, he led the organisation to deliver education, leisure, and advisory services while securing major funding and building a strong, motivated staff and volunteer team.

With a career spanning business, education, and labour rights, Rahman has been a restaurateur, worked in schools as an Ethnic Minority Achievement Officer, and delivered successful mentoring programmes for underperforming ethnic minority students. He is also co-founder of the Latifiah Fultali

Complex, an educational and community institution in West Bromwich, where he served as General Secretary, and has been Chair of Governors at the British Muslim School.

As National Vice Chair of Momentum, Rahman helped develop the Leo Panitch Leadership Programme, training the next generation of socialist leaders. He currently serves as Chair of Trustees for Show Racism the Red Card, the UK's leading antiracism education charity, and is an alumnus of the Labour Party's Bernie Grant Leadership Programme. His work consistently bridges grassroots activism with high-level strategy and governance.

A seasoned political communicator, Rahman is a regular media contributor, appearing in print and frequently on BBC, Sky News, Channel 4, ITV, LBC, Channel S, and other outlets to discuss topics ranging from Palestine and workers' rights to Islamophobia, racism, and the positive case for immigration.

Rahman is also involved in the development of the new democratic, grassroots political formation Your Party, led by Jeremy Corbyn and Zarah Sultana—a movement aiming to transform politics from the bottom up and give working-class communities a stronger voice.

Through his roles as Labour NEC member, school governor, media commentator, trade unionist, and campaigner, Mish Rahman remains a steadfast advocate for equality, justice, and empowerment across

This sector was created to provide a safe and encouraging space for young girls, particularly those from Bangladeshi and Muslim backgrounds, to engage with sport.

Her work in this area has already had a visible impact, with an increasing number of girls joining and thriving in the programme. Through All Girls Karate, Inaya not only teaches technical skills but also imparts values of confidence, resilience, and discipline.

Inava's journey has been shaped by both achievement and responsibility. As she continues to compete internationally, she remains equally committed to mentorship and community impact. By breaking new ground as a visibly Muslim athlete and championing inclusivity in sport, she has become the very role model she once longed for throughout her own childhood.

Looking ahead, Inaya plans to expand All Girls Karate and inspire even more young women to take up martial arts. She hopes her story will encourage Bangladeshi girls in particular to pursue sport with confidence, proving that representation matters and that barriers can be overcome.


She stands as a proud representative of the British Bangladeshi community, using karate not only as a platform for personal success but as a means to uplift and inspire others.

Suluk Ahmed is a long-standing community activist and politician with deep roots in Tower Hamlets, where he has dedicated decades of service to local people.Born in Sylhet, Bangladesh, Suluk moved to England in 1976 as a child with his mother, Joygun Bibi, and sister, Moksuda Khatun, to join his father, Md Shamuz Ali. His father, a tailor by profession, had settled in the UK in the late 1950s and built a successful business in the leather garments industry from the early 1960s, establishing the family's future in London.Suluk was educated at Daneford Secondary School before studying Business at Newham College. From an early age, he developed a strong passion for sports, particularly football.

In 1977, he co-founded the Progressive Youth Organisation (PYO) football club, where he served as manager, player, captain, and treasurer. During the 1970s and 1980s, Suluk became active in anti-racism campaigns, standing against far-right threats and helping to strengthen resilience and solidarity among Tower Hamlets' diverse communities. In 1980, he joined his father in the family's leather garments business, where he worked for a decade before moving

into the construction sector and later becoming a property developer. Alongside his business career, he remained committed to grassroots activism and public service. His dedication to civic life was formally recognised in 2013 when Tower Hamlets Council appointed him Mayor's Community Champion Coordinatorfor Spitalfields and Bangla Town. The following year, in 2014, he was elected Councillor for Spitalfields and Bangla Town, becoming a strong voice for residents. Over the years, his leadership has been further acknowledged: in 2022 - Re-elected as Councillor and appointed Cabinet Member for Equality & Social Inclusion (served two years), 2024 -Elected Deputy Speaker of Tower Hamlets Council and in 2025 - Appointed Speaker of Tower Hamlets Council.

Suluk has always lived in Tower Hamlets, where he continues to reside with his wife, Rana Ahmed, and their six children: Muslima Ahmed, Rizwana Ahmed, Fahim Ahmed, Jawad Ahmed, Ijaz Ahmed, and Eiliyah Ahmed.

In 2016, Dr. Zakia and her family relocated to the UK, where she joined the NHS. She successfully obtained her MRCP (UK) through the Royal College of Physicians, London, and was subsequently awarded a National Training Number under the East of England Deanery-fully sponsored by the UK government. Her training in Geriatric and Acute Internal Medicine included rotations across four major teaching hospitals, with extensive exposure to subspecialties such as stroke medicine.

Beyond her clinical work, Dr. Zakia is passionately committed to mentoring and supporting overseas medical graduates. She helps them secure clinical attachments, navigate the complexities of UK training pathways, and provides supervision across all levels, from foundation trainees to senior registrars. Looking ahead, her long-term vision is to improve healthcare delivery for women and children in rural and hard-to-reach communities.

Balancing a demanding medical career with family life, Dr. Zakia is also a devoted mother of two. Her daughter, currently in Year 11 at Nottingham High School, is a 2nd Dan Black Belt in Karate, while her young son is two and a half years old. Her husband, a Consultant Rheumatologist, works at Nottingham University Hospital. She credits her achievements to determination and the unwavering support of her family, firmly believing that women—particularly those from developing countries like Bangladeshcan accomplish their goals with the right mindset and encouragement.

Outside of medicine, Dr. Zakia enjoys listening to podcasts by Islamic scholars, gardening, healthy cooking, working out, and spending quality time with her family.

Afia Adamjee is an electronics engineer, philanthropist, prominent foreign investor, wife and mother of four children. For over 40 years, Afia has been a trailblazer in almost every new challenge she has undertaken. From being the only female student in her HSC programme at MC College Sylhet, to being the only woman in her Bachelor of Engineering cohort at the University of Westminster.

Afia's academic excellence was recognised by ITN (Independent Television News), who sponsored her degree and offered her a top of the market graduate job. Since graduating in 1994, Afia was the only female engineer at Gravity Media, an industry leading firm, and she now continues to advocate for and train the next generation of female engineers in a male dominated industry. Afia's career as a highly specialised Senior Broadcast Engineer has taken her around the world. Her expertise has been demanded at major events since 1995, from the Commonwealth Games in Malaysia, Goodwill Games in Australia to the Tennis Masters in Monte-Carlo; and more recently at the 2022 World Cup in Qatar, Wimbledon and Paris Olympics.

In December 2023, Afia became the first woman of British Bangladeshi origine to be awarded Commercially Important Person (CIP) status by the Government of Bangladesh, for her contributions as a direct investor to the industrial sector in Bangladesh. Since 2017, Afia has been the Director of British Bangla Chemical Ltd. (BBCL) and invested significantly in the development of the companies' chemical plant in Sreemongal. The plant has been operational for several years now, producing Precipitated calcium carbonate (PCC), and British Bangla Chemical has become a pioneer in the global lime industry, putting Bangladesh on the map of major buyers.

Afia's contributions to the Bangladeshi community, both in Bangladesh and the UK, also manifests in her charitable endeavours. As a trustee to the Just Help Foundation, and major donor to the development of the Just Help Eye Hospital, Afia has contributed to fundraising efforts in the UK and organisation on site at the hospital in Sylhet. Afia is also the cofounder of the Adamjee Foundation, which works hard to provide accessible education for under privileged children, as well as mentorship for first-generation university students in Bangladesh. Afia has a particular passion for supporting women and mothers, and this carries over to her work in the Adamjee Foundation as she endeavours to provide maternity care for rural women.



He is an individual who is the sub-editor of Weekly Bangla Times and Bangla Post. Bangla Post is known to be the first Bengali newspaper in the UK. Furthermore, he is the esteemed founder President of Sherpur Welfare Trust (UK) as well as the unsurpassed president of Haji Abdul Jollil & Mahmuda Khatun Welfare trust (UK). In addition, he is the Secretary of Khalilpur Welfare & education trust (UK).

MD Jayanal Abedien was born to Bangladeshi parents in Moulvibazar, Sylhet, Bangladesh in 1973. He is the Son-heir of the late Haji Abdul Jolil and the late Mahmuda Khatun. He completed secondary at Azad-Bakh High school and completed higher secondary at Sylhet Govt College. Also, he has completed MSS at the National University in Bangladesh.

He also completed his Bachelor of Arts at the Greenwich University in London. At present, Jayanal Abedien is a member of London Bangla press club. Jayanal Abedien is passionate about contributing to betterment of society and fostering connections within the community. His journey from Bangladesh to the UK has shaped his perspective and drive, and he looks forward to continuing his endeavours in both journalism and community service, while leaving a lasting positive impact wherever he goes. Javanal Abedien resides in Bethnal Green, Tower Hamlets with his wife Mrs Mahdia Chowdhury and son Mohammed Zunayed Abedien.





Abdul Ahad is a British Bangladeshi who has been involved in the catering industry for nearly thirty years, and it is fair to say that he has been more than a success.

His first restaurant was opened in Milton Keynes in 1980 and since then his catering empire has grown stronger and stronger. From the moment Ahad entered the catering trade, he saw a vision to create an ultimate shrine to Indian food. In 1998, his plans began to take shape, and finally in early 2002, the dream became a reality.

Jaipur came to an end in 2018 and Ahad received the Paul Harris Fellowship award of appreciation by Rotary International.

As the former owner of the famous Jaipur Restaurant in Milton Keynes, Ahad is the man behind the largest purpose built Indian restaurant in Europe.

The Jaipur Restaurant itself is an architectural landmark building of great beauty, and one that Ahad refers to as his own 'mini Taj Mahal'. The food and the service inside is equally impressive, having won practically every available award to Indian cuisine. Furthermore, although initially Jaipur was solely an Indian Restaurant, it now houses a Thai restaurant, the Orchid Lounge, on the first floor.

For all his success as a restaurateur, he is equally as successful in other fields -one of which is fundraising for charities.

Two of Ahad's favourite causes are 'the Jaipur Limb Project' of the Rotary International and Save the Children charity.

The 'Jaipur Limb Project' set up in Jaipur, India, is engaged in manufacturing prosthetic limbs for children and adults who have lost their limbs due to disease or accidents. The provision of a new limb gives them a life changing experience enabling them to a full life in many different ways. Ahad is a major supporter and contributor to the project during the last twelve years, raising over £30,000 through the Annual Charity Dinner.

Ahad is also a high profile and integral member of Britian's Bangladeshi community and has supported the development of schools, mosques, madrassas and other charity projects in his parental village in Sylhet.



Ohid Ahmed is the Cllr for Lansbury and the Cabinet Minister for Safer Communities. He was the former-Executive Deputy Mayor of the London Borough of Tower Hamlets. Ohid is a part qualified Certified Chartered Accountant (ACCA). He has a Masters Degree in Accountancy and between 2002 and 2005 he completed his MBA from the University of East London.

Cllr Ahmed was the founder and instrumental of setting up Labour Friends of Bangladesh (LFB) and chair until 2010. As Finance & Grants Coordinator for Lea side Regeneration he manages various projects involving employment and finance. He also provides advice and support to project managers in relation to financial management and administrative issues. Cllr Ahmed was the first Bangladeshi Muslim to sit on the London Games Gateway Development Corporation (Ministerial appointment). Cllr Ohid Ahmed is very strongly involved in the social and economic regeneration of East London. He has worked with many communities and voluntary organisations in East London and has helped them obtain grants. Another issue close to Ohid's heart is the removal of barriers in the labour market for those groups who are at a disadvantage in entering the labour market.

He places particular emphasis on combating race, sex and disability discrimination, and he has helped

implementing measures, which will eradicate these barriers. He was also Cabinet member of Regeneration, Localisation and Community Partnership from 2006 to 2009 and Education and youth Services for 2005. Councillor Ohid Ahmed was the Cabinet Member for resources and performance in 2009 and was short listed for prestigious LGIU award for his outstanding contribution to financial performance in Tower Hamlets. Cllr Ohid Ahmed also serves in several community organisations.

He is the Trustee of the Golapgoni Education Trust, as well as a Trustee for the Mahmud Hussain Education & Welfare Trust. He currently holds the position of Board Member at both the Limehouse Youth Club and the Poplar (Aberfeldy) Islamic Cultural Centre. He was formerly the Cabinet Member of Education and Youth Services for the London Borough of Tower Hamlets, and the youth and cultural secretary at the Bangladesh Centre.

Cllr Ohid Ahmed's favourite pastimes include following national and international politics, cricket, chess, gardening as well as computing. He is a wellrounded Councillor striving for the success of East London and the people within.

Mr Ahmed was founder Chairman & Managing Director of Kohinoor of India Holding Group in Netherlands since 1981 was owning the largest chain of Indian- Bangladeshi Restaurants and was owning the famous awards winning Indian restaurant the Kasturi restaurant and Catering at Aldgate, London since 2001.

Mr Ahmed has a hotel management background and wide range of investments in Europe, U.K. and in Bangladesh, including aviation, property, food processing and financial institution. He is the Founder Chairman of Rock Asset management Limited of Bangladesh and Current Chairman of Pan Europe Ventures Limited and Prospect Gaze Limited a successful consultancy and procurement company and was franchise of multi- store ownership of famous

multi-national brand of Ouiznos sub in UK and has investment in many other institutions, properties and has an eye for innovative ideas and breakthrough projects.



Emon Ahmed is an international lawyer who specialises in corporate, banking and finance law. Emon is currently the Chief Executive Officer of the board to the Ackroyd Legal Group.

In his early years, Emon was a commercial Director at Stirling Ackroyd. Emon started at Stirling Ackroyd at a young age and developed his career within the investment and development sector.

Having advised corporate clients for over 10 years Emon was promoted to the position of Managing Director and expanded the company's operations on an international scale.

In 2015, Emon and his late business partner Mr James Goff, founded Ackroyd Legal, a city law firm specialising in real estate, litigation, corporate and finance law. Today the group, having acquired 15 large solicitor's practices throughout the UK, some of which have been established over 300 years, has over 220 lawyers and is regarded as one of the fastest growing law firms nationally. Ackroyd's

international offices include operations in the United Arab Emirates, Qatar, Kuwait, and Singapore.

The group has a stellar reputation within the industry, for advising major asset funds and international finance houses.

Emon is also chairman of EA Capital. The company is a Swiss private equity fund based in Geneva with

an appetite for undertaking asset management and investing in start-up companies that are

early in the development stage - often with pre profit - with high growth potential. The company typically invests into a project with majority stake, undertakes an active role helping to define all

elements of the target's strategy, to mature and eventually identify possible routes of exit. Today EA capital has diversified its interests to reduce risk, by investing in a portfolio made up of retail, commercial finance, real estate, and tech companies.

Emon has come from a long lineage of mature business, his family have been in real estate and hospitality since 1951. Emon's grandfather, the late Mr Israf Ali, established his first real estate business in September 1951, which still stands today, as the backbone of the group's success. In 1978 Emon's father, Mr Shab Uddin established the famous Tower Tandoori restaurant of Tower bridge, which is now in its 45th year of trade, having recently gone through extensive refurbishment. It continues to grow and flourish.

Iqbal Ahmed was born in Sylhet, Bangladesh in 1956 and came to the UK in 1971. He completed his secondary education at the City College in Westminster, London and joined the family business in Oldham in 1976. Subsequently, his brothers, Kamal and Bilal joined him and the expansion of the business began.

Iqbal is married with three children, two of whom have left university to make their way in the world, one with Seamark, the other a doctor, and the third has completed her degree course at Manchester University.

He pioneered the import of frozen fish and seafood products in refrigerated containers and was the first to import the black tiger shrimp into the UK and EU. Iqbal Brothers & Company soon became the leading supplier of warm water frozen fish and shrimps in the EU with a national distribution network it retains to this day. Seamark plc followed in 1991, specializing in the processing and stocking of warm water shrimps, especially the black tiger and the fresh water king prawn. After processing and packing, these were exported to most countries in Europe, as a result of which, Seamark received the coveted Queen's Award for Export Achievement in 1998. This was followed in 1999, by the first prize in the prestigious Business in Europe Awards.

As a British investor in the third world, with the support and encouragement of DTI, a new, ultra modern factory, costing USD10 million, was constructed in Chittagong, Bangladesh. HRH The Princess Royal was invited to perform the official opening in November 2000, which she did in the presence of many distinguished guests. The Chittagong factory is operating at full capacity and has been expanded, within the existing site areas, producing value added and ready to eat products such as seafood and vegetable somosa's, paratha and vegetables. In addition, two further seafood processing companies have been taken over in Bangladesh and the group now boasts its own fleet of deep sea shrimp trawlers equipped with on board freezing facilities, as well as its own hatchery where high quality shrimp can be farmed for export to the world.

In 2001, he opened their USA sales office in New Jersey and have since acquired a warehouse and a cold store in Brooklyn, New York to distribute products in North America including Canada.

In 2005, Seamark constructed a factory in Manchester on a 6.25acre on a nearby site in East Manchester. A further development to this site involves a large Thai restaurant called Vermilion, which opened in at the end of November 2007. Vermilion features an exceptional décor and the site includes a 200 cover restaurant on its first floor and a bar with a capacity of 300 and a large private function room for over 100 people on its second floor. All three units have bars and kitchens and are capable of handling large and small events, weddings and business conferences. This complex has provided a new and much larger suite of offices and a cold store (one of the biggest of its kind in Europe with a capacity to store 12,500 tonnes of frozen food) for Seamark's associated business Ibco Limited (formerly Iqbal Brothers) who, in addition to their well established frozen and ambient food trading has opened a new venture from this site, a wholesale cash & carry unit named Restaurant Wholesale, with the aim of providing everything the modern restaurant will require.

Over the years, Iqbal has been appointed to a number of Government committees and Advisory bodies, among which are the Southern Asia Advisory Group under DTI, the Competitiveness Council, BOND (the British Council) and the Manchester Forum. He is the Director of New East Manchester Limited, the partnership company between Manchester City Council, English Partnerships and North West Development Agency charged with the task of the regeneration East Manchester. In 2006 he was invited to become a member of the Ethical Trading Champions' Group, set up under the government's Food industry Sustainability Strategy (FISS). Iqbal represents the interests and concerns of the Frozen Food Manufacturers. The British Frozen Food Fedration nominated him for the position on the Champions' Group and they submitted their report and recommendations to the government at the end of March 2007.

He established and is the Chairman of the UKBCCI.

In November 2007, he was personally invited by George Osborn; Shadow Chancellor to join his newly formed New Enterprise Council



Imam Uddin Ahmad was born in Balagonj, Bangladesh, in 1967 and moved to the UK in 1975 at the age of eight. From a young age, he displayed great ambition, and in 1990, at just 22 years old, he launched his first restaurant in Wolverhampton alongside his two brothers, Md Jamal Uddin and Md Shahab Uddin. This initial success marked the beginning of a prosperous career, with Imam opening five additional catering outlets over the next six years, from 1990 to 1996.

In 1999, Imam expanded his business interests by adding a frozen fish and prawn supply company to his growing portfolio. A year earlier, in 1998, he had also ventured into the property market, investing in both residential and commercial buy-to-let properties. While juggling his commitments to both the catering and property industries, he eventually shifted his focus entirely to property development, recognizing its lucrative potential. In 2008, after obtaining qualifications from Manchester University, he established his own Letting and Management company.



properties for both UK and international investors. This company offers a comprehensive package, providing below-market property deals along with mortgage services, conveyancing, refurbishment, lettingand management.

In addition to his business achievements, Imam is deeply committed to community work, both in the UK and in Bangladesh. He serves as the President of a charity supporting impoverished communities in Purbo Poilanpur Union, Balagonj, Bangladesh. Furthermore, as the President of a local mosque in Walsall, he plays a pivotal role in overseeing a £1.4 million project to rebuild a purpose-built mosque.

Imam Uddin Ahmad is also the President of the Midland Region of the UKBBCI (UK Bangladesh Business Chamber of Commerce), reflecting his dedication to fostering business connections and supporting Bangladeshi enterprises in the UK.

He is married with 4 children Amin Uddin Ahmed 34 who is Solicitor and runs his own law firm in Birmingham. His second is a daughter who is an optician, 3rd is son who is a self-employed Dentist and 4th is daughter who is studying medicine at Birmingham University.





Malik Ahmed is a restauranteur and philanthropist based in Cookham, Berkshire. Originally from Patanpara, Sylhet Town, Malik arrived to the UK in 1975 at the young age of 12. The third child of late Abdul Mumin and the late Nomira Khatun Baksh, Malik is one of four children. His father was a police officer by profession and his mother a homemaker. The family settled in Yorkshire and soon made the UK their new home.

Malik's first job was in 1977 as a waiter a Harrogate-based Indian restaurant, Star of India. In 1978, Malik's father, Abdul, opened a restaurant in Yorkshire called Shahi Rai, Malik and his elder brother absorbed themselves into the family business and worked tirelessly to support their family. However, circumstances changed drastically when Malik's father suddenly passed away when Malik was only 16 years of age. At the tender age of 16 and 19, Malik and his older brother, Faruque, suddenly became the heads of the family. Broken by the death of their beloved father, the brothers made the tough decision to sell the family business.

A knack for business and hospitality is a common and inherent characteristic in Malik's family. Restaurants can be traced back over 150 years in Malik's family; his great grandfather was the founder of the renowned restaurant Moshrafia, located in Bandar Bazar, Sylhet. Famous for their Dhai and Bakarkhani and assortment of sweets, the family restaurant is still up and running to this day.

Malik decided to move to London and soon managed esteemed restaurant, Khan's. He then worked in Star of India. both incredibly famous haunts in the 80's and renowned restaurants for celebrities in central London..

After 4 years of hard work, Malik and his elder brother Faruque bought their new home in South London.

In 1999, an Italian restauranteur and Malik's good friend suddenly offered to sell him his restaurant in Cookham, Berk-


shire. After accepting an offer he could not refuse, on the 18th of February 1999, Maliks Cookham restaurant was born. The business expanded shortly after; in 2003, Malik opened his second branch in Gerrards Cross and then a third in Marlow, a takeaway in Gerrards Cross and another takeaway in Cookham

The restaurant has won countless Awards and is enjoyed by celebrity chefs such as Heston Blumenthal and Tom Kerridge. The likes of Russell Brand, Peter Jones, David Seaman amongst other profiles are known as friends and not simply customers.

Despite having five branches, Maliks is very much a familyrun restaurant. Malik's brothers, Faruque and Rumel have supported and helped him build an enterprise from the very beginning and even to this day.

Malik is an avid philanthropist, having founded several charitable organisations in his hometown Patanpara. Malik chairs Patanpara Welfare Trusts - a charitable organisation that raises funds for different local causes. From renovating mosques, to raising thousands of pounds for families during COVID to sponsoring the education of the less fortunate, Patanpara Welfare Trusts made an incredible impact on the community

Malik has five beautiful children with his wife Farhana Ahmed Choudhary. His oldest daughter (University of Birmingham and MA Queen Mary University alumna), Anika, is a Strategy Analyst for a global, London-based real estate firm; his second daughter (University of Birmingham and MSc UCL alumna), Maisha, is training to become a solicitor with a London-based Tech company; his third and fourth daughters, Ramisa and Aisha are studying Criminology and Neuroscience, respectively, at university and his son, Aman Malik, is the baby of the family and is in Year 10.



Maswood Ahmed MBA, MSc, MA, CQSW, DipSW, PTA, AASW, RSW is the Chief Executive Officer of IN-SPIREAMILLION (IAM), Mass Film Productions (MFP), and the Bismillah Investment Group (BIG) and Director of INT Social Work. Maswood is an international business development expert, trainer and consultant, helping clients strategise, expand and improve their businesses internationally. He is also a renowned independent International Social work expert in family courts and the High Court throughout England and Wales. He is a cultural and parenting expert with over 35 years' experience in the social work sector, a Public Speaker, Community Activist and an Imam. He is a campaigner on social justice and crime reduction especially on DV, Knife crime and child abuse.

Maswood Ahmed has been a member of the National Working Group on Child Abuse Linked to Faith or Belief (CALFB) at the Department for Education (DfE) and has given evidence to the National Inquiry into Child Sexual

Substantial expertise in the broadcast media and film production industries, having travelled worldwide to produce interviews with heads of state, business leaders, politicians, senior military officers, academics, clerics and activists.

Maswood is the founder and coordinator of www.Stopknifecrime.uk . He has appeared on national broadcast media, including the BBC, ITV, and Sky News and is a regular public speaker at events, conferences, and universities. Mr. Mesba Ahmed MBE is a highly respected British Bangladeshi community leader, entrepreneur, and social activist, best known as the Founder and Chief Executive of London Tigers-a pioneering community sports organisation empowering thousands of young people across the UK and internationally.

Born in the Sylhet District of Bangladesh, Mr. Ahmed moved to the UK in the early 1970s, following the legacy of his father, the late Alhaj Hafiz Uddin, and grandfather—both early Bangladeshi settlers who played vital roles in shaping British Bangladeshi community life. After completing his education in the UK, Mr. Ahmed began his career as a Financial and Mortgage Consultant before dedicating himself fully to community development.

In 1986, inspired by his lifelong passion for football and a strong commitment to helping young people in need of support and guidance, he founded London Tigers. Under his visionary leadership, the organisation has grown into a national force, engaging over 5,000 individuals from 60 different nationalities through football, cricket, badminton, youth leadership programmes, and employment training. The organisation fields teams from grassroots to semi-professional level and competes in prestigious competitions in UK and Abroad.

In 2011, Mr. Ahmed extended London Tigers' impact internationally by partnering in the Conservative Social Action Project in Bangladesh alongside Syeda Warsi, Ann Main MP, Syed Kamal MEP, and Nicky Morgan MP. Together, they launched several initiatives including a girls' secondary school, two cricket centres in Sylhet and Mymensingh, and the Under-16 Sylhet Football Academy. The football academy's open trials attracted over 2,000 youth participants from rural villages, with 35 players selected to represent Sylhet in the Dhaka Pioneer Football League for the first time in history. Many of these players went on to join professional clubs, and the academy's coach was appointed full-time by the Bangladesh Football Federation. The Secondary Girls school educates over 200 students a year.

Mr. Ahmed's leadership has brought him into collaboration with prominent national figures including Boris Johnson (former Mayor of London and London Tigers' Honorary Patron), as well as Prime Ministers Tony Blair, Gordon Brown, and David Cameron. He played a key role in the Big Society initiative, working alongside senior leaders from the public and private sectors.

Mr. Ahmed's contributions have been widely recognised over the vears through numerous awards and honours. In 2004, he received the inaugural Westminster Local Leadership Award, followed by the GG2 Leadership Diversity Award in 2005. The club was honoured as the Best Asian Football Club in the UK by the FA in 2012 at a ceremony held at Wembley Stadium, and in 2014, it was named the Best Asian Cricket Club in the UK at an ECB event at Lord's Cricket Ground.

Mr. Ahmed's philanthropic leadership through London Tigers has earned national acclaim. In 2014, he was named among the Top 1000 Most Influential Londoners by the London Evening Standard, a prestigious honour that placed him alongside figures such as George Osborne, Mayor Boris Johnson, Prince Harry, David Beckham, Arsène Wenger, Ed Miliband, George Clooney, Lakshmi Mittal, Bill Gates, and Her Majesty The Queen. This recognition reflects the profound impact of his work in sport, youth empowerment, and community development, both in the UK and internationally.






Upon returning from exile, Mohammed Belal Ahmed completed his pre-university education at Sylhet and graduated from the University of Chittagong.

He passed his SSC from Ramshundor High School Biswanath, HSC from Sylhet Govt College and BA from Modan Mohan College Sylhet. He holds a certificate in Export-Import System Processing and Cargo from British International Freight Association

Mr Ahmed has been associated in the cargo business for a long time. He started his business Cargo Management in 1987 and worked for sixteen years. Mr Ahmed came to Britain in 2000 and initiated a cargo business in the UK named JMG Air Cargo at 8 Fordham Street, London. This organization currently contributes the majority of Biman's cargo in Bangladesh. In the past few years, Biman has earned a huge amount of money from IMG and Govt of Bangladesh. With more than 60 agents all over the UK, the company gives top sales awards and training to the agents and employees every year.

Mr Monir Ahmed's pioneering business model emerged from an understanding that cargo services must remove the problem of inaccessibility to the consumers. Mr Ahmed introduced the air cargo business to the Bangladeshi community. He has not only made cargo services cheaper, but also quicker

Muquim Ahmed came to England at the age of 19 to study Production Engineering. He started his business career from the age of 21 by helping his father to import goods from Britain to Holland to Bangladesh. He moved into Electrical Wholesaling as well as expanding his property portfolio and becoming the owner of Naz Cinema in Brick Lane and various properties in and around London.

At the age of 26 he became the first Bangladeshi millionaire; since then he has always been on the Asian rich list.

Muquim Ahmed, as acclaimed by Estate Gazette, (issue October 2005 and October 2007) 'King of Bricklane' and 'Curry King' by ELA (1st November 2007) diversified his interests and moved towards the catering industry.

In 1996 he opened Café Naz in Brick Lane- the flagship restaurant and is still the most high profile eatery in the area. As well as the famous Café Naz in Bricklane, he opened branches in Cambridge, Cardiff, Horsham, Chelmsford, London and another café style eatery in Brick Lane. Today amongst many other projects, his award wining Café Naz chain is going from strength to strength.

He also owns a distribution and marketing division called Asian Foods Ltd.

He featured in the Times article in 2006 'Focus Immigrant Britain' which was based on highly successful Brits of ethnic background.

He was the chairman of Bangladesh British Chamber of Commerce for two consecutive terms. He is also a former President of the British Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce.

He has enormous drive and is inspired to improve the quality of life for himself and for his fellow being. He has also dedicated a substantial quantity of his time to the Conservative Party.



Cllr. Parvez Ahmed is a former Mayor of the London Borough of Brent. He was the first person of Bangladeshi origin to be elected as Mayor of Brent. He is also a Councillor in Dollis Hill in the London Borough of Brent, having been elected in 2014.

In 2021, Cllr Ahmed was awarded the Freedom of the City of London in recognition of his services to the community. Cllr Ahmed is also the inaugural President of the British Bangladeshi First Citizens Alliance.

Since the age of twenty one, Cllr Ahmed established a number of businesses throughout Bangladesh, most notably having invested in the textiles and garment industry. He continued his focus in the textiles and garment industry after arriving in the UK where he also opened a restaurant. He has been closely involved with the Bangladeshi Caterers Association where he has served as a Management National Executive Committee Member, Deputy Secretary General and Secretary General since the 1980's. Cllr Ahmed is also the Chairman of New Generation 2000, and was formerly a Director at the North West London Chamber of Commerce. In 2006, Cllr Ahmed also helped organise the inaugural education awards ceremony for the Bangladesh High Commission celebrating the achievement of young British Bangladeshis, which is now a celebrated annual event.

Over a number of years, He has been involved with many local and national organisations holding a range of posts including Board Member, Management Committee Member, Trustee and Chairman. These groups include the Tricycle Theatre and Cinema, Brent Safer Neighbourhood Team, Brent Minority and Ethnic Forum, Greater Sylhet Council UK, North West London Muslim Forum, Kilburn Partnership, Single Regeneration Board, Friends of Bangladesh UK, West Hampstead Bengali Association, Bangladesh Centre, Brent Bengali Community Centre, Bangabandhu Centenary Foundation Brent, Sylhet Sador Education Trust and Igra International. During the 2020 COVID pandemic, Cllr Ahmed as a volunteer and strategic advisor helped set up a COVID Testing and Vaccination Centre at the Central Mosque of Brent which has served thousands of residents since its inception.

Cllr Ahmed has played a leading role in a number of projects both in the UK and abroad. During 2020/21, he led on a project around the creation of the Bangabandhu Centenary Peace Grove in Gladstone Park, Brent, which included the planting of 100 trees of different varieties as a commemoration to the 100th Birth Anniversary of the Father of the Nation of Bangladesh, Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman.

Nazir obtained his LLB (Hons) degree from Queen Mary, University of London. Later on, he completed Master of Laws (LLM) from the same University. He was called to the Bar (Barrister-at-Law) by the Lincoln's Inn in 1999. He was also later admitted as a Solicitor in the Supreme Court of England and Wales and enrolled as an Advocate of the Supreme Court of Bangladesh. He is currently a Member of the Dhaka Bar and the Bangladesh Supreme Court Bar Association. Nazir has skills and experience in international arbitration. He is a Fellow (FCIArb - the highest grade) of the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators (CIArb). He has advance management skills, qualification and experience. 

A British Bangladeshi who has achieved one of the highest cricket coaching qualifications among all Bangladeshis. He qualified as level 3 coach from England & Wales Cricket Board (ECB) in 2001 and became a Coach Education tutor from 2009 under the ECB.

In Bangladesh Md Alam played at the highest level of domestic cricket from 1985 until 2000 and represented Bangladesh in 1990. He acted as National Cricket Coach / Senior Coach of High Performance programme under Bangladesh Cricket Board from 2001 until November 2006. During that period he worked with the National team, Bangladesh A team, Under 19 & Under 17 and managed junior development programmes, coach education courses, developed talent scouts procedure etc.

He also joined the Malaysia Cricket Association as National Coach to take up a special project to run the high performance programme with Under 19 side for the ICC Cricket World Cup 2008.

He is an Asian qualified ECB Coach Education Tutor / assessor and initiated T20 Asia Blaze in 2015 where local communities / leagues came together to play under the country names India, Bangladesh, Afghanistan, Pakistan and Sri Lanka.

The ECB are now looking to take this competition nationally. Middlesex community cricket league is another successful league that was set up in Victoria Park which has seen many young adults get playing opportunities on a regular basis. ers, coaches and clubs receiving due credit. Also some projects featured in various media including Sky Sports and BBC. Md Alam has been shortlisted for and won many awards.



During his first Mayoral year Councillor Ali met the Queen and most members of the Royal family.

His most memorable moment was meeting Nelson Mandela. Councillor Ali's achievement was recognised by the Queen with him being made an Officer of the British Empire and awarded an OBE in the New Year's Honour's list for 2011. Councillor Ali's achievements were also recognised in Bangladesh where he had a reception with the Prime Minister and the President to celebrate his achievements. Councillor Ali was born in Islam Pur, Osmani Nogor, Sylhet, Bangladesh and came to the UK aged 7. He is married to Lina Choudhury and has three boys, Rio, Zachariah and

His early initiatives included the Camden Monitoring Group (1989) to combat racial harassment and the Camden United Poject (1994) to unite young people through their common interest in football diverting them away from racism, crime and conflict. Councillor Ali received one of the first Camden Good Citizen Awards. He has been a ward councillor for the Regents Park ward since May 2002. Councillor Ali is a Board member of the St Andrew's Holborn Charities, St Pancras Thanet St Trust, Governor of Camden and Islington NHS Trust and Vice Chair of Camden Community Centre's Consortium (C4). In the past he has been an advisor to the Metropolitan Police, Prince's Trust, King's Cross SRB Board and a Governor for Westminster Kingsway College. He was also the Chair of the Healthy Families Partnership at King's Cross, Board member of the West Euston Partnership, Chair of the WEP Planning Working Group and on the Executive Board of the Community Empowerment Network. Councillor Ali is also the Chair of the Camden Mela Committee. In 2021 the Camden Mela celebrated the 50th anniversary of the Independence of Bangladesh at the renowned British Library. In the past it has been held in Regents Park and the prestigious British Museum too.

In 2007, Councillor Ali helped to arrange a reception for Professor Yunus to celebrate his award of the Nobel Peace Prize. He has a degree in Informal and Community Education from the University of Kent. Since 2001 he has been the Chief Executive of the King's Cross Brunswick Neighbourhood Association.



Mohammed Monchab Ali JP was born in 1953 and educated in Bangladesh. He is a community activist, businessman, and a philanthropist living in UK since 1982. He came from a farming family and broke the traditional rank.

He is the eldest son among seven brothers and two sisters. His primary education started in his home by his father and he went to Kamar Gao Government Model Primary School then went to Moinpur High School gaining his Secondary School Certificate (SSC) in 1972 . He continued his under graduate study Intermediate of Commerce (I.Com) at the Modon Mohan College, then he went to Sylhet Polytechnic Institute . He completed his Diploma-in Mechanical Engineering in the year 1979.

Mohammed volunteered at Somota Junior High School and served as a founding Headmaster and Secretary in 1980 and played a important role to establish the School. He then left this school to pursue his professional career and join Karim Pipe Mill at the Bangladesh port city of Chittagong as an apprentice engineer. Within less than two years he raises up to shift in-charge there.

He left Karim Pipe Mill to further his study and came to the UK in 1982. but due to financial support and hardship he abandoned his aspiration for higher education and started working in the catering industry. He got married on same year in 1982 and settled in UK.

He established a scholarship programme at the Somota High School in the year 1994 for those students who passed their SSC in first division. The Somota High School is now a well established High School and College and the student population more than 1600+. He first established his business with partnership in the year 1985 but continued his philanthropic work to support his local schools and support disadvantages

students to pursue their higher education. His four youngest brothers also continue their studies with their aspiration for higher education.

He joined Bangladesh Catering Association (BCA) and served as a regional coordinator North West of England. He later became the Senior Vice President of the BCA. His business in partnership called Bengal Dynasty Restaurant won various national business awards.

He serves as a national Chairperson of the Greater Sylhet Development & Welfare Council in the UK, for two terms and regional chairperson and general secretary for the Chester and North Wales region.

In addition to business ventures he is also very active in numerous socio-cultural projects having set up: MAM Education & Welfare Trust to support the needy in Bangladesh, as well as Chairperson Chester & North Wales Bangladeshi Youth Association, Chairperson Flintshire Muslim Cultural Society ,Chairperson Shorisha Para Hobipur Primary School Trust UK ,Chief Charity Coordinator Grater Sylhet Development & Welfare Council in UK ,Chairperson Chester Shah Jalal Jame Mosque & Islamic Centre.

On the business front, he is the proprietor of Shaninco Catering Supplies, MAM properties UK ,Former Member of the Bangladesh Catering Association ,Founding Member of British Bangladesh Chambers of Commerce ,Former Member of the Chester Ellesmere Port and North Wales Chambers of Commerce ,Former Member of Restaurant Association of Great Britain and Former Member of the Federation of Small Business in UK.

He is appointed as the first British Bangladeshi honorary Magistrate at the Chester Ellesmere Port Bench in 2002. He has been recognised by the Channel S television in 2011 for his community work. Rushanara Ali is the Labour Member of Parliament for Bethnal Green and Bow. She was first elected in May 2010 with a majority of 11,574, having defeated George Galloway's Respect Party. Bethnal Green and Bow was one of four Labour gains in 2010. Rushanara was re-elected in 2015 doubling her majority to 24,317 and earning 61% of the share of the vote and again re-elected in 2017, increasing her majority again to 35,393. Rushanara Ali been re-elected again in 2024. She was a Parliamentary Under-Secretary of State (Minister for Building Safety and Homelessness).

Rushanara grew up in her constituency attending Mulberry school and Tower Hamlets College. She was the first in her family to go to University and studied Philosophy, Politics and Economics at Oxford University. Until her resignation from Labour's front bench in September 2014 over her decision to abstain on the vote on airstrikes in Iraq, Rushanara served as Shadow Minister for Education and Young People, and between October 2010 and October 2013, as Shadow Minister for International Development. Rushanara has previously served as a member of the Treasury Select Committee and the Energy and Climate Change Select Committee and the Communities and Local Government Select Committee. Rushanara has recently been elected once again to the Treasury Committee. She was appointed the UK's Trade Envoy to Bangladesh in 2016.

Prior to her election in May 2010, she was Associate Director of the Young Foundation, where she cofounded UpRising, a national leadership development and employability charity which has helped thousands of young people develop their campaigning and leadership skills. Rushanara has also recently created One Million Mentors, a national online platform to recruit, train and deploy mentors to organisations working with young people.

She also co-founded the Social Innovation Exchange which works to connect innovators and social entrepreneurs around the world to collaborate to tackle major social problems. Rushanara also worked at the Communities Directorate of the Home Office, leading a programme of work to support local areas following the 2001 riots in Bradford, Burnley and Oldham; at the Foreign and Commonwealth Office where she helped establish what became the Forced Marriage Unit; as a Research Fellow at the Institute for Public Policy Research (1999-2002) working on anti-discrimination issues, and as Parliamentary Assistant for Oona King, former MP for Bethnal Green & Bow (1997-

She has also worked as Research Assistant to Lord Young of Dartington (author of the 1945 Labour Party manifesto), helping him to set up Language Line, a national telephone interpreting company and Futureversity, a youth charity which has helped over a 100,000 young people - raising aspirations, cutting youth crime and getting them into work. She has previously served as a Commissioner on the London Child Poverty Commission; a board member of Tower Hamlets College; a Trustee of the Paul Hamlyn Foundation; a member of the Tate Britain Council and a member of the Home Office Working Group on Preventing Extremism established after the 7/7 London bombings.



Tariq Ali is a British entrepreneur and former civil servant with a 20-year career spanning government, commerce, and global investment negotiation.

In recent years, Tariq has focused on building a complex, multi-vertical business platform built on brand heritage, intellectual property, and industry-shaping vision. The venture has been legally engineered with elite counsel, Bird & Bird LLP, and already holds extensive protections across international markets.

Developed over two years, the business reflects a highlevel strategic build designed to shape its sector through innovation, a tightly structured legal architecture, and execution defined by clarity, selectivity, and signal over noise. Tariq began his career in the Ministry of Justice at age 18 and was later headhunted by Sir Paul Jenkins KC, Director-General at the MoJ. He was promoted to Headquarters within the Legal Directorate, where he worked alongside government lawyers and those from the Treasury Solicitor's Department on national level litigation, constitutional, and data protection matters. In 2009, Siraj was winner of the Channel S Awards 2009 'Contribution to the Community Award for Greater London and the South East of England', for his long standing contribution to the British Bangladeshi Community.

In 2011, Siraj was winner of the British Bangladeshi Who's Who 'Outstanding Contribution' Award, receiving a crest from The Mayor of London Borough of Tower Hamlets for outstanding achievement in community work.


In 2015, Siraj was awarded the Lifetime Achievement Award by Currylife magazine for contribution to the catering and hospitality industry.

Siraj Ali is also the Owner and Chairman of the Al Siraj Plaza, a multipurpose building in Goalabazaar Sylhet which includes the 10000 sq foot Siraj - Ul -Uloom ' for Quran and Hadith Research Centre and Library, the 3rd centre of its kind in Bangladesh.

In Essex, Siraj is the Founder Chairman of both the Thurrock Bangladesh Welfare Association and the Thurrock Islamic Educational Cultural Centre, Former General Secretary and founder member of the Essex Jamme Masjid in Southend on Sea, as well as the Chairman of the Advisory Committee of the Essex Bangladesh Welfare Association (Essex) and former Vice Chairman of Bangladesh Catering Association Essex region.

Mr Shakur Ali is the founder of Shakur Education Trust which provides financial support to improve education in the Dulabazar area where he grew up. He is regularly reported in the local press for his charity work, in Bangladesh and UK.

Mr Shakur Ali is extremely fortunate and grateful for the continuing support from his family. They have three sons and two daughters. Their first, Dilwar Ali, graduated from the university of Cardiff. He is now involved with the family business. Their second son, Shahin Ali is an optician engineer and their third son is studying Performing Arts at college in Oxford.

Sved Maruf Ali is an Assistant Head of Kev Stage 4 (Year 10 and 11) at a prominent secondary school in Oldham, Greater Manchester and a community activist who has inspired many children and young people from deprived backgrounds in Oldham.

Maruf, hails from a highly respected Syed family in Kalaborpur (Syed Mir Bari) in Nabiganj Upazila of Habiganj district. In 1986, Maruf moved to the UK at the age of 10 with his parents and siblings to settle in Oldham. Upon arrival in the UK, he faced many challenges, least of all the language barrier together with racism which was rife in the 1980s. Despite these challenges, Maruf did not allow these difficulties to hinder his educational aspirations. After completing his secondary school and College, Maruf graduated from Huddersfield University reading Business & Finance BA(Hons). Subsequently he completed numerous Post-graduate Diplomas and Management Training Programmes to complement his degree.

Maruf was intrinsically involved in coaching and managing a Junior Football Team consisting of mainly Bangladeshi boys in Oldham. The primary objective of setting up the team was to engage with a growing number of young boys who were disillusioned and risked jeopardising their future by mixing with the wrong crowd. The success of this project led Maruf to set up a voluntary organisation called SPARC (Shahjalal Physical Activeness & Recreational Club) in 2018. SPARC now has many volunteers working with young people and facilitating various sports and activities for young people in deprived parts of Oldham. Accordingly, Maruf is a highly inspiring and motivating figure for many of these Children who have benefited from the work and dedication provided by him.

Over the last 25 years, Maruf Ali has undertaken numerous voluntary roles including working for National Association for the Care and Resettlement of Offenders (NACRO). This organisation aims to reduce crime by supporting people in finding alternatives to crime, for example, by resettling es-offenders and providing education and advice in communities. Linked to these experiences, Maruf is a member of the Independent Advisory Group (IAG) whose role is to act as a 'critical friend' to the Police. The IAG recommends how policing services may be, or are being, perceived by communities and how they can be improved.

Prior to taking his current role at a Secondary School, Maruf worked as a Personal Advisor for a Careers Advisory Service, helping young people aged 13-19 to participate effectively in appropriate learning - whether in school, Further Education College, training providers or other community settings. 





Farida Anwar was an elected Councillor of Oxford City Council since May 2014. She is the first British Bangladeshi Councillor in the whole of Oxfordshire County.

Farida started her career as a UK Civil Servant at the Department of Health and Social Security (now DWP) for 18 years. Then she was appointed as a Team Manager of Home Care Section at Social Service Department in London Borough of Camden in 1987. She was finally promoted to the position of Commissioner of Housing and Adult Care Department in 1991.

After working about 40 years in British Civil Service and local government, Farida took early retirement in 2007 to join politics as member of the UK Labour Party. Apart from civil service and political career, Farida has always been a sincere and effective community activist. She has always been a strong voice for the promotion of Bangladeshi and Asian communities in Oxford and Her involvement with Oxfordshire Bangladeshi Association, Muslim and Christian Forum Oxford, 'MIND in Oxford' demonstrates her selfless efforts to forge bondage between the various social, ethnic and religious communities in Oxford and its surrounding areas. She is well known as one of the founders of Oxford Asian Cultural Centre which is regarded as the hub of inter-ethnic relationship in Oxford. Her activism also includes education and health sectors. She is a governor of St. Michael CE Primary School in Oxford where she chaired Community and Preschool Committee. She is an elected member of London Moorfields Eye Hospital Patients' and Governing Body. As an elected committee member of UNISON (Camden branch), Thames Valley Police Consultative Committee and as a member of the Executive Committee of the former Oxfordshire Council for Community Relations, Farida has been playing a key role in the preserving the interests of the ethnic minority groups in London and Oxfordshire.

Farida was born in the Faridpur district in Bangladesh to her mother Late Salema Khatun and father Late Shah Mohammad Israil Huq retired as a Joint Secretary in Bangladesh Civil Service and is directly related to the family of the Father of the Nation of Bangladesh Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman. She is married to Mr Sayedul Haque. Her only Daughter Fahmida is an Oxford Graduate who works at the University of Oxford in the Postgraduate Research Centre. Cllr.Farida Anwar has three grandchildren.

Farida has five brothers & one sister, the elder brother is the Vice Chancellor of Barisal University, another brother is a professor of New York City University, USA, rest three brothers are in Bangladesh Civil Services. One of the most prominent and inspirational British Bangladeshi women, Dr Zaki Rezwana Anwar FRSA is a personality known for multi-faceted attributes such as medical and philanthropic contribution, coupled with her media career. Leading her team in National Debates on Bangladesh Television, she was crowned 'Best Orator' for five consecutive years. The youngest newsreader to pass multi-stage auditions, she completed a course on news casting at the National Institute of Mass Communications, making her the only British Bangladeshi with this level of training and expertise. Her journey began with Dhaka Radio; henceforth would emerge the epitome to watch on Bangladesh Television, BBC World Service, Bangla TV and Channel S. Internationally the longest serving female Bangladeshi newscaster, her unparalleled mark in the newscasting world was recognised with Eastwood Awards' title: 'Best Female Newscaster' With classical vocal training from Ustad Akhtar Sadmani, she also won the 'Notun Kuri' national singing contest and currently judges TV ONE's youth poetry competition.. Channels including All India Radio, Voice of America and BBC 2 interviewed her. She mentors for the Catering Circle Show, for The Diana Award and for Common Purpose in association with the British Council.

After her MBBS degree from Dhaka, her Diploma in Tropical Medicine and Hygiene was with British Council Scholarship. Following her Maternal & Child Health MSc at UCL with Danish Government Fellowship, she was selected Commonwealth Scholar for her PhD. Dr Anwar's Tangail project with iodine deficient pregnant mothers and infants (funded by Glaxo-SmithKline) inspired a documentary on BBC 2 in collaboration with ICH (UK) and ICDDRB. Princess Margaret selected this among leading 3 medical research projects that year. Dr Anwar improved maternal mortality rates as founding member of 'Action for Safe Motherhood' working with the Brazilian Government, and campaigned against FGM with Gambian NGOs. She was invited Guest Speaker for INGOs including UNESCO, WHO and Asian Nutrition Congress. She presented

with the British Paediatric Association, at Centre for International Child Health, University of Warwick, University of Bristol and King's College London. Royal Society of Tropical Medicine & Hygiene, British Medical Journal, Lancet and European Journal of Clinical Nutrition published her work. Having donated all her organs herself, she has inspired many others of diverse backgrounds to do the same.

Her enterprises stem further than medicine and media alone. As GSC's Women & Cultural Affairs Secretary she tours the UK, teaching hard-to-reach women first aid. With her 'Widow Project' initiative, 500 destitute widows saw avenues to financial independence. She established a Rotaract Club's Medicine Bank and as Shandhani's President, initiated blood donation campaigns. She is in London Bangla Press Club; she advises Cancer Research UK; she supports Centre for Rehabilitation of the Paralysed and anti-rape movements. iQra International recognised her work for disabled children. From embryonic stages, she trailblazed for Dual Citizenship Act amendments, negotiating with the Law Minister to protect rights of British Bangladeshis. She was honoured with the Mayor's Civic Award and the British Bangladeshi Who's Who Award, as well as Canary Wharf Group's Award for Philanthropy - for tireless services to British Bangladeshis.

Cultivating her unique blend of medical and international media expertise, through many televised interactive video presentations and deeply analytical newspaper columns. Backed by religious scholars, she fought fiercely to dispel Covid-19 myths at the nexus of medical science and religion. She instigated a grassroots movement convincing thousands of initially reluctant viewers to get vaccinated, saving a staggering number of lives during the pandemic. For such contributions, she was bestowed with the Bengal's Pride Award at the House of Commons, the London Bangla Press Club Award, and The London Faith & Belief Award - supported by Her Majesty's Lord-Lieutenant of Greater London's Council on Faith.



Propa Rezwana Anwar is a British Bangladeshi television presenter, published book co-author and recent King's College London graduate, now working in Westminster.

Daughter of Dr Zaki Rezwana Anwar FRSA, Propa's media career began from a young age, in her case with participation in children's programmes on Bangla TV. Thereafter, she performed on 'It's Our Day' - a popular bilingual children's programme on Channel S (Sky 777). Appearances ranged from singing and reciting poetry, to reading children's news ('Chhotto Khobor') and even creating her own brand of bilingual satirical stand-up comedy. Aged 10, she passed multi-stage auditions to sing solo at Royal Albert Hall. Passion for engaging audiences was nurtured when with utmost love and enthusiasm she began presenting 'It's Our Day' herself as a teenager - the very show she enjoyed performing on as a child.

Propa now additionally hosts 'Sunday Show' on Channel S, this TV show for adults featuring trajectories of inspiring British Bangladeshis. Propa was honoured as BBPI Jamdani Network's youngest member, to meet His Majesty King Charles III and present Queen Consort Camilla with a Jamdani sari on behalf of British Bangladeshis. Despite being London born and raised, Propa sat A Level Bangla exams early, and does all she can to promote Bangla culture. She hosts numerous high profile national interfaith events too, both as Vice Chair of Barnet Multi Faith Forum with Barnet Coun-


cil's support and as Head of Events for London's Interfaith Youth Council.

An alumna of the country's top performing girls' state school (Henrietta Barnett School) in her gap year Propa initiated the social media strategy for the country's top performing boys' state school (Queen Elizabeth's School, Barnet). Next during her degree at King's College London, she was one of the youngest Faculty Education Committee members in the Faculty of Social Science & Public Policy; Propa got the Economic and Social Research Council funded opportunity to co-write a book (ISBN 978-1-8382998-1-1) with researchers about making

education experiences meaningful. Here she credits her mother, late father Dr Udoy Syeed Anwar and school teacher Charlotte Humphreys for instilling within her a love for academia.

Notably, Propa successfully tutored tens of young students 1:1, who passed their 11+ exams and now attend a range of well-performing schools. Propa is Governor at Summerside Primary School and spoke as British youth representative at the Transforming Education Summit 2022, at United Nations' HQ in New York. She is currently partnering with Microsoft to encourage children to learn to code by co-organising school trips and workshops.





Shamim Azad is an active bilingual poet, storyteller and a writer. Her repertoire as a storyteller ranges from Bangladeshi to European folktales. Her performance fuses the lines between education and entertainment and her workshops are rooted in oral traditions and heritage.

Azad's residencies have included Tower Hamlets Summer University, Sunderland City Library & Arts Centre, East Side Arts, Poetry Society, Magic Me, Rich Mix, Kinetika, Bromley By Bow Centre, Half Moon Theatre and Apples & Snakes.

Azad has published 14 books including novels, collections of short stories, essays and poems in both English and Bangla and has been included in various anthologies including British South Asian Poetry, My Birth Was Not In Vain, Velocity, Emlit Project and Mother Tongues. She wrote two plays for Half Moon Theatre.

She has performed at a wide variety of venues including the Museum of London, Cambridge Water Stone, Liberty Radio, Battersea Arts Centre, Lauderdale House, the Commonwealth Institute, British Library, British Council of Bangladesh, Takshila in Pakistan and New York. She has worked with well known composer Richard Blackford, Kerry Andrews, choreographer Rosemary Lee, visual artist

Robin Whitemore and playwright Mary Cooper. She is a trustee of well known charity One World Action, a school Governor and Chairperson of Bishwo Shahitto Kendro (World Literature Centre) London. Azad received the Bichitra Award in 1994 from Bangladesh, Artist of the Year Award in 2000 from London Arts, Sonjojon A Rouf Award in 2004 and Civic Awad in 2004 in the UK.



Smrity Azad is a dedicated cultural activist, theatre artist, reciter, presenter and media personality who has been deeply involved in promoting Bangladeshi arts and culture for over 29 years in the UK. Her Father, the Late Dhali Abdur Rashid, was a Freedom Fighter in the 1971 war, which shaped her upbringing and patriotism for her country. Smrity immersed herself in cultural performances, theatre, music, and recitations, as well as being active in various political movements, including Charon Sangskritik Kendro in Dhaka. This nurtured her lifelong connection to her country.

After frequently travelling to London, Smrity moved permanently in 1995, immediately recognising the necessity of creating spaces that would allow members of the Bangladeshi diaspora to celebrate their heritage. Smrity continued her involvement in the arts, combining her cultural and political roots with the contemporary creative world she encountered in the UK. As a theatre artist, she performs and assists in directing plays that resonate with the experiences of the Bangladeshi community, giving voice to stories that often went unheard. Her skills as a reciter are particularly renowned, and she has become well-known for her ability to bring Bangladeshi poetry and literature to life. Her recitations have been featured in both community events and larger cultural festivals.

Smrity continued her political activism in the UK and became an advocate for human rights, bringing to light injustices that have been overlooked on an international scale. Thus, Smrity holds titles in many organisations, including Vice President of Ghatak Dalal Nirmul Committee UK and Deputy General Secretary of Sommilito Sahitya Sangskritik Parishad UK. Smrity has also been actively campaigning for the Labour Party in the UK and has been elected as GC Delegate and Women's Officer for Blackwall and Cubitt town.

Smrity's efforts in London led to the founding of Docklands Theatre & Performing Arts in 2012, with the support of her husband, Engr Mithu Azad, she serves as the Chairperson. The

theatre was established with a clear mission: to provide a platform for creative individuals with Bangladeshi culture at the heart, particularly among the youth. With Mithu being a Light and Sound Engineer, the couple combined their experience and used stage drama as the primary means of cultural expression. Their two children, Protthoy Sheikh and Priyoty Sheikh have also followed in their parents' footsteps and are actively working in the Bangladeshi community to promote the arts since an early age and have been recognised for their work. Docklands Theatre has become a thriving space where art meets activism, drawing artists and audiences from various cultural backgrounds.

As part of her ongoing mission, Smrity has travelled globally alongside her organisation, participating in cultural festivals and workshops. She has been active in her work with various charities and collaborative projects, including Rescue Aid Trust's Feed 5000 initiative. Alongside Channel S, she helped in distributing aid to affected communities across Bangladesh during the COVID-19 pandemic.

As a media personality, she has used her platform to speak on issues of cultural integration, the importance of arts in social cohesion, and the need for creative spaces in multicultural societies. She participates in television, radio, and online platforms, and was a radio presenter for Betar Bangla and Sunrise Radio.Her media connections have allowed her to bring Bangladeshi arts and politics to a wider audience internation-


Lisa got her big break when headhunted to join tvam as a senior reporter and was then made main newscaster shortly afterwards.

Since 2002, he has been the Chairman of the board of trustees at the East London Mosque (London's first mosque which now includes the impressive London Muslim Centre) leading the institution to win the national 'Super Model Mosque Competition' in 2009. He is also a founding member of The East London Communities Organisation (TELCO), a coalition of churches, mosques, and other civil society organisations working together to promote understanding and a safer, fairer and better governed city.

He was Secretary General of the Muslim Council of Britain from June 2006 until June 2010 having completed two terms. Prior to that, he served as the Council's Deputy-Secretary General for four years. He is also an advisor to the Centre for Public Policy Seminars. Dr Bari has written for various newspapers, journals and community publications, and is the author of 'Marriage and Family Building in Islam, 'A Guide to Parenting', and 'Race, Religion and Muslim Identity in Britain'.

After his education in the late 80's he worked for Toynbee Translation Project in Tower Hamlets. Apsana Begum is the Labour Member of Parliament for Poplar and Limehouse. She was elected in December 2019 with a majority of 28,904, increasing Labour's majority in the constituency. She is now second time Member of Parliament for Poplar and Limehouse.

Apsana is the fourth British Bangladeshi to be elected to the UK Parliament and the first hijab-wearing UK Member of Parliament. She delivered her parliamentary maiden speech during a debate about International Women's Day, paying tribute to the rich history of women's struggles for social justice in East London and pledged to serve the East End constituency in the traditions of socialism solidarity and internationalism. Apsana is a member of the Socialist Campaign Group of Labour MPs Prior to her election, Apsana read Politics at Queen Mary University of London and completed a postgraduate diploma in law and community leadership at the School of Oriental and African Studies.

She was a trustee of Women's Inclusive Team, a Somali womenled charity supporting of residents faced with unemployment, school exclusion and those in need of pre-school support Apsana worked at Tower Hamlets Council, Tower Hamlets Homes, Queen Mary University of of London and the NHS in a number of roles, including as a diversity and inclusion practitioner, contributing to strategies to make the local workforce more reflective of the community. Before her election, she was a prominent anti-austerity campaigner, campaigning for public ownership, retention and democratic control. She campaigned for public nurseries and services for community languages, special educational needs and disabled children in Tower Hamlets. Since her election, Apsana has continued to champion these causes in Parliament vocally advocating for public ownership and progressive taxation.

Apsana has vehemently opposed legislation seeking to curb human rights democratic freedoms and civil liberties including the Nationality and Borders Act, advocating for unjust immigration law to be repealed and for an amnesty, recourse to public funds and work permit rights to be provided to undocumented migrants. She has also been outspoken on the is-

sues of islamophobia, against NHS privatisation and climate injustices impacting Bangladesh and Somalia.


In 2022, Apsana led a historic Parliamentary debate to commemorate UNESCO International Mother Languages Day, paying tribute to the Bengali university students martyred whilst trying to preserve

the Bangla language in 1952. Apsana Spoke in Sylheti, which was the first time it was spoken in the in UK Parliament. Apsana is a member of the Education Committee where she advocates around the issues of child poverty, free higher education and opposing academisation and the Prevent duty. She is the Chair of the All-Party Parliamentary Group of Domestic Abuse and Violence and played a role in the passage of the Domestic Abuse Act through Parliament. Apsana has spoken out about her own experiences of domestic abuse and violence.

In July 2021 was cleared of criminal allegations made against her, which she described as being vexatious and having malicious intent. In Poplar and in Limehouse, Apsana has stood shoulder to shoulder with local workers going on strike for better pay and working conditions including those employed by Tower Hamlets Council, Barts NHS Trust and Uber. During the Covid-19 pandemic, she raised the pandemic's disproportionate impact upon the Bangladeshi community - including those working on the frontline in the catering, private car hire and care sectors - with the Prime Minister and called on the government to prioritise vaccine rollout to ethnic minority communities.

Apsana Begum was born and raised in in Poplar and Limehouse. She is the fifth daughter of the late Manir Uddin Ahmed, former civic mayor of Tower Hamlets and former councillor for Shadwell ward in her constituency. She has credited her late father's guidance for her political activism, describing him in Parliament as having been a "forward-thinking community organiser".

Apsana was awarded MP of the Year for Young People 2022 by the Patchwork Foundation at a ceremony held at the House of Commons.



Abu Rufian Bablu was born in Molikshari, Moulvibazar, Bangladesh in 1973.

He is the eldest son of Alhaj Badruz Zaman and Shamsun Nahar Begum. Abu and his family moved to the UK in 1976 to join his father.

After graduation from University Abu began managing the family business which lead to him establishing a successful Property Company in addition to running several prosperous Indian restaurants. He reacted to the demands of his clients through the Property Company and implemented Portfolio managements and finance raising through his ARii Property Group.

He became aware of the difficulties with merchant services while working in restaurants, so he looked into becoming a merchant service provider. This led him to establish Rosenburg financial services, which is a global partner of aquirring.com.

Abu is an all round business man and has also taken shares in a health care provider and an accounting practice.

Abu is married to Momena Akthar and they have two daughters and a Son.

Nasima Begum was born in London and is one of seven siblings. Her father was a businessman primarily working in Suffolk so the family moved there in 2002. Nasima was one of the brightest of her peers, consistently achieving top grades and she went on to study Biomedicine at the University of East Anglia in Norwich, Norfolk.

After she met and married her husband Meheraj Alam, who is a businessman in Lowestoft, Suffolk, Nasima moved there. They have been blessed with two daughters, Amelia and Hannah. Nasima and Meheraj have been running the successful Indian Restaurant business Lowestoft Tandoori for nearly 12 years which has won several awards and recognition over the years, consistently being ranked highly across all review sites.

Nasima's interest in politics comes from her father who was a politician in Bangladesh for 15 years before he passed away. Her father contributed immensely to the area he was overseeing by improving infrastructure for the area, building schools, hospitals and bridges and ensuring that every resident had access to sanitary facilities and electricity. Nasima first joined a political party in 2015 so that she could follow in her father's footsteps and bring about positive change to her community.

Lowestoft Town council was formed in 2017 and this is when Nasima was first elected as a councillor. She would go on to be a councillor for one term and then

take a break while raising her two children. She then returned to the council in April 2021 and was elected as Deputy Mayor the following month. Nasima was Deputy Mayor for 3 years and was elected as Mayor at the May 2024 Annual General Meeting of Lowestoft Town Council.

The best part of being a councillor for Nasima is interacting with residents and being able to support them with their needs. The sense of fulfilment in having a positive impact on people's lives cannot be beaten.

Nasima is a proud recipient of MotheRed funding which is a project that encourages and supports mums with the selection process of becoming a parliamentary candidate. Successful applicants were chosen by a group of ambassadors including Cherie Blair and Shami Chakrabarti. Nasima has also graduated for the Jo Cox Women In Leadership programme.



Rita Begum was elected as a Councillor for Maida Vale ward Westminster City Council in May 2014, taking a Conservative seat which they held for 20 years and she was the only labour candidate who got elected. Serving as a shadow cabinet member for environment, Sports and Community from 2014 to May 2022, Since May 2022 she elected as a Councillor for Kilburn ward in Brent Council.

In May 2018, Rita made history by taking all three seats in her ward for doing tireless work, Her achievement locally included securing the 20mph speed limit pilot, gaining funding for a local cycle hire station and upgrading the toilets and baby changing facilities in Paddington Recreational ground. Cllr Rita is a local mum who has lived in Westminster for the whole of her adult life, having been a pupil at Wilberforce Primary school & St Augustine's Secondary school. Cllr Rita has worked in community engagement for 20 years at both the Stowe youth Club and the A2 Dominion Housing Group. She has a special interest in child and youth development and, amongst her range of public duties, she is a member of the Council's Policy & Scrutiny Committee for Children & Sport.

She is also a Board Director for the Paddington Youth Enterprises Ltd – a social enterprise company promoting employment & business enterprise opportunities for youth. Cllr has also helped set up Queens Park Football Academy established in 2016 which trains young children age 5 to 16 years old coming from disadvantage background free of charge football

and other school youth activities and is also involved with Age UK Westminster (the older people charity) & Queens Park Bangladesh Association. Queens Park Community council first ever parish council in London established in 2014. First time in Westminster City council celebrated 46th Independence Day of Bangladesh with his Excellence high commission of Bangladesh and many well-known community activists on April 2017 as a result of Cllr Begum taking initiative to organise this event. Also helps with promoting ward budget and setting up local events which people can participate in, healthy lifestyle, health & well-being workshop, mental health training and trip to country side.

Rita has an excellent reputation in fundraising, social organisation, charities and event organisation. In August 2018 travelled to Bangladesh to help with Shahjalal Welfare trust with their Qurbani project and donated water well in a remote village of Singkapon in Moulvi Bazar. Cllr Rita already works tirelessly for her Bangladeshi community as well as people coming from diverse background to advocate their voice where ever required. Also serves in several community organisations. Cllrs favourite pastimes include following local and national politics, table tennis, gardening as well as eating out. Very passionate about national & international aid work. She is a well-rounded Councillor striving for the success of West-minster residents and the people within.





Born and raised in East London, the second of five children, the young Muay-Thai kickboxer won her first World Title against Swedish champion Susanna Salijarvi and is the current World Kickboxing Association (WKA) 48kg champion, British Atomweight Champion European Gold medallist and World bronze medallist.

Anyone who believes that women can't or shouldn't fight needs to meet Ruqsana Begum. Ruqsana has also won a number of British titles and European championship gold medals.

Ruqsana fights Muay Thai kickboxing, often referred to as the 'Art of Eight Limbs', the national sport of Thailand, where it is far more popular than football. Unlike regular boxing, competitors can use any combination of punches, kicks, knees and elbows to strike an opponent during a bout.


Rugsana's sporting career is only scratching the surface. She is an inspirational figure way beyond her own community. She is a motivational speaker, teaches kickboxing classes for women, juggles numerous media commitments, and leads a busy family life with many responsibilities as the eldest girl in a large family.

Ruqsana's road to glory in one of the hardest sports was not easy. Raised in a conservative Bengali Muslim environment, the thought that a young woman would choose to compete in the kickboxing ring would not sit well with some in her community.

But Ruqsana has fought hard to explode negative perceptions of women in sport, and indeed young British Muslims and remains a shining example to young British people.

An Olympic Torchbearer in 2012 in her home city, Rugsana has been nominated for several awards for her outstanding contribution towards sport and the community, including working with the Dame Kelly Holmes Get on Track Programme; such as the Sky Sports Sportswoman of the Year, Muslim News Sportswoman of the Year and the UK Muslim Women's Sportsperson of the Year.

The architecture graduate has also launched a stunning range of sports hijabs; Sports Hijabs by Ruqsana Begum, specifically designed for young Muslim women who might feel too intimidated or ill-equipped to engage in sport.



Yesmin Begum is a distinguished individual recognized as a Community Connector for her unwavering passion for empowering diverse communities. With a profound understanding of varied cultural backgrounds and a steadfast commitment to inclusivity, Yesmin excels in promoting a sense of belonging for all.

Yesmin's educational journey reflects her commitment to continuous learning and excellence. She holds a BA in Global Business Management from the University of Suffolk. Her dedication to professional development is further demonstrated by her numerous certifications, including the Good Clinical Practice (GCP) Certificate from the National Institute of Healthcare and Research, and a Level 4 Certificate in Community Leadership and Organizing from Newman University, Birmingham.

Her remarkable achievements have not gone unnoticed. Taj Stores is now on its way to celebrate the 80 years of its pride. Outside Bangladesh, if there is any business that has been operating with such goodwill and benevolence that is the Taj Stores.

They are also Directors of Taj Properties Construction/Investment Ltd, NRB Bank Ltd and the UKBCCI. Besides running Taj Stores, the brothers also have

other business interests. The three 'Taj' brothers hold a very healthy portfolio of properties located across the capital as well as several properties abroad, including Dubai.

The brothers are donors to several charities and these include supporting a Cancer Research Charity in honour of their late mother, and also a charity which specialise in treating problems and illnesses related to kidneys, in honour of their late father.

They also established a charity organisation called J Brothers, whereby the project supports vulnerable and helpless families in Bangladesh by providing sheltered homes, installation of water pumps and donating land. Jamal quotes "Charity should begin from home. We are inspired from the love and feeling that my father and uncle showed to the people of Bangladesh. So we do not go for formalities, rather, we have started our charity work from our own village."

Today Bangladeshis are on the way to portray themselves as a successful community in the UK and Taj Stores is one of those names of successes.

The brothers have their own hobbies such as travelling, jet skiing, photography and golf.

Abdul Quayum Khalique (Jamal) currently serving as a senior Vice Pesident of UKBCCI.



Saidur came to UK with his Family at the age of 19. As a student Saidur studied at Moulvibazar College and he also studied Business Management at Westminster College in UK.

Saidur is a highly successful entrepreneur and renowned businessman who is actively involved in the catering industry for over 25 years.

His ancestral home is in the village of Sabia (Hazi Bari) Moulvibazar, Bangladesh. His father Late Alhaz Mohammed Batir Miah was a successful business man. Saidur established his first business Great India in 1958 at Sloane Square, Chelsea, London. 

Sir Akhlaq Choudhury, the first British Bangladeshi High Court Judge is only the second barrister of Bangladeshi heritage to achieve the rank of Queen's Counsel. Akhlaq graduated in Physics from the University of Glasgow before deciding to study Law at the University of London where he obtained a first class honours degree. He was called to the Bar in 1992 and started practising at 11 King's Bench Walk Chambers (now known as "11 KBW"), which is one of the premier chambers in the country being ranked as a leader in many fields including employment, public, information and procurement law.

Past members of Chambers with whom Akhlaq has worked include the former Lord Chancellor, Lord Irvine of Lairg QC and Lord Justice Elias and Lord Justice Sales of the Court of Appeal. Akhlaq's practice developed rapidly and he is consistently ranked by his peers as a leader in his areas of expertise. He is listed in the Legal 500 (2015-2016) where he is said to be "Undoubtedly one of the best advocates at the Bar". Akhlaq was a long-standing member of the Attorney General's A-panel of approved Counsel in which capacity he acted for and advised the Foreign & Commonwealth Office, the MoD, HMRC and various other Government departments in relation to matters ranging from human rights and discrimination in the armed forces to the right to detain persons with mental incapacity. He was retained as counsel for the Information Commissioner and has appeared in many of the ground-breaking cases in the developing area of Freedom of Information and Data Protection law. In 2009, Akhlaq was appointed a Recorder and he sits as a part-time Judge of the Crown Court presiding over criminal cases. He was appointed Queen's Counsel in 2015 and made a High Court Judge in 2017.

Akhlaq was born in Hampshire but grew up in Glasgow where his father, the late Mr Azizur Rahman Choudhury, ran a successful restaurant business and was a leading member of the Bangladeshi community in Scotland. Akhlaq now lives in London with his wife, Safina, and their three children.



Aziz Choudhury is the Chairman of the Spitalfields Small Business Association (SSBA) which is a unique Community Business and social enterprise with over 30 years' experience of regeneration in the Spitalfields area of London. SSBA provides 80 tenant members with affordable workspace. It also develops training and enterprise programmes through the SSBA Community Trust.

Between 2001 and August 2016, Aziz Choudhury was the Director of Montefiore Centre, London which provided important services to the community with workspace and training for around twenty businesses, charities and community organisations.

From 1999-2001, Aziz Choudhury was Managing Director of Otherwords Ltd which ran the East End Enterprise business newspaper and the Spitalfields Business Club. He is well known for his time as Chief Executive of Bengali Workers Association between 1995 and 1999. At that time, he was responsible for running the Surma Community Centre in Camden and several local projects. In the mid-eighties, Aziz Choudhury was Finance Director for Spitalfields Housing Association, a position he maintained for a decade.

In his early career he was an accountant and worked for various Chartered Accountancy firms. He obtained his BSc in Physics, Chemistry & Mathematics from Dhaka University in 1967. He Studied Accountancy at the London School of Accountancy between 1972—74. Moreover, he is an Associate member of Institute of Financial Accountants and has Fellow Membership of Institute of Financial Accountants as well as achieving Common Purpose Community Leadership Graduation in 1992.

Aziz Choudhury has been involved in several community and voluntary initiatives both in the United Kingdom and in Bangladesh. These include being involved with East London Small Business Centre, East London Business Alliance, West Euston Partnership and he has been a PMG member of the Tower Hamlets Partnership. Most recently, he has been a member of the Board of Directors for the Tower Hamlets Education Partnership (THE Partnership) and the Founder and current President of the Sylhet Sadar Association. In Bangladesh Aziz Choudhury founded the Jalalpur Degree College in Sylhet and he is a trustee and General Secretary of Rosae Trust, which raises funds to support a hospital in Dhaka.

Aziz Choudhury is married to Heima Choudhury. They have two sons, the elder son Ashike is a medical doctor (consultant) working for the NHS and the younger son Siraj is a solicitor working in senior management for local government.

Anwar Choudhury (BSc, MBA) was Her Majesty's High Commissioner to Bangladesh from 2004 to 2008. Mr Choudhury has had a unique and distinguished career having served in British Industry, The Royal Air Force, The Ministry of Defence and The Cabinet Office. He is the first senior British Ambassador from a British Asian background and also one of the youngest to achieve this level of posting.

He started his career in Industry as a Design Engineer. This was followed by the Royal Air Force and the Ministry of Defence where he managed a large team of civilian scientists and senior military personnel. As Assistant Director, he was responsible for developing Ministry of Defence's strategies and policies aimed to bring about the integration of Defence systems within the MOD, NATO and Allies.


Mr Choudhury then moved from the MOD to the Cabinet Office where he was Director of Policy in the Office of the e-Envoy. He was responsible for leading the vision and policy for UK Government's ambition to become a leading knowledge economy and the best place for e-government. He left the Cabinet Office to join the Foreign and Commonwealth Office and initially worked on strategy and policy issues before taking up his posting as High Commissioner to Bangladesh in May 2004.

Mr Choudhury completed his assignment as High

Commissioner to Bangladesh in May 2008 and became Director of International Institutions, Foreign and Commonwealth Office.

Mr Choudhury's main interests are in policy for radical change in government and the potential of the information revolution for the developing world economies. On a personal note, he is married with three children. He is currently the British Ambassador to Peru.

His hobbies include Cricket, Bridge, Bengali Folk music and an addiction for Bangladeshi cuisine.



Amirul Choudhury is a high-profile entrepreneur with businesses in various sectors. Since his last profile was updated a few years back he has gone from strength to strength, focussing on his construction and development business. His major philanthropic work of recent times is to be part of RDF Global, a charity dedicated to maternity care in rural Bangladesh. He was asked by the late founder, Mr Shamsujjaman Choudhury, to help build their flagship maternity clinic and he willingly contributed to this important project. He remains humble about his success, but we now have a fully operational maternity clinic in the heart of Jagonnathpur, where he was born.

Amirul Choudhury is a household name in our community. During his business career he has stood by the Bangladeshi community in the UK and continues to do so. He has made significant and generous contributions to support the community, financially and with advice and support.



She has always strived to make mainstream mental health services less stigmatised and more accessible to the Bangladeshi community. This has been achieved by providing community-based interventions, delivering therapeutic sessions and psycho-educational workshops in Sylheti, in familiar community settings, addressing issues such as mental health stigma, depression, stress and anxiety, family conflict and parenting challenges.

She has a special interest in cross cultural and bilingual therapeutic work, and pursued an interest in developing and implementing culturally appropriate parenting programmes for Bangladeshi parents. Ferdousi also has extensive experience of working therapeutically with parents and families who are or have previously been in the social care system, working with traumas such as domestic violence, emotional, physical and sexual abuse. In addition to her work in the NHS, Ferdousi is an Independent Clinical Psychologist, providing Expert Witness Court Reports of culturally appropriate psychological, psychometric and parenting assessments and interventions for families in Care proceedings. In addition to this, she also engages in private clinical work with children, adolescents, families, adults and couples, and provides private consultation and supervision for professionals. Her special interest is in aiming to provide culturally and spiritually appropriate therapeutic services for individuals and families.

Ferdousi was born in Bedfordshire and raised in Glasgow where she lived with her parents, Mrs Sultana Choudhury and the late Mr Azizur Rahman Choudhury, and her two brothers. Her father was a successful restaurateur with a number of businesses in Scotland, and both parents were leading members of the Bangladeshi community in Scotland. Her brothers are Sir Akhlaq Choudhury, High Court Judge, and Zia Choudhury, UN Resident Coordinator and Representative of the UN Secretary General in the Republic of Botswana.

Ferdousi now lives in London with her husband, Kawsar, and their four children.

Foysol Hussain Choudhury MBE MSP is an Independent politician, currently a Member of the Scottish Parliament for the Lothians since May 2021, Shadow Minister for Culture, Europe and International Development. He was the first Bangladeshi elected as a Member of the Scottish Parliament and the first male Bangladeshi-born parliamentarian in the UK. He is from Badardi, Habigonj. He is the eldest son of Late Al Haj Gulam Rabbani Choudhury and Rukeya Rabbani Choudhury. He is married to Tahmina (Moni) and has a son Ikram and a daughter Madiha.

He moved to Edinburgh over 40 years ago and studied before taking over the family business in hospitality. He quickly expanded the business before becoming a successful entrepreneur with interests in catering, hospitality, finance and real estate across Scotland. Even before getting into politics, he worked withpoliticians and various councils to improve community relations in Scotland. Since being elected as a Member of the Scottish Parliament, Foysol has had a very busy 2 years. He has been regularly meeting various organisations, community groups in the Lothian region and from

across Scotland and, engaging with business in the Scottish Parliament. He has been helping his constituents with various issues such as housing, education, and health. In the past year, he has been helping constituents and community groups across the region with the rise in energy costs.

In the Chamber, Foysol has raised parliamentary questions on various topics, including housing, climate justice, Scottish education, racism and refugee crisis. Foysol is also the Convenor of the Cross-Party Group (CPG) on Bangladesh at the Scottish Parliament, with the aim of promoting and enhancing understanding between Scotland and Bangladesh atcultural, social, academic, political and economic levels. Over the summer, during the Festival of Politics 2023, the CPG on Bangladesh hosted a panel event on climate change and justice ahead of COP28 with a lens on low-lying nations such as Bangladesh.

Foysol believes passionately in the Equality for all the citizens of Scotland and is an active member of civic society, playing a leading role in several charities. He has been involved with the Edinburgh and Lothian's Regional Equality Council (ELREC) since he was a teenager and has been an active campaigner for equality, good race and inter faith relations in Scotland. He has served ELREC in

different capacities, as a Trustee, Company Secretary, Vice Chair and he currently holds the post of Chair.

Foysol is also one of the founders of Edinburgh Mela. Since its formation in 1997, the Edinburgh Mela grew to be one of the biggest events in the Edinburgh Festivals Programme. Edinburgh Mela sought to embrace all diverse communities and cultures, providing a showcase for local and international artists.

Foysol is an active member within the Bangladeshidiaspora in Scotland, he was elected as the Chairman of the Bangladesh Samity Edinburgh in 2010 and passionately promotes the interest of the Bangladeshi restaurants across Scotland. He hasorganised, annually, Bangladesh Independence Day Celebrations and other events to promotestrong community relations.

Foysol is passionate about Bangladeshi cuisine and has channelled his expertise in promoting the interest of the restaurant and catering trade as the Chairman of the Guild of Bangladeshi Restaurateurs of Scotland and as one of the founding members of the very successful Dine Bangladeshi Campaign.

Early this year, Foysol hosted a networking dinner event on behalf

of the Asian Catering Federation (ACF) to help build stronger relationship with Scotland's communities, Parliamentarians, businesses and the catering circle. But also, as an opportunity to discuss issues faced by restaurant owners and catering businesses due to the cost-of-living crisis in Scotland and across the UK. Foysol is heavily involved in fundraising campaigns for causes including Bangladesh Cyclone Appeal in Scotland, St Colombia's Hospice, Leukaemia & Samp; Cancer appeal, Sick Kids appeal, British Heart Foundation and many others. In recognition of his services to the community, Foysol was awarded an MBE in Her Majesty's New Year's Honours list 2004.

Beyond his professional achievements, Karim is a com-


passionate leader dedicated to making a positive impact. He actively engages in charity work and has recently built multiple water wells in Bangladesh, providing safe drinking water to those in need.







Over the 20 years, she has managed to influence and chair many policy forums, scrutiny commissions, and has served as lead councillor as well as the Mayor's Adviser.

She was the founder-secretary of Beckton Bangladesh Welfare Association as well as Bangladeshi Students Forum in 1993.


She was involved with many community and voluntary organisations, not only Bangladeshi but Chinese, Lithuanian, and Afro Caribbean organisations too.


She's always keen to improve the life of those who are disadvantaged in society.

He was the first Asian Origin Student President in Bristol. In business, community development and media Mr. Chowdhury has been a driving force for which he is much loved.

Founder of "Potrika" (Britain's popular Bengali newspaper) Mr Chowdhury is also the Chairman of the most watched Bengali channel in Europe, Channel S Television.

A Fellow of the Institute of Sales Marketing Management, Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Management, and Fellow of the Institute of Hospitality Mr Chowdhury is well-known for his decades of experience as a restaurateur. Mr. Chowdhury is also in the property business both in the UK and in Bangladesh. He is also the co-owner and chairman of Kushiara Composite Knit Industries- a 100% export orientated enterprise earning vital foreign currency for Bangladesh.

In 1988 as the Head of the Bangladesh Association (Bristol, Bath & West) and Community Integration in mind, Mr. Chowdhury founded the Bangladesh Women's Group in Bristol and then in 1990 founded the Bangladesh House. This building is used as a drop in centre to get advice and information on housing, welfare etc. In 1993 aimed at women and youths he founded Bangladesh Centre in Bristol. In 1998 Mr. Chowdhury championed the project to establish South West's only purpose built mosque. Mr. Chowdhury serves as the Trustee of Bangladesh House, Bangladesh Centre and Shahjalal Jame Mosque Trust.

Mr. Chowdhury raised funds for the Royal United Hospital and has helped numerous Charities. A Justice of Peace since 1991, he has served as a Governor at City of Bath College, National Steering Committee Member for Hospitality Training Foundation under the Ministry of Education, Advisor to New Deal (Ethnic Minority Group) during Tony Blair's government. Mr Chowdhury is one of the Founders and President of

Bangladesh British Chamber of Commerce; he was Founder Chairman of Britain Bangladesh Friendship Society; Senior Vice President of National Heart foundation, Sylhet; Chief Patron of The All European Bangladesh Association; Chief Advisor of Bangladesh Female Academy; Chief Advisor of Jalalabad Association UK; Senior Advisor UK Probashi Kallan Porishod and is also involved with many national and International organizations, with a number of them he acts as an advisor. He is also a life member of The Commonwealth Judges and Magistrates Association.

In year 2000 Mr Chowdhury was the driving force in establishing the Immigration Advisory Service (IAS) office in Sylhet (the only office outside Britain). He contributed to the foundation of many projects such as Children's Hospital, Cyclone Shelter, Orphanage and a Hospital for the Disabled and Paralysed and many educational institutions in Bangladesh. In 2020, he expanded his work on Shahjalal Jame Mosque (Bristol) and established the 'Khadija Centre' for Women, the first centre for women worshippers outside London.

In October 2021, Mr Chowdhury received the prestigious Freedom of the City of London at a ceremony at Guildhall in London. This rare honour is given to those who have been making extraordinary contributions in various fields.

In 2022, Mr Chowdhury became Chief Advisor to the British-Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce and Industry (BBCCI). He was also included as 200 Most Influential Global Business Icons by Business America.

In January 2021, Mr Chowdhury was given the task to raise funds for the construction of the 6th Floor of Heart Foundation Hospital, Sylhet. Target amount was £150,000. He inaugurated the construction work on 1st January 2022 and to date £181,000 had been raised.



One of the most successful Bangladeshi Businessman living in the UK. Oxford and Sylhet based entrepreneur and philanthropist, Shabbir Ahmed Choudhury was born in 1963 to a renowned Businessman's family in Sylhet City. 


His work has been recognised nationally and he was awarded the Community Activism Award by the Community Leadership Foundation in cooperation with SOAS University in 2017.

Henna made further history in her local town of Worthing by becoming the First Labour Mayor when the Labour Party made history by taking control of the local Council during the May 2022 Local Elections. Making her achievements somewhat unique: the 1st Female Muslim Borough Councillor;1st Female Muslim County Councillor; and 1st Female Muslim Mayor under the 1st Labour Administration for the Borough of Worthing






many dailies and weeklies in Dhaka.

After migrating to the United Kingdom for higher education, he completed his LLB (Hon's) degree from Wolverhampton University in 2002 followed by the Bar Vocational Course in 2003 from University of Northumbria.

He was called to the Bar by the Honourable Society of Lincoln's Inn in 2003. During 2010 he also qualified as a solicitor in England and Wales.

From his student life in Bangladesh, Abul Kalam Chowdhury got involved with student politics and became a frontline activist who worked for the rights and justice for the general student. Moreover, the leadership ability and keen advocacy has encouraged Mr Chowdhury to get involved with several social and political activities in the UK which enables him to provide his support and assistance to the British-Bangladeshi citizens.

He was the first directly elected general secretary of the Society of British-Bangladeshi Solicitors and later became the Vice President at the Society of British Bangladeshi Solicitors. Besides that, he has used his various experiences to contribute to the British-Bangladeshi community as a Co-Ordinator of Centre for British Bangladeshi Policy Dialogue (CBPD). The organisation is tirelessly working to uphold the British-Bangladeshi Rights in Bangladesh as well as in the UK.

In addition, he holds the position of Information and Research Secretary of the UK Awami League which sees him liaise with the Bangladesh Government and the UK Bangladeshi community to ascertain and fulfil their demands and needs. At the same time he is a columnist and social media activist who make his best effort to raise the awareness of Bangladeshi people in standing up for their welfare and legal rights as well as fulfilling their duties as British citizens.

He is happily married to Salma Chowdhury and blessed with three children.





Shahagir Bakth Faruk was born in Sunamganj, Bangladesh. His late father Alhaj Shah Bakth, was a retired Bank Officer, his younger brother Humayun is a Brigadier General in the Bangladesh Army, and his eldest sister, Dr Saleha Khatun was the first women medical doctor in her home town of Sunamganj. Faruk was a lecturer of Physics in Sunamganj College before arriving in London in 1973. He established the Shahnan Employment & Training Bureau, which was the first Bangladeshi employment and training centre in the East End of London.

Faruk is also the first Bangladeshi trainer who provides food hygiene training, health and safety training and HACCP training for all sorts of food handlers in a diverse range of premises. He is also an accredited trainer of the internationally recognised Chartered Institute of Environmental Health (CIEH), Royal Society of Public Health (RSPH), Meat and Livestock Commission (MLC) and Welcome Host. He is an author of the book called "Food Hygiene".

Apart from entrepreneurship, Faruk has made a considerable political contribution to the mainstream of British politics. He is involved with the Conservative party, having been the local Conservative Association Chairman for five consecutive years.

During his leadership he arranged visits in his local constituency from many leading Conservative figures.

Faruk was the only Bangladeshi who was selected as an official Conservative Parliamentary Candidate in 2001 and achieved an excellent second place against Oona King. He was also a Conservative candidate for the same constituency and fought a hard campaign against Oona King and George Galloway in 2005.

Faruk is the former President of the London region of Bangladesh-British Chamber of Commerce. He is the Deputy Chairman of "Conservative Friends of Bangladesh".

He is the founder member of the London Millennium Bridge Club and his name is engraved on this famous bridge, which was opened by Her Majesty the Queen. Faruk is also a trustee of Bangladesh Female Academy, founder of Sunamganj Association, "SUPROBASH" & a "Freeman of the City of London". He lives in east end of London with wife Sherina and four children Shahnan, Eva, Safwan and Zayn.



Abdul Md Fakruzzaman was born in Sylhet, Bangladesh and studied in London Guildhall University in 1996-1999 and London Metropolitan University, Artists in Residence in 2006. Nelson Mandela said: "there is no passion to be found in playing small - in settling for a life that is less than the one you are capable of living." This ultimately sums up thriving personality Mahee Ferdhaus Jalil, who's played a huge pivotal role in the British Bangladeshi community for the last 15 years. He is one of the biggest successes to date is establishing Channel S - the first free-to-air British Bangladeshi satellite Television Channel.

Born in Moulovibazar, Bangladesh, Mahee came to the UK in 1988 as a teenager. Like many of our British Bangladeshi champions, his early days in Britain were endured by hard struggles. Mahee however embraced these challenges with utter determination and focus. He was known for 'dreaming big' and wanted to make his visions a reality.

In 1994, after obtaining training and experience, he set up one of the largest accident management companies in the UK called 'Prestige Auto Group'. The company saw steady growth and became a household name amongst British Asians.

Mahee's greatest success to date however was the establishment of Channel S. He started dreaming of a fully functional Television Channel in the UK in 2002. Mahee wanted a television channel which would engage communities directly, highlight issues

which matter the most in the lives of British Bangladeshis, empower communities with the power of information, and create awareness amongst the community about their rights, opportunities as well as responsibilities. Mahee went onto creating a professional, passionate and experienced team.

Finally on 16th December 2004, Channel S started its official broadcast. Mahee saw a dream which eventually became a platform for all British Bangladeshis, inspired a generation in achieving their goals, took our community back to their roots, and reminded our younger generation of their history and heritage.

Mahee's vision of launching the Channel was no more a community channel - it became international through a partnership with humanitarian organisation - through generous community donations. He believes we can't take money with us , so invests in the community and good causes.

A passionate entrepreneur, Mahee is also successfully running his various other business interests - from property development to Law and IT. He enjoys mentoring young business enthusiasts so that they are able to settle a life capable of living.



Rupa Hug's parents came to the UK from the town of Pabna in pre-independence Bangladesh in the early 1960s. She was born in West London and educated at Cambridge, University of East London and Strasbourg University in France. Her main career has been as an academic: she taught at Kingston University and University of Manchester from 1998 onwards until she was elected Labour MP for Ealing Central and Acton in May 2015.

She is author of three books: (i) Making sense of suburbia through popular culture. (2013) Bloomsbury, (ii) On the edge: the contested cultures of suburbia. (2013) Lawrence & Wishart and (iii) Beyond subculture: pop, youth and identity in a postcolonial world. Academically her main interests have been the sociology of the suburbs and popular culture. Haque is married to Mary Rahman, a successful PR entrepreneur in London, who specialises in promoting clients from the arts, theatre, film, and fashion industries. Together, they form a dynamic and accomplished couple, each excelling in their respective fields



London based Abdus Hamid started his career as an Accountant and subsequently moved into the field of Technology working for a large firm of Wealth Managers in the City Of London.

He currently works as a Cyber Security Analyst helping to secure the companies network and has forged a successful career operating in the financial services industry over the last 20 years.

Being a passionate advocate of technology and having established himself as a highly skilled Analyst in the field of Cyber Security, he now advises small business and institutions on aspects of Cyber Security. 

CFOB continues to lobby the government in UK for the safe return of Rohingyan refugees back to Myanmur. Abdus was also the first British Bangladeshi Chairman of a Conservative Association in the UK and served as the Chairman of Ilford South Conservative Association.

Outside of business and politics Abdus is also involved with various charities nationally and acts as trustees for various charities such as London Tigers.






Ahmadul Hague served as Deputy Mayor of Sandwell Metropolitan Borough Council. He was the first Bangladeshi Councillor elected in the Midland region in 1995 and has been reelected ever since. In 2006 Cllr Haque received an award from Channel S for his services to the community. Cllr Haque arrived in the UK in July 1963 and initially became a member of the Pakistan Welfare Association in Birmingham.

Whilst working in various different companies, Cllr Hague was always keen to get into politics and in 1965 became a member of the old Labour party. With friction simmering in East Pakistan and West Pakistan, Cllr Haque set up the first Bangladesh Action Committee outside of Birmingham in 1971. In the same year Cllr Haque helped raise close to £1500 from contributions made by the residents of North Birmingham for the Bangladesh Action Committee movement as well as setting Midlands Awami League.

Cllr Haque is a very active member of the Bangladeshi community always campaigned for equality and as a result in 1976 received an award from the Bangladeshi High Commission. Through effort and having to overcome numerous obstacles, Cllr Haque also helped set up the Tipton Muslim Trust Association which is now referred to as Al-Islah Trust and a community centre for local Muslims in Tipton.

Cllr Haque tries to serve all members of the community. In the mid eighties, Cllr Haque purchased a terraced house via the trust and later set up the Sandwell Confederation of Bangladeshi Muslim Organisation (SCOBMO).

Cllr Haque is also a founder member of the City Challenge Project as well as Bangladesh Youth Movement. Through over twenty years of persistence and hard work campaigning for level crossings in Tipton a 2.2 million pound project finally commenced last year. Cllr Haque also played a pivotal role during Ms Syeda Khatun's election campaign who later became the first Bangladeshi female councillor in the Midlands area in 1999.



Any attempt to write history or present state of Bangla print or electronic media in the UK will not be complete without mentioning one name, Syed Samadul Haque. Born in Kishorehonj and brought up in the tea valley of Sylhet, Samadul Haque was educated in Dhanmondi Govt. Boys High School, Dhaka College and Dhaka University.

Adventure and carrying out new ideas is part of Samadul Haque's character. In 1973 while he was a Secretary of Dhaka College Student Union, travelled to India with a State Student delegation. After a brief break of study to attend Military Academy, Samadul Haque came back to Dhaka University to study Politics. While in the University he was also Director of a family business, Sputnik International Limited. From 1981 to 1983 he traveled to London several times on business. But journey to London in late 1983 was not a very pleasant one. This time he came to London to sue a British Company, Wells Bridge Motors Limited of Cambridge for breach of Contract. This litigation in the High Court of London changed the destiny of Samadul Haque. He decided to live for some time in London and took up a career in media. Soon he was appointed as London Correspondent of Dainik Bangla, then national newspaper of Bangladesh and began writing for different newspapers in Dhaka & London.

In 1984 Samadul Haque joined the Weekly Janomot of London. Soon became the News Editor and Executive Editor, and editor in 1989. In the year 1987 his story on personal life of the then President of Bangladesh H M Ershad was also picked up by Sunday Observer of London as lead story and in response the government of Bangladesh retaliated by banning 'Janomot' in Bangladesh.

He spent good ten years of his youthful time to revitalize and give a solid foundation for Janomot. In 1993-94 he served as part-time Media Consultant of Bethnal Green City Challenge, a project of the Department of Environment of British Government. In 1995 while he was editor of BNS, introduced International news agency service in Bangladesh in Bangla. He also represented CNN in Bangladesh from 1995 - 1998.

Samadul Haque is a pioneer of ethnic television broadcasting in the UK. In May 1998 he with two friends formed Bangla Television Limited and became Managing Director of the company. This Company launched first satellite Bangla TV Channel outside Indian sub-continent on 16 September 1999. During his long career in broadcasting industry he also served as Director of News of Reminiscent Television, Managing Director of Channel S Bangladesh and CEO of Takbeer TV in the UK.

His innovative contribution in British Bangla Media includes launching of 'Daily Janomot', first Bangla internet daily in 1995 and Bangla tele-news service in the UK in 1994. He is also a pioneer of Call Centre industry in Bangladesh. In the year 2009 he opened Orbit Communications Call Centre, first international Call Centre in Bangladesh.

Outside his professional world Samadul Haque is a Community activist. In 80's and 90's he was in the forefront of antiracist and ethnic minority rights movement in the UK. He was a founder EC member of Tower Hamlets Law Centre, founder General Secretary of Bangla Shahitya Porishod in the UK and also one of the Founder of London Bangla Press Club.

Yashmin Harun BEM serves as the founding Chair of the Muslimah Sports Association (MSA), established in 2014. With over 20 years of banking experience spanning various roles from back-office to Head office positions, she currently holds the position of Credit Policy & Samp; Governance Officer at SMBC Banking International. Recently, Yashmin completed a Masters in Global Public Policy, for which she received a scholarship.

Yashmins dedication to community and advocacy is evident through her recent appointments.

Yashmin's most recent appointment is as a Non-Executive Director at Charity Bank. She was also selected by Baroness Warsi to join the Islamophobia Working Group led by Kick It Out and elected as Vice Chair at the London Football Association. Additionally, Yashmin serves as the Chair of Frenford and MSA Women's Football Club, facilitating the participation of over 100 girls from a South Asian background in football.

Her contributions extend beyond sports, as evidenced by her involvement in the recent House of Lords Sports and Recreation consultation and her role as a guest lecturer at Manchester Met University, where she shares her lived experiences. Yashmins efforts in the voluntary sector have earned her recognition, including the prestigious British Empire Medal in 2020 for her work in increasing representation of BAME females in sports.

Yashmin has broken barriers in various fields, becoming the first Muslim Bangladeshi woman to serve as acting Senior iNED at British Fencing and as a Director at London FA. She also serves on the FA Council, where she advocates for diversity and inclusion in sports policies and strategies.

Her achievements have not gone unnoticed, as evidenced by her recent accolades, including the Asian Woman of Achievement Award for Sports and Sister in Business Award in 2023, and her inclusion in the Top 50 Most Influential Muslims in Europe list.

Yashmins commitment to diversity and inclusion in sports has been recognised through various awards and was recognised as one of the Top 50 most influential Muslim in Europe. Other awards include the Faith; Belief Awards, FA Grassroots Football Award, FA For All Award, and the She Awards 2019. Additionally, she received the London Sports Workforce Award in 2018 and The Muslim News Award in 2017. Yashmins contributions have also led to winning the National Diversity Awards in 2023.



Saeed Haque was born and raised in North London. He graduated In Economics in the early 2000s where he started a career in Financial Services and Banking. Throughout the earlier years, he had worked for various banks and financial institutions across the world with postings in Germany, Dubai, Singapore, and UK Financial Districts. With his knowledge and experience in wealth management and private banking, in 2018 he co-founded a wealth management company in Dubai at the heart of Dubai International Financial Centre (DFIC) and a consultancy company for HNW and UHNW clients. Around early 2020, Saeed Haque returned to the UK during the Covid-19 Pandemic, where he identified opportunities in merchant card processing and FX services.

This led him to create Rosenburg Financial Services in the UK to help service businesses across the world. Over the past few, he has diversified his interests into the Property sector and the Accountancy/Legal Industry. Saeed Haque is known for his philanthropic contributions in Bangladesh, where he is following his family's tradition of promoting economic growth and prosperity for the poorest regions. He has an interest in a madrasa and school assisting 600 disadvantaged orphans and children to gain education to higher secondary level.





Mr. Mahmud Hasan was awarded an MBE at the birthday honours of HRH Queen Elizabeth II in 1999 for extensive community relations in the UK.

Mr. Hasan was born in a respectable Muslim family on 6th August in 1952 in the village of Boraikandi in Sylhet, Bangladesh. His father was Moin Uddin Ahmed, who was the commander in chief of Pakistan National Guard Regiment in 1947 and later joined the Pakistan Army as Lieutenant, who passed away in 1986.

Mr. Hasan has graduated from Bangladesh. In 1968, he became a member of the Student League and played an active role during the mass upsurge against the autocrat ruler of Pakistan in 1969. He also participated in the war of liberation of Bangladesh in 1971. He was a member of Bangladesh Liberation Front (BLF).

Immediately after liberation he worked with International / Bangladesh Red Cross Society towards the rehabilitation programme in the war torn areas of the newly born country.

Mr. Hasan first came to the UK in 1979, and settled in the London Borough of Camden. Within the first two years of his settlement in the UK, he started working in the field of community development through Camden Committee for Community Relations (CCCR) and Bengali Workers Action Group (BWAG).

In 1984, he was appointed as part-time Community Development Worker to work with elderly people and homeless families in Camden. In the same year, he was elected as Ethnic Minority Representative to the Inner London Education Authority (ILEA). In 1987, he was appointed to a challenging position as a co-ordinator to redevelop the BWAG known as Surma Community Centre. He has since worked in different senior positions in both voluntary and local government.

He successfully led the completion of the construction work of the purpose-built Surma Community Centre in Camden in 1989. After completion of the Centre, he was strongly supported by the community to take the lead on further development and management of the Centre and was elected chair of BWAG in a voluntary capacity.

In early 1990, he was appointed as Senior Community Development Officer of CHIC, a Charitable Organisation based in Westminster. He has successfully completed graduation on Leadership and Networking from Common Purpose in 1991-1992.

Mr. Hasan has played a key role, along with others, to bring a positive change in Camden which had been experiencing lots of social deprivation and disadvantages. As one of the then young activists, he worked hard to change the destiny of the community: from desperation to dignity and achievement.

Mr. Mahmud Hasan has remarkable contribution to help and support the homeless people, develop health and education, intensify anti-racism campaigns, fight against discrimination and strengthen racial equality.

He has contributed significantly to combat racism, particularly in Central London and is always constructive to develop racial harmony within the multicultural society of Britain.

He was always engaged voluntarily to act on behalf of others in need and in defence of a moral cause, remembers one Camden resident. Mr. Hasan was elected as the first Bangladeshi chair of Camden Racial Equality Council (CREC) in 1993. A year later, Mr. Hasan was elected as the first Bangladeshi Councillor in the London Borough of Camden. Mr. Hasan has been involved in various Voluntary Sector Organisations including as the Director of Camden Community Law Centre, Voluntary Action Camden, Governor of St Michael School and Kingsway College Corporation, Member of Camden Police Consultative Committee, and Director of Paddington Church's Housing Association.

He is also the founder and current chairman of the Consortium of Bengali Associations (CBA).He was a Civic Ambassador to the London 2012 Olympic Games Forum. Mr. Hasan's profile has been recorded in the Asian "Who's Who" International and in many other publications. Mr. Hasan is currently employed as Chief Executive of APASENTH, a leading social care organisation in the UK working for the people with special needs for over last three decades and APASENTH International, a newly formed CIO. Mr. Hasan is currently leading a ground breaking project in Bangladesh with the aim to raise awareness and educate people with special needs on safe working and daily living practices through the provision of a range of support services.



Md Rajib Hasan is not easily defined by a single title. A software engineer by training, a digital entrepreneur by passion, a journalist by profession, and a writer by heart, his career seamlessly bridges the dynamic worlds of technology and media.

# A Turning Point for Hospitality Industry:

## Life After the RQF Level 6 Immigration Shift

The UK's Asian restaurant and takeaway sector is world-renowned for its culinary diversity, entrepreneurial spirit, and cultural contribution. Yet, since 22 July 2025, this vibrant industry has been navigating one of its taughest transitions in decades.

The implementation of RQF Level 6 as the minimum threshold for Skilled Worker visa sponsorship has dramatically reshaped recruitment in hospitality. Roles once at the heart of the sector—chefs, bakers, bar managers, restaurant managers, and takeaway managers—are no longer eligible for new Skilled Worker visas. The policy aims to create a "high-skill, high-wage" immigration system, but for hospitality, it has unleashed an urgent workforce challenge.

The UK's vibrant Asian restaurant sector, a cornerstone of British culinary culture, contributes an immense value to the economy.

However, this vital industry is facing an unprecedented challenge driven by seismic shifts in immigration policy and intense economic pressures, threatening its very foundation.

## THE AFTER EFFECTS OF THE CHANGE

#### RECRUITMENT PIPLINES HAVE DRIED UP

Recent changes to the Skilled Worker visa route have raised the skill threshold to degree level (RQF Level 6), effectively blocking access to vital international talent. With over 100 hospitality roles removed, vacancies are scaring. 2

#### **INTENSE WAGE & BUSINESS PRESSURES**

Fierce competition for a shrinking pool of domestic staff is driving salaries upward. This, combined with high energy costs and inflation, is squeezing already fragile margins, forcing businesses to cut hours and shrink menus.

# What is the quick fix?

There is **none**. Crucially, hospitality roles have been omitted from the government's Temporary Shortage List, meaning relief through overseas recruitment is not an option. Even if these roles were to be added in the future, the new ban on bringing dependents makes the UK a less attractive destination for international workers. This puts independent, family-run establishments at the greatest risk, as they are often the least equipped to weather these challenges.



He also triumphantly won the May 2022 Historic Cumberland Council election and proudly has been elected as the Vice-Chairman of the Council. He has made history by becoming the first & only Asian City Councillor in Cumbria also the first and only Asian Councillor to be elected on the new Historic Cumberland Council replacing three existing councils. He has won 4 successful elections this is his 4th term in office. Councillor Harid diverted his business skills and experiences and set up a family tech software developing business known as RobeX Technologies, specialising in digital platforms. Clients and projects include multibillion dollar global retailers, investment management platform in UK and worldwide. Councillor M A Harid was born in Kamal Bazar Sylhet. Born to Late Alhaj Yakub Ali and Mrs Khyrun Nessa, Cllr Harid came to the UK with his parents in 1972. M A Harid resided in Oldham where his brothers and sisters were born. In 1993 Cllr Harid moved to Carlisle where he established his own business.

He had three restaurants in that area. Moreover, in 2000 he worked very closely with the City Council and arranged the first curry competition in Cumbria. Cllr Harid's restaurants have won numerous awards including the first Curry Chef of the year competition to be held. After joining the Labour party in 1993, Cllr Harid was nominated to stand in the City elections and he became the first Asian Council candidate to stand for election. In 2007 Cllr Harid was elected as a Councillor defeating a BNP candidate in the process and becoming Cumbria's first and only Asian Councillor. In 2008 a thirty minute documentary was made by Border TV highlighting Cllr Harid's first year as Councillor.

Cllr Harid was nominated in 2009 for the Channel S Award and in 2013 he was awarded Channel S Community award for contributions to the community. He has worked relentlessly with numerous community initiatives and charities. He helped build the first and only Mosque in Cumbria and serves on the management committee for the local Community centre and is also a Trustee. He is a governor of Bishop Harvey Goodwin School for a role he has been serving for over 15 years. Cllr Harid is married to Nasima Akther who has a BA degree. The couple have three children.





Councillor Atiqul Hoque is the son of Lumranul Hoque. Born in Siramishi Jagannathpur, Cllr Hoque came to the UK in 1986 and attended Danford School and proceeded to Tower Hamlets College where he completed his education in business studies.

In 1997 Cllr Atiqul Hoque opened his first business at the tender age of 21, which was the chutneys Indian Takeaway in Salisbury, Wiltshire. 

Ajmalul Hossain QC practices law since he was enrolled at the Bar of England and Wales back in 1978. He is the very first and only Queen's Counsel in England of Bangladeshi origin and a Senior Advocate of the Supreme Court of Bangladesh. He regularly practices in both England and Bangladeshi jurisdiction.

Ajmalul specialises in trans-national banking, trading supply and financial contracts at Selborne Chambers in the UK. He is the senior partner of A Hossain & Associates, Law Offices, a leading commercial law firm of Bangladesh based in Dhaka. Ajmalul and A Hossain & Associates have also been registered with the Attorney-General's Chambers in Singapore as International Arbitration Practitioners. Ajmalul has acted for several hundred ex-employees of the Bank of Credit and Commerce International in the multi-million pound liquidation of the bank in England, Luxembourg and the Cayman Islands, which has now been settled in their favour.

He has represented Bangladesh and several clients as Leading Counsel in several ICC, ICSID and ad-hoc arbitrations. He was the Chairman of Employment Tribunals, dealing with complex cases of sex, race and disability discrimination, unfair and wrongful dismissal. After obtaining MBBS degree he got a scholarship from Science and Technology department of the Ministry of Bangladesh and started his journey in ophthalmology at MAI Institute of Ophthalmology and Islamia Eye Hospital, Dhaka under the direct supervision of Prof M Mustafizur Rahman.

He passed BCS exam to get Govt job in Bangladesh and at the same time got Diploma degree in Ophthalmology in Bangladesh. He worked in the biggest eye hospital in Bangladesh and then joined in the government hospital where he worked for about 3 years before moving to London. While in Bangladesh he regularly took part in many health programs on Bangladesh Radio and cultural programmes on Bangladesh Television. He had approximately 70 publications on different top daily newspapers in Bangladesh on Eye problems.

He was involved in a research survey on Glaucoma in Bangladesh which was published in the British Journal of Ophthalmology where he was the team leader of the survey team in the field.

He is involved and leading many charitable, social and professional organisations in the UK.

He was leading Bangladesh Medical Association in the U.K. as the General Secretary for 4 years.

Currently, he is serving as the President of Friends of Bangladesh, a very well-known Charity run by highly qualified people of different professions of Bangladeshi descent. Under this charity they are running a mobile breast cancer screening unit and eye camps all over in Bangladesh along with other charitable activities.







and Stoneyholme Ward in 2007, a position he has held with increasing majorities in subsequent elections. Notably, he was the first person from a Black, Asian, and Minority Ethnic (BAME) background to serve on the council's Executive and is currently serving as the first Mayor of Burnley from Bangladeshi origin for the 2024-2025 municipal year.

Shah expresses deep gratitude to the residents of his ward for their continued support, finding immense satisfaction in directly helping people and influencing positive changes in their lives. He takes pride in living in Burnley with his family and feels privileged to represent the borough as its first citizen. As Mayor, Shah enjoys visiting various community organizations, championing their work, and raising funds for local charities. He remains actively engaged with his constituents, regularly conducting ward walks to address their concerns and report issues.

In his personal life, Shah enjoys cycling through the picturesque Lancashire countryside and moors, traveling, watching football and cricket, and spending quality time with family and friends. His lifelong dedication to community service and his ongoing commitment to the people of Burnley reflect his passion for making a meaningful impact on the lives of those around him.



Hussain pursued higher education at the University of Greenwich, earning a BA (Hons) in Accounting & Finance, followed by a Global Executive MBA. He is a qualified financial accountant, registered with the Institute of Financial Accounts

Hussain is the eldest son of the late Abdul Mohammed Rahim, a successful entrepreneur in the restaurant industry with establishments in various locations, including Asha Newcastle, Asha Bridgewater Somerset, Bilaash Tandoori Frome Somerset, Balti House Bath, Jaflong Bath, and Raj Barri Maastricht in the Netherlands. Abdul Hye is an award-winning businessman, community activist and international philanthropist from Cambridge. Born in Bangladesh in 1967, he lived through the devastating war of independence in 1971 where more than 3 million lives were lost. The hardship has been the driver for his community and charitable work.

Abdul left school aged 16 without any qualifications but now owns several successful businesses.

The success of these businesses has meant he has been able to help the most needy and vulnerable in society in both the UK and Bangladesh. Abdul has devoted over 30 years to volunteering and charitable initiatives, leaving a lasting impact both locally, nationally and globally.

Over the years, Abdul has not only spearheaded numerous projects focused on education, healthcare, and poverty alleviation as the founder of AH Foundation. He has established very successful partnerships with many local organisations including Cambridge United Community Trust, Cambridge Sustainable Food, Abbey People and other local food hubs including Cambridge Food Poverty Alliance & Jimmy's Shelter.

Since 2010, Abdul has been a driving force in the Bangladesh Welfare and Cultural Association Cambridge, raising funds for local community projects. His dedication to his roots is further evident through

his role as a trustee of the Dusthopur Development Project, where he has raised over £60,000 to enhance education and welfare in his hometown.

A life member and active volunteer at the Cambridge Central Mosque, Abdul has played a pivotal role in fundraising efforts, contributing to the mosque's remarkable £25 million campaign. As Europe's first eco-friendly mosque, this landmark project reflects his commitment to sustainability and community development.

Abdul's unwavering dedication to philanthropy and community service continues to inspire and uplift countless lives, making him a true pillar of compassion and generosity.

Shelim Hussain MBE was born in 1973. He is best described as an entrepreneur having started his first business in 1991 at the age of 18 while working part-time as a waiter and studying at college for his A Levels.

Mr Hussain saw an opportunity in the market for prawn supply and started off by selling a few boxes of frozen prawns with his friend, delivering them at night while continuing with his education during the day. His business had an initial capital of only £20. Currently, the annual turnover of his business is around £40 million.

He formed Eurofoods UK in 1993 and the company has grown rapidly since. He employs over 200 staff and has food processing units in Newport, South Wales and in Barking. He also has a new plant and four factories in Bangladesh, and has started a subsidiary in New York.

Aside from Eurofoods he has also invested in the property development business in Wales. He is founder, chairman and managing director of several well reputed companies, these include Euro Foods (UK) Ltd, S & B Developments Ltd, SRS Poultry Ltd which commenced in 2003, Eurasia Food Processing (BD) Ltd situated in Bangladesh, Euro Linen Service (UK) Ltd, Horizon Seafood Ltd, Saidowla Enterprise and Euro Foods (BD) Ltd.

He has won the Eastern Eye Young Achiever Award that was presented by Prince Charles, The Prince of Wales, and was nominated for Young Achiever at the Asian Jewel Awards 2003.



Mohammad Amirul Islam, often referred to by his middle name "Amirul," was born in Senbagh, Noakhali, Bangladesh, and relocated to London in 2005. He completed his Secondary School Certificate (SSC) at Bangladesh Bank Adarsha High School in Faridabad, Dhaka, and pursued his Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) at Government Shaheed Suhrawardy College, Dhaka. He subsequently attended the University of Pune, India, where he earned both a Bachelor's and a Master's degree in Computer Science.

Since moving to the United Kingdom, Mohammad Islam has resided in the London Borough of Enfield. He obtained a Master of Philosophy (MPhil) degree from American Liberty University and an MBA from the University of Roehampton, London. He also pursued doctoral studies at Queen's University Belfast. 

In May 2023, he was elected Deputy Mayor of Enfield, and in May 2024, he became the first Bangladesh-born former Mayor of the London Borough of Enfield. His wife,

Rokshana Afroze, and his daughter, Daneen Amirul, are his consorts for the mayoral year.

As an entrepreneur, Mohammad Islam is the director of YUME International Ltd, a reputable dental equipment importer in Bangladesh. He also has partnerships with several restaurants and student recruitment services in Bangladesh. Passionate about travel, Mohammad Islam has visited 41 countries to date.





Shamsul Islam Shelim started his early education from his local village school known as Amkuna Primary School. His high school education started from Dhakadakshin High School. He then came to the UK with his parents in 1977 and continued his education at Robert Montefiore High School. From there he went on to study at East London College and, later, High Wycombe College.

Outside UK he has many financial interests in Bangladesh including Windsor Hotel & Resorts Limited, Monica Enterprise Limited, Aljalal Water, Double Glazing Limited.

Married to Salma Ferdose, Councillor Shelim has four children. The eldest works at Novacyt, after graduating from the University of Leicester and Queen Mary respectively. His second child is an aspiring Human Rights Barrister currently undergoing training at the Bar. His youngest son has just graduated Mathematical Engineering at Bristol, while his daughter is about to begin her GCSE's.



He first arrived in London in 1986 and was extremely privileged then many, as his father was an established business man in the UK. The eldest is Syedul Islam who graduated in Mechanical Engineering at Kingston, and completed his Masters at Brunel University in Aerospace Engineering. Before he passed away, he was Chair of Stepney Green Boys School and chairman of the East London Mosque. Mohammed Abdul Munim Jahedi's mother is the late Mrs Razia Khanom.

Mr Jahedi is one of four children. His eldest sister is Rehana Begum, second sister is Ruhana Begum; Mr Jahedi's brother, Abdul Mukabbir Jehadi, is a Constable and a driving instructor.

Mr Jahedi completed his secondary school certificate in Athriya at Lateral High School in 1983. He moved to the UK with his family in 1984, and then studied a BTEC National Diploma in Business and Finance at Tower Hamlets College in East London. Mr Jahedi has done a lot of work for charities in the UK and Bangladesh, and has established an Islamic school in his homeland for girls who cannot afford a basic education.

Mr Jahedi is married to Abeda Sultana Lucky, and they have three children – two daughters and a son.

Ialal Rajonuddin came to the UK with his parents at the age of 12, after the liberation war of Bangladesh in 1972.

He later graduated in social, political and economic studies and se- cured a post graduate degree in Management Studies.

In his teens Jalal participated and led the resistance of Bangladeshis in Tower Hamlets and London following the murder of Altab Ali in 1978. This achievement has been made into a Channel 4 docu- mentary and broadcasted recently. This event was the spur, which radicalised and propelled him into organising Bangladeshi youths and then the entire community in the voluntary and community sector for the next 50 years.

Jalal was a pioneer in setting up community organisations amongst youth, in the field of racial equality, education, local economic de-velopment, culture etc. Amongst others, he was founder Secretary of The Bangladeshi Youth Movement (1976) and Federation of Bangladesh YouthOrganisations-FBYO(1982), Co-founder of the Hackney and Tower Hamlets Defence Committee [1978], Com- munity representative on the Race and Housing Action Forum of the former Greater London Council-GLC [1986], Founder Chair-person of Tower Hamlets Association for Racial Equality- THARE(1984), Secretary of BangladeshEducational Needs-BENTH(1985) and Co-ordinator of Tower Hamlets Initia- tive on arts, culture andeducation(1985).

Jalal was also the key campaigner for persuading local, regional and national governments to create and establish a community assets base and was instrumental in creating a political coalition to estab- lish the following: the Bangladesh Centre, Kobi Nazrul Centre, Weavers Youth Centre, Whitechapel Centre, Children's Education Centre, Davenant and "Jagonari" Women's Centre, Rich Mix Cen-tre, Berner Youth Club, Wapping Youth Centre etc.

Jalal not only established organisations in different spheres but also began to represent the local ethnic minorities on different repre- sentative bodies. He sat on the National Steering Committee of Anti-Nazi League, was a member on Joint Docklands Action Com- mittee-JDAG, Board member of various Regeneration bodies like

City Challenge, City Fringe, Single Regeneration Budget Board (SRB) and New Deal for Communities.

This trajectory of campaigning, representing, establishing commu- nity cohesion, resistance and resilience made Jalal gravitate in a po-litical direction and he became involved in local and regional mainstream politics. He joined the Labour Party and participated in Trade Union activities in the 1970's and began the uphill task of rep- resentation of Bangladeshis and other ethnic minorities in party or- ganisational bodies and then onto to local elections.

Ialal became a Councillor in Tower Hamlets in 1990 and rose to be-come Deputy Leader and Chairpersonof Regeneration Committee from 1990 to 1998. In this capacity he represented the London Bor- ough of Tower Hamlets on the former London Dockland Develop- ment Corporation—LDDC [Canary Wharf, DLR and Social Accord Developments]. He also went on to be on the approved list of Labour' sprospective parliamentary candidates [PPC], EU candi-dates and GLA member candidates. During this period he imple- mented housing, regeneration and economic initiatives with partner organisations, by attracting special funding allocations from the national government and European Commission. More-over, Jalal was instrumental in re-naming the Altab Ali Park, setting up the "Banglatown" [including the annual "Baishaki Mela"], and established the local "Soheed Minar".

After leaving active community work and politics Jalal worked in a number of charity organisations, the Royal London NHS Trust, the Tower Hamlets College, and Havering Council.

After early retirement Jalal is involved as a feature writer, political and media commentator in various publications, radio and TV channels. Presently Jalal is involved in writing his memoirs.

Through his never –dying sprit and determination, he has been contributing to the local media as a founder member of UK Bangla Press Club. He is also an active member of the mainstream journalists association 'National Journalist Union'. Around the same time, Mr Kabir also wants to get involved himself with the Bangladeshi Media. Having this in mind, he published the first 24- hour online News Postal 'CTG News' in Chittagong. Mashuk Ahmed Khan ("Ahmed-Khan") is the eldest son of Mohammed Matiur Rahman Khan and Begum Jamila Khan of an academically enriched respectable Muslim family of landed gentry and successful entrepreneurship, of village Gangajal, Zakigonj, of district Sylhet.

Ahmed-Khan is an unassuming, spatiotemporally adaptable, vivacious individual, avid to his continued self development. Following his MA and a PG Diploma in Human Resource Management ("HRM"), he completed an M.Phil research on International HRM titled "Export Orientated Industrialisation and the Exploitation of Labour in the Developing Economies". Thereafter he reassigned his academic interest in Law with sustained enthusiasm and achieved a Master of Laws degree ("L.L.M") with merit from the World-class Birkbeck College of the University of London. He lately achieved another L.L.M by thesis on Professional Legal Practice from the reputable BPP University - complementing his PG Diploma in legal practice. 





Mr Khan became the chairman of 'Provatee Shahitto Porishod', commanding officer of 'Shurjo Shena Shishu Shongo' and later a journalist for 'Sylhet Shomachar' a local newspaper in Sylhet.

In 1982 Mr Khan moved to UAE where he set up a business. He then migrated to England in 1986 where he worked at Burleigh College in Loughborough as a modern languages teacher. 

She is also a producer on the first action adventure film, alongside Mark Huffam, producer for Ridley Scott's Oscar nominated 'The Martian' and 'Alien: Covenant'.

Tasmin has reported on some of the biggest news stories in the world including the South East Asian Boxing Day Tsunami, the death of Michael Jackson, Barack Obama's inauguration and the capture of Osama Bin Laden. She has interviewed global figures such as Bill Clinton, Angelina Jolie, Shah Rukh Khan and hosted the Commonwealth Games Baton Relay at Buckingham Palace with Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II in attendance.

An entrepreneur from an early age, Tasmin has grown several successful tech start-up businesses in the Silicon Valley and London. In 2007, Tasmin was

Dr Zakir Khan was born in Bangladesh and came to England aged 5 with his parents. He grew up in Tower Hamlets, East London, where he became a youth worker and community representative. Since 2000 he has worked for Canary Wharf Group, first as Sports and Community officer and now as Head of Public Affairs. He is also Director & Head of Public Affairs a prestigious TV channel NTV UK, Europe.

In 2010 Zakir was the Conservative PPC for Bethnal Green and Bow, securing an increase in the Conservative vote in this highly marginal and politically charged seat. Zakir has a deep and wide understanding of Bangladesh, and in particular has experience of helping set up new charitable initiatives on the ground. He has a good relationship with all the political parties in Bangladesh and good links in such fields as sport, media, business, education, manufacturing, and universities.

In the UK Zakir has worked for the public, private and voluntary sectors, and has built up a positive programme of bringing these different sectors together to deliver projects. Zakir has been involved in community work since he was a teenager. In 1990, aged 19, he was the co-founder and Chair of Community Action Group, a campaign group for local young people to help represent their interests to statutory and police authorities and to help reduce tension between communities.

He was also elected Vice Chair for Youth Connections another youth campaign group that was collectively formed by all major youth groups in Tower Hamlets. Zakir was elected by the community to represent them as a Board Member of the Connecting Communities SRB 5, and Cityside Regeneration in Spitalfields, He is the current Vice Chair of the Osmani Centre User's Forum, He was a Director of The Adab Trust. This is a new initiative established to increase employment prospects for inner city young black and minority ethnic people and specifically those from Asian and Muslim backgrounds. He was also an ambassador for Touch The Game project. This is a unique project that collects unused sports equipment from residents in the UK and delivers them to the most deprived countries in the world such as Africa and the Indian sub continent

In the 2010 General Election he was selected as Conservative Party Parliamentary Candidate for Bethnal Green and Bow in Tower Hamlets, securing a 2% increase in the Conservative vote despite only being selected in late March 2010. Since formally joining the Party in 2006, Zakir has been actively working to promote the Conservative party within the Bangladeshi UK community. In Jan 2010 he organised a delegation to Bangladesh led by Mark Field MP.

Zakir was successful in arranging meetings for the delegates with the Prime Minister of Bangladesh Sheikh Hasina, Ex Prime Minister now Opposition Leader Begum Zia, The British High Commissioner and many other Members of The Bangladeshi Parliament. He is the current Chairman, Conservative Friends of Bangladesh (CFOB) London Region. In 1996 he co-founded Sporting Bengal Football Team and was the manager of the team for four years in his spare time.

In 1997 Zakir spear headed the formation of The Bangladesh Football Association UK as the Chair of the organisation he established a summer football league with just eight teams which now has 46 teams. Yawar Khan is a Successful Pioneering Restaurateur, the Founder & Chair of Asian Catering Federation and Asian Curry Awards and the Vice President of the European Small Business Alliance (ESBA).

Mr Yawar Khan has been a successful restaurateur since the establishment of his first restaurant - the Akash Tandoori in Wallington, Sutton over 43 years ago in 1978. He is one of the early pioneers of the now thriving Curry industry in Britain.

When the UK Government introduced limitations on visa awards to overseas workers in 2008 Yawar Khan rose to the challenge and founded the Federation of Bangladeshi Caterers - an organisation committed to providing support and advice and to the promotion of the cuisine, interests and activities of more than 12,000 British Bangladeshi restaurants in the UK at that time. With 8 out of 10 Indian restaurants in the UK owned by Bangladeshis, these restaurants formed the backbone of the British Curry Industry.


Some three years later in 2011, as a response to the growing demands of a burgeoning wider Asian population in the UK (there are more than 4.5 million Asians living in Britain), Yawar Khan took a lead in founding the Asian Catering Federation in an attempt to forge collaboration and cooperation between the different umbrella groups - the Bangladeshi Caterers Federation; the Chinese Takeaway Association and the Malaysian Restaurant Association and to provide a united front in terms of support and advice to the needs of restaurateurs serving cuisine from across the Asia spectrum. These included Bangladesh, India, Pakistan, Burma, China, the

Philippines, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, The Middle East, Singapore, Sri Lanka, Thailand and Vietnam.

The Federation led a robust campaign to galvanise parliamentary members to support the designation of Bangladeshi workers as a 'shortage occupation' in order to make it easier to obtain special work permits. This eventually led to the establishment of an All Party Parliamentary Group in 2014. Yawar Khan then capped these remarkable achievements by establishing the much celebrated annual Asian Curry Awards (now in its 12th year).

Yawar Khan is currently Vice President of the European Small Business Alliance (ESBA) representing and advocating on behalf of over one million small businesses across 36 European countries in the European parliament in Brussels. Yawar Khan continues to find time to commit to charitable work during the Covid Pandemic which shut down of the hospitality industry over a two year period - as government restrictions were introduced, Yawar Khan and his fellow director's encouraged critical support of food provision to hospital and emergency workers from among his federation

Yawar Khan also participates every year in fund-raising projects in association with the Mayor and Municipality of Sutton - raising thousands of pounds for the South Western Thames Kidney Fund, Cancer Research UK and other charities such as the Asian Trust . For over forty years he has maintained continual support to humanitarian organisations in his country of origin - Bangladesh, working closely with charities such as the Beanibazar Cancer and General Hospital.



Her first encounter with the community was at St Hilda's Community Centre in East London in 1975, where she took her son their for a check up and realised so many Bangladeshi's could not communicate in English properly. Shuva always had a passion to help people, She then started working voluntarily for the community as a translator.

As years went by Shuva realised her vision for life was to help the community and that is exactly what she did. She helped families struggling with housing, marriage problems and financial issues with her own money and used her home as a shelter regardless of their race or religion.

In 1996 Shuva started her own charity in Bangladesh called Shonali Shopno which she funds by holding dinner parties and supplying food to other organisations. She uses the money to provide sewing machines and rickshaws for families in Bangladesh who need a kick start in life. In 1999 her charity started paying for cataract operations in Bangladesh and has helped many people regain their sight.

In 2011 she registered her UK charity Golden Dreams and continued to use her cooking skills to

raise funds to provide medical/maternity help in Bangladesh. She also pays for up to 200 circumcisions per year.

Shuva has won numerous awards in the UK and Bangladesh including the Hason Raja Shommanona and Gunijon Shommanona.

In her youth Shuva was an activist for the Awami League (mukti judha) helping freedom fighters during the liberation war. She was encouraged by her uncle's Fokrul Islam and Anwar Uddin Gama. Last year she was awarded a Leadership and Community award by SOAS. Shuva's hobbies are cooking, socialising and teaching others how to cook. She has 4 Children all married. Eldest son Md Tanbir works as a Metropolitan Police officer, Sania is a business woman, Sadia is a IT systems developer and youngest daughter Radia is a college Enrolment Student Support Officer.



Samata Khatoon is a Labour Councillor for St Pancras & Somers Town Ward. Prior to becoming a Councillor in 2010 Samata worked in Camden as a Senior Youth Worker and a Family Support Worker for Islington. She is a mother of three children, who have all attended Camden Schools. She was also the first ethnic person to be elected to the Family Law Bar Association Committee in 2003.

Sapnara Khatun was born in Sylhet and came to the UK as a child. She is the daughter of late Mimbor Ali, a highly respected member of the Bangladeshi community, honoured by the Bangladeshi Government for his significant contribution to the liberation of Bangladesh.

In 2018 she was awarded the degree of doctor of laws, Honoris causa, by Royal Holloway (University of London. She was appointed by the lord chief justice as a Diversity community Relations Judge and a judicial Role Model.

Sapnara Khatun has served as Director /Chair of a number of charities and voluntary sector organisations and lectures widely on issues relating to family law. She is married with two children.


As a student he became involved in journalistic ac-

He arrived from Bangladesh in 2001 and with just a few GCSEs and he is now the Director and Owner of DREAMSPAS Limited, Style Shoes Limited, Go Phone Limited and Gems Design & Repair Ltd. DREAMSPAS Limited is one of the fastest growing Hot Tub retailer chains in the Southwest of England. Kuduse is also Founder and CEO of non-profit organization named, Smile Learning Centre, Self-run Charity and Hazi Abdus Shohid Foundation.





Ajmal Masroor was the independent Parliamentary Candidate for Bethnal Green and Bow constituency in London Borough of Tower Hamlets, during the last general election.



Jusna Begum Miah is a barrister and Partner at M R Solicitors LLP. She was called to the Bar of England and Wales by the Honourable Society of Lincolns Inn in November 1998.

Ms Miah completed her primary education in Bangladesh, before coming to the UK. She attended Mulberry School for Girls where she obtained seven GCSE's. She attended Tower Hamlets College to do her A' Levels and obtained three A Levels. She then rstudied law at the University of Westminster.

After completing her LLB (Hons) she embarked on the Bar Finals at BPP Law School. After being called she had been providing legal services as a Barrister. She successfully opened up her own Practice in August 1998 called Mian Law Associates and later joined M R Solicitors LLP.

Prior to her legal career, Jusna Begum Miah worked for the NHS as Bilingual Health Care Assistant at the Royal London Hospital for some eight years from 1990. She was then elected as a Councillor in May 1998, for St Peters Ward, Bethnal Green. This made her the first elected Sylheti female Councillor in Tower Hamlets. Whilst a Councillor, Jusna served on numerous panels, including the education and housing scrutiny panels. She was also a member of the Board of Directors for Spitalfields community Trust

and a Member of Toynbee Housing Association, to name a few. Ms Miah has been the a patron for Tower Hamlets Parent Centre.

Jusna is also deeply connected with both British as well as Bangladeshi Politics. Here she is a member of the Labour Party and has been so since 1990. served as a delegate on EC, GMC and LGC and also astudent and Youth officer for the Bethnal Green and Bow Constituency. She was also the Chiari for Whitechapel Ward from 2002 to 2004. In relation to Bangladeshi politics, Jusna held the position of the President of the UK BNP Mohila Dal and has represented the BNP at different platforms.

Jusna is a founding trustee for Bangladesh Female Academy UK and has been the Chair for two consecutive years a post she held from April 2007 – 2009. Jusna is a Trustee for the Brihottor Sylhet Education Trust and the Vice Chair of the Trust. She is also a Member of the International Bar Association.

Jusna Begum Miah makes regular appearances on the various British Bangladeshi television channels such as Channel S and ATN Banglad, including the talk shows and legal advice programmes.

She has also received numerous accolades, including the Channel S award in 2006. Furthermore, Jusna feels very passionate about women empowerment and has worked for charitable organisation.





Manik Miah was born in Biswanath, Sylhet, Bangladesh, the son of the late Alhaz Modoris Ali (Mahjom), a renowned businessman and a well known charitable donor.

During Mr Miah's student life he served as General Secretary for Chattra Union from 1967 and became President of the Bangladesh Liberation Movement (Songram Proshiodod Porisod) in Biswanath Thana from 1967 -1971. In 1972 Mr Miah became Vice Chair for the National Awami Party (NAP), and the following year he was also elected as Cultural Secretary for the Students Union in Madan Mohan College.

Mr Miah has over 45 years' experience in catering within the UK. He has had a few restaurants over the years, and has achieved prestigious awards.

Mr Miah is from a family background which had Indian restaurants in the UK prior to the Second World War. The family still own their restaurant in Earls Court London which was started by his uncle, Idris Ali. This background explains how Mr Miah was encouraged to become a restaurateur.

Mr Miah actively enjoys being part of the Ipswich business community, and is very well respected both in business and as a central figure in the wider Bangladeshi community. Manik Miah is passionate about his family and the community in which he lives. He intends to vigorously continue his charitable works to support his local and the wider community.



Shamim is a future leader and a proud young British Bangladeshi who has been spearheading real change within Leeds. Raised in one of the poorest postcodes in the UK, Shamim worked hard to overcome barriers, quickly seeking a passion for local politics and youth empowerment. Taking inspiration from Faruk Miah MBE he stood to be the Member of Youth Parliament for Leeds, where he was elected by 180,000 young people of Leeds to represent them in the House of Commons. This inspired an invitation to shadow and be mentored by prominent political figures John Bercow and Matt Hancock. Following this success, Shamim became a young political star and has since taken on several positions, enabling him to make real effective change within Leeds. Shamim was one of the youngest school governors in the UK, taking the position at 19. He has most recently advanced his passion for education, by being appointed as a Trustee of the Cockburn Multi Academy Trust. During this tenure as a Trustee of the five schools, Shamim has helped facilitate improvements in education and soften the impact of covid-19 by making work experience more accessible. This significantly impacted students, who can now learn and experience a sector they are interested in outside of the classroom. His commitment to enhancing the quality of education over the last 6 years was exemplified, when Cockburn School was judged to be Outstanding by Ofsted - celebrating the schools progress within the Leeds community.

Shamim is a big supporter and advocate of giving back to his roots and community. Alongside members of his family, he co-founded a youth club for British Bangladeshi's called "The Bangla Square Youth Club". This project aims to provide young people within the community access to extracurricular activities to improve their skill sets, culture capital, and experiences as British citizens looking to contribute to the wider society.

Holding a Master's in Law, he is now finalising his qualification as a corporate finance lawyer at a Top 40 Law firm, Shoosmiths. Utilising his network, he regularly hosts work experience days for students who have an interest in pursuing law. Combined with his community work, this has led to him becoming a multi award winner. He was named the British Muslim Young Achiever of the Year, the Yorkshire Young Achiever of the Year and received a Princess Diana Award for his role as a community leader.





Rohema Miah has worked in the parliamentary sphere for over 20 years. Her experience spans working for MPs, Ministers and Lords. Notably, she has worked for the Rt. Hon. Harriet Harman MP and Baroness Oona King of Bow, currently YouTube's Global Head of Diversity. She is currently the Political Advisor to Lord Robin Eames OM. Rohema continues to champion issues relating to social mobility, discrimination, inclusion and equality and holds a number of positions in the charity and voluntary sector.

Rohema was elected as the first female to the UK Bangladesh Catalysts of Commerce and Industry (UK-BCCI) in February 2014 as a non-Executive board Member. This organisation exists to promote business between the UK and Bangladesh.

Having worked as a Consultant to local, national and international organisations and departments, Rohema has a record of establishing, strengthening and developing both new and existing relationships.

Her experience working with grassroots community organisations, along with various media, faith and disability groups, corporate, local and international NGOs gives her a great insight to the range of opportunities for positive impact. Rohema has demonstrated a commitment to end social exclusion and child poverty in addition to her campaign for sustainable development. She has visited Bangladesh on numerous occasions with senior politicians and celebrities.

Ms Rohema Miah was a Director for the Commission on British Muslims and Islamophobia and Jermaine Jackson's NGO, Earthcare International as well as serving as the Policy and Development Officer for the Centre of Muslim Affairs (2006-2007). Within the last few years, she has also co-ordinated interfaith projects to create a better understanding such as Alif Aleph, an organisation promoting dialogue between Muslims and Jews. Rohema also works as a Trustee for the Henna Foundation UK – a charity committed to strengthening Muslim families in the UK.

Having successfully organized the Bangladesh e-Commerce fair in London in 2015, she has taken on further projects to promote and strengthen the role of women in ICT and is currently organizing global conferences in women inclusion in ICT.



Tamanna Miah was born in Sylhet, Bangladesh, then moved to Kent to settle with her parents and four siblings.

Tamanna started her journey in youth, community, volunteering and politics aged 11, and was inspired by her late father, Kamal Jahangir Miah (John) who passed away to COVID-19. He was a renowned community leader involved in multiple organisations including the Bangladesh Welfare Association Royal Tunbridge Wells (BWATW), Bangladesh Catering Association (BCA), the British Bangladesh Catering Association (BBCA), Bangladesh House, Sylhet Sadar Trust and many

Her first involvement in charity was volunteering for her father's first charity, BWATW bringing together the younger and older generations to create community cohesion. She then volunteered for local organisations including St Mary's Youth, West Kent Extra, alongside youth politics and was elected as the first Bangladeshi Muslim female as Youth Councillor and Chair of Sevenoaks Youth Council and Kent Youth County Council. She fundraised and campaigned successfully for years to raise £150,000 to establish Sevenoaks Youth Cafe- House in the Basement which helped thousands access help, support, activities, training, employment opportunities and benefit the wider community. She also campaigned successfully for the Kent Freedom Bus pass extension for 16-19yr olds unlimited Kent bus travel and helped secure thousands of petition signatures. Tamanna was the first Bangladeshi Muslim female recognised by the Kenward Trust Youth services for Outstanding Voluntary Community Contribution Award in 2010 educating youths on substance misuse. In 2011 West Kent Extra awarded her for Outstanding Con-

Service to Kent Young people. In 2011 she was the first Bangladeshi Muslim female recognised at the Kent TryAngle awards for Overall Winner for Sevenoaks, Dartford and Gravesend, Special Achievement Award for Citizenship, Volunteering and Service to the community. In 2011 and 2012 she received two Diana Awards for Champion Volunteer 2011 & 2012.

Alongside her involvement locally and regionally Tamanna volunteered for the British Youth Council (BYC) and was elected as Deputy Member of Youth Parliament representing Kent and the South East and had the once in a lifetime opportunity to sit in the House of Commons benches for debates. She was awarded the Youth Voice Award 2013 from BYC. Tamanna was recruited to be UK Young Ambassador for Europe representing British youths at conferences, conducting UK-wide research, consultations, events, producing a report with findings alongside recommendations to present to EU conferences and highprofile figures and returned with outcomes to action.

Tamanna was the first Bangladeshi Muslim female awarded scholarships to attend Jigsaw Performing Arts school to train in Drama, Dance, Singing and performed in shows and received an award to recognise her 4-year commitment to the Arts.

From 2012- 2017 she studied BA Media and Communications & Politics and Governance at Canterbury Christ Church university and graduated in 2018. She was the first Bangladeshi Muslim female awarded the most volunteer hours of 1000+.

Tamanna was a Finalist for the British Red Cross Humanitarian Citizen Awards 2015 for commitment to volunteering and campaigning. She was the first Bangladeshi Muslim female awarded the 1st Young Upstander Award at the National Hate Crime Awards 2016 recognising her racist bullying campaign film work on ITV News.

She also won the Janey Antoniou Award 2016 from Rethink Mental Illness as the first Bangladeshi Muslim female recognising her work in mental health, suicide, BAME and youth communities. Tamanna raised thousands, for years, for Britain's' and Bangladesh's' homeless and provided food and necessities. She was awarded for raising money as a Friend of RFC for Channel S for Covid-19 Crisis in 2020.

Tamanna is a TEDx Public Speaker, Media Spokesperson, Presenter, Researcher, Campaigner and has worked with over 85+ organisations in the last 19 years.

Tofozzul Miah an entrepreneur and the founder of the award-winning Bayleaf Group and Hiltop Motors, is located in North London. He is well-known for his innovative and forward-thinking mindset in business and plays a key role in his community. Tofozzul migrated from Bangladesh to the UK in the 1970s at the age of 9. From a young age, he aspired to have control over his own destiny and realised that self-employment would provide that opportunity.

From a young age, Tofozzul worked labour-intensive jobs after school and on weekends, including working in the rug trade and at Sunday markets. Although he faced setbacks when he opened his first Asian restaurant, he made the decision to become a chef to acquire the comprehensive skillset required to run a successful establishment. He worked in a Punjabi-owned restaurant for the next three years until an opportunity arose to become a partner in a restaurant in North London. With his newfound kitchen experience, he took another leap and opened his own business, which proved to be considerably profitable. During this time, he worked seven days a week, dedicating 14 to 16 hours each day.

Recognizing the emerging market of food delivery in the 1990s, Tofozzul decided to venture into this new avenue, opening Bayleaf Takeaway in North London. Within the first few years, the establishment garnered numerous awards and accolades and continues to thrive after 27 years. Additionally, he identified a gap in the market for a fine dining Indian restaurant, leading to the opening of Bayleaf Restaurant in 2013, which has also achieved great success. Currently, it ranks among the top 5 out of 17,500 restaurants on TripAdvisor in the city of London.

Alongside his journey in the catering industry, Tofozzul started buying and selling cars as a hobby in 2006. The impressive returns prompted him to expand operations and purchase a forecourt that could accommodate 20 vehicles. With continued success, he further expanded by acquiring a car showroom in 2009, establishing Hiltop Motors as a quality German car dealership with up to 100 cars in stock. It has been highly successful, generating a turnover of nearly £6 million per year. Recently, Tofozzul embarked on a new and exciting business venture with his three sons, launching the used-car supermarket Car Planet, which stocks over 500 vehicles at their Watford site.

Tofozzul is also a founder-trustee of the Bangladeshi Welfare Society of Barnet, which recently acquired a freehold Masjid worth almost £1 million to serve the growing Muslim community. Additionally, he holds the position of Director and former Secretary General of the British Bangladeshi Caterers Association (BBCA). This organisation is highly recognised in the sector and has provided him with opportunities to make appearances in mainstream media, including the BBC, ITV and Al-Jazeera, as well as participate in discussions with government ministers at No.10 Downing Street regarding policies affecting the catering industry.



Rowshanara Moni was born in the Moulvibazar district town in Bangladesh. She is the sixth child of Late Mohammed Samroo who was a very well known business man in the UK, and Syeda Sufia Kanum, her mother who was actively involved in politics in Bangladesh.

Rowshanara Moni has completed her primary education in Bangladesh and came to the UK in 1984 when she was only 10 years old. She completed her education in the UK.


She has been singing since the age of six. Music is her passion and she can live for it. After coming to UK she joined Dishari Shilpi Gushti and performed in many stage programmes. When she was only 11 she performed in the Royal Albert Hall for the "Save the Children Foundation" and she was singing in front of the honourable guest Princess Anne.

In 1985 she took part in the Bengali Song Contest which was organised by Tower Hamlets Borough, and won 1st prize in Folk song. In 1986 she won 2nd prize in folk song and modern song and 1987 and 1988 she won 2nd prize in modern song and folk song. She has received many other awards and certificates from different organisations. Apart from singing she took great interest in acting. The first stage drama she took part in is "Khotto Bikkhoto" in Camden and she also took part in many other stage dramas. She acted in the first Bangla TV (UK) drama, which was called

"Laal Golap" written by Abdul Gaffer Chowdhury. Rowshanara Moni regularly took part in radio dramas in the "Sunrise Radio" Bengali department with Azizul Hakim. She became well known to the Bangladeshi community as a result. She was a presenter for "Sunrise Radio" in the Bengali department. At the age of 18 she got married in Bangladesh to Mr Mohammed Iqbal who was a Civil Engineer at the Water Development Board in Bangladesh. She has one child who is called Aynan Shabab Iqbal. Rowshanara Moni sang in all leading channels in the UK

and from time to time she goes to Europe to perform.

In July 2009 she organised a fund raising event for the late baul shamraat Shah Abdul Karim and raised £10000 for his rehabilitation. In 2010 she has again organised a thanks giving award to those who helped raise £10000 for baul shamraat Shah Abdul Karim in 2009. She is involved in charity work too. In addition, she has great interest in politics both in the UK and Bangladesh. She is the current Women Affairs Secretary for the Bangladesh Nationalist Party in UK. At present she is working full time in NHS as a medical administrator.





Former Cllr Mukit MBE has lived and worked in Tower Hamlets for 43 years and was amongst the first few Bangladeshis in the East End to receive the Queen's Award in the Millennium Year, for youth and community development. He has a passion for politics and advancing community interests.

Former Cllr Mukit MBE has established a continuous record of working for the community. His achievements include setting up numerous youth initiatives; the Sylhet Friends Society, Bangladesh Sports Association, UWA, Progressive Youth Organisation, Boundary Community School, Weavers Community Trust and a host of other parent and community forums. In addition Cllr Mukit MBE also received the House of Lords British Muslim Honorary Award in 2001. His dedication and commitment has extended to a variety of causes including combating racism and building positive race relations in the 1970's and 1980's, as well as ßinvolvement in setting up projects in the East End in more recent years in support of youth and community development, housing, educational achievement, health and employment.

As Chair of the Human Resources Committee and Health Scrutiny Committee for Tower Hamlets Council he played a crucial role in promoting good governance. He is the trustee for Spitalfields Market Trust and for many years chaired the Spitalfields Housing Association, and he continues to play a leading role in its development. He was responsible for setting up the first community regeneration project, the Spitalfields Small Business Association. His most recent appointments were as a school governor at St Matthias Primary School, Cabinet member for Sports and Culture (LBTH), Chair of the Development Committee (LBTH), Vice Chair of the Strategic Development Committee (LBTH) and most notably Speaker (Civic Mayor) where he was appointed consecutively for two full terms (a first for LBTH).

Former Cllr Mukit MBE has a long association with local residents and community groups, he believes in sustained community development and the promotion of racial harmony and justice. Tower Hamlets represents a rich culture and diverse community and Cllr Mukit MBE is committed to working with everyone.



Councillor Shahanara Naser (Momtha) was born in the village of Amkuna, Golapgonj, Sylhet. She arrived in the United Kingdom in 1977, together with her father, the late Jamshed Ali, her mother, KhaledaKhanom, and four siblings.

She spent her early childhood and primary school years in East London. She relocated to Bangladesh and enrolled in Sylhet's Blue Bird High School, later completing SSC (GCSE) at Sylhet Govt Girls High School. Her academic path led her to 'Sylhet Womens College' to complete her HSC (A level). Returning to the UK, she pursued higher education at Windsor and Maidenhead College'. Her passion for healthcare led her to pursue a BSc in 'Health and Social Science' at New Buckingham University.

In 1993, she married Shah Abu Naser, Sajon (teacher), son of Shah Moddosir Ali (Manik Miah), from Noyabondor Jaganathpur. Having dedicated several years to the NHS during the same time as an existing professional translator as well as a health advocate, she found immense joy in becoming a mother to her three children.

Driven by a commitment to positive change, she ventured into politics and achieved success as a Councillor, currently she is serving as a Deputy Mayor of Luton Borough Council.

Shahanara happened to be inspired to take another step because of her strong sense of Bengali culture, social justice, and equality for all. As an inspiration for various ethnic groups, Shahanara was motivated to move forward. Through her efforts, she has been working closely to enhance the lives of her constituents as well as make a meaningfulcontribution to the community.

Some examples of her community work include: being involved in the community heritage project, assisting in the organising of Bengali cultural events for children and families through performing, dance, poem recitation, and theatre activities, as well as exhibiting the programmes. The aim was to introduce the younger generation to the rich, vibrant culture through entertaining learning while also promoting mental health and wellbeing for the entire family. During his college life he served twice as the President of Chatra League at Sylhet Government College (MC) and twice elected General Secretary of Bangladesh Chatra League Sylhet District Branch. During 1977-1981 he played a leading role in the establishment of the Sylhet Division and a University in Sylhet.

Early in 1982, Munim went to Saudi Arabia where he established successful businesses both in Ieddah and Makkah, before moving to England in 1989. In 1991 he started his own halal takeaway business called "Sonali Tandoori" in Grove Park, South-East London, and in 1995 launched a successful and extensive property business.

In 1999, Munim was elected as the President of Bangladesh Caterers Association's South East Region. From 2004-2006 he served as Senior Vice-President of BCA central committee, and in 2007 held the role of Organising Secretary of BCA. He was also the convenor of the 2011 Annual Dinner and Awards ceremony, and from 2012-2017 served as the Secretary General of BCA. Currently, elected in 2019, he was the President of Bangladesh Caterers Association UK.

He is also a Advisor of Bangladesh Centre and Senior Vice President of Jalalabad Association UK.

A keen servant to the needy, he and his family have sought to contribute towards the development of his homeland, helping to establish masjids, madrasas, schools and orphanages in Kulaura, and support social welfare institutions providing various forms of assistance to the poor and needy in the locality. Munim is a founder Trustee of Kulaura Yakub Tazul Woman's College. Since its establishment, his younger brother Mr M A Rouf has been serving as the Principal of the college. To meet the immense demands, he and his brother founded and established a very successful and highly praised kindergarten school in Kulaura.

Munim is also socially very active in his local community, playing a leading role in establishing a masjid in Crayford, and is currently serving as Secretary of the North West Kent Muslim Association. He was also the founder chairman of the Bangla Supplementary School in Greenwich and the Greenwich Welfare Association. From 2000-2017 he acted as a Director of the Consortium of Bengali Associations (CBA). He is also the current Secretary of Sylhet Bivag Unnayan Parishad. Munim has been an active member of the Labour Party since 1995.



Mr Mahi Muqit PhD FRCOphth is a Consultant Vitreoretinal Surgeon at Moorfields Eye Hospital, and an Honorary Clinical Lecturer at the Institute of Ophthalmology at UCL, London. The Moorfields practices are based in central London and South London plus emergency services across London and the surrounding areas. He has subspecialist expertise in Vitreoretinal Surgery, Cataract Surgery, Diabetes, Medical Retina, and Retinopathy of Prematurity (ROP) screening/treatments in premature babies. His PhD research pioneered new laser treatments for diabetic patients. He is a co-author of the UK "Diabetic Retinopathy Guidelines" for the Royal College of Ophthalmologists, and the international "ICO Guidelines for Diabetic Eye Care" with the International Council of Ophthalmology.

He is the UK Chief Investigator for a clinical trial at Moorfields Eye Hospital that is investigating the use of a new electronic retinal implant "bionic eye" system for blind patients. He was the first UK surgeon to implant the device in 2016.

In the last 3 years, he has developed a renowned and highly successful independent private practice at Moorfields Private and Harley Street. This private enterprise provides high quality eye care and eye surgery for UK and London patients, overseas Bangladeshi and international patients (www.retinasurgeon.uk.com).

He has worked for over 7 years in the international voluntary sector, focused on training and setting up screening programmes in the area of diabetic eye disease. He works as a voluntary consultant for Helen Keller International (HKI), and is currently involved with several innovative diabetic retinopathy screening projects based in Bangladesh (Dhaka, Chittagong) and Indonesia. He is part of a research team that have been awarded the prestigious "Innovation Grant" from Seeing Is Believing charity and Standard Chartered Bank, and they have been successful on three occasions (2013-2016) for international charitable projects aimed at programmes to reduce the burden of global blindness. He regularly visits Bangladesh to conduct training workshops for local doctors, nurses and health community workers.

As recognition for his international and UK reputation in the sector of retinal surgery, diabetes, and international work, he was invited to be an advisor to the World Health Organisation (WHO) for the Global Diabetic Retinopathy Consultation in 2016.

Mahbub Murshed is a name for his role in making accountancy an art, bringing accountancy into the drawing room and creating a new dimension to his profession. His success story is now a sensation in the British Bangladeshi community and media. His live TV programme, "Accountancy with Mahbub Murshed" is probably the first ever and the longest running accounting and tax advisory programme in the known world. This only happened because of his vision, hard work, dedication and passion. Mahbub Murshed, a Certified Practising Accountant, was born in 1962 in Tangail, Bangladesh. Having acquired a government scholarship from Bangladesh in 1982, he went to Bulgaria to study Computer Engineering at Technical University of Varna.

It was from here that he would graft his way to create one of the largest accountancy firms in East London. Upon arrival in Britain in 1987, it became evident that a qualification from a former communist country was not going to be easy for him to acquire a job in his field. With this in mind, he made the brave decision of starting from scratch and changing his path to accountancy. It was late Mr MS Zoha, a prominent Bengali accountant, who inspired Mr Mahbub. Mr Mahbub used to work for one of Mr Zoha's clients and the turning point of his life was when he went to Mr Zoha's office to collect his P45 and being offered a job in his office in 1991. Instead of using the conventional method of manual book keeping and accounting, Mr Mahbub became the pioneer among British Bangladeshis by using his computer programming skills to write his own software.

After being in the shadow of Mr Zoha for nearly 10 years and gaining invaluable work experience and academic qualifications, Mr Mahbub decided to set up his own accountancy firm, Mahbub and Co, in 2001 with his younger brother Shah Arif. Starting off with just one employee and a handful of small clients, it was a huge risk for anyone to start with a fragile business in a competitive market. But through dedication, multilingual skills

and sincerity, Mr Mahbub was able to expand his business from strength to strength. His friendly professional approach towards his clients has given him a name, "The Accountant with a Smile". Additionally Mr Mahbub has supported many of the youth with work experience and career development. Currently Mahbub and Co is holding the ACCA Gold status as an employer, awarded only to the firms which provide high quality work experience in accountancy. After serving the community for more than a decade, Mr Mahbub launched his new and unique initiative to fulfil the community's need for accountancy related issues. He is the key person together with NTV Europe to start producing the programme "Accountancy with Mahbub Murshed". He believes in empowering the community. So, rather than bringing the people to the accountant's office he went live on TV to answer the questions in his own capacity.

Being inspired by the success of this TV programme, he decided to set up a training institute in conjunction with his firm where school leavers, accounting students, newly qualified accountants and unemployed people could gain hands-on training and practical knowledge. The initial purpose of this training programme was to break the vicious circle of "not getting a job without experience and no experience could be gained without a job". Mr Mahbub devotes time from his relentless schedule to teach the students.

He also sponsors charities, sports, cultural and community activities. Mr Mahbub is passionate about photography and gardening. His amateur, yet artistic photography is loved by the wider audiences in social media. He plays badminton, listens to music and watches

Mr Mahbub is married to Nilufa Murshed, daughter of a well known Sylheti businessman of the 1960s - Mr Mosahid Ali. Their son, Nayeem Murshed, has graduated in Biochemistry from Imperial College London, and daughter, Nimah Murshed, is an A Level student.



Abu Nasir is a sports entrepreneur and football business leader who has been involved in football and sports since the age of 7 as a player, coach, and sports business executive at both grassroots and professional level. He is one of the highest profile football executives in the professional game from a South Asian background. Abdul Nashir (Wahab) is a businessman and community leader from Manchester, U.K.







Syed Nahas Pasha was born in 1957, in Sylhet, Bangladesh. He is married to Syeda Murshida Pasha and has two daughters and one son.



Born in Bangladesh, Jagannathpur, Sylhet he moved to the UK at the age of one. His father moved to the UK shortly after the Second World War and was a British Citizen.

As a child Akke was always very athletic taking part in all forms of sport from an early age. In secondary school he was a member of the basketball and football team and at the age of 13 realised his love for athletics which lead to becoming triple jump champion of Greater Manchester and also ran a 11.5 seconds 100m PB.

After leaving school he went to college and university to study Software Engineering at Huddersfield University, after a year dropped out then went to Oldham Business Management School to study Business Information Technology.

After leaving university he had several jobs, he married Hena Rahman, they have 3 children. Shortly after marriage he opened his Mortgage Company Group 5 where they also handle insurance claims. Currently still a Director at Group 5, however a new passion found him, Mountaineering.

This is where it all began, Akke climbed Snowdon for the first time in 2019, then went on to Climb Mount Ebrus, Europe's Highest Mountain in Russia. He also Climbed Kilimanjaro, highest mountain in Africa and Mont Blanc in the Alps within 7 days,

achieving two mountains in two continents within 7 days. He then went onto climb Elbrus again after a storm halted the 2019 attempt, however this time is was a Record, this attempt was 5 days after recovering from covid and it was accomplished without acclimatisation in less than 24hours.

After Elbrus came Mount Ama Dablam, the crown jewel of the Himalayas. And finally Mount Everest. This Expedition had to be delayed as Akke wanted to spend the first Part of Ramadan with his family and went to base camp two weeks late, however the climb was accomplished in 21days from Base Camp with only one rotation, making him the first British Bangladeshi Muslim to climb Mount Everest.



Akik F. Rahman came to England in 1973. Mr Rahman first began work during his studies and started his first business in 1977 in West Kensington, London. His next business was open in North London in 1985. In 1986 he opened a restaurant in Cirencester. These were all followed by his next business in 1993 in Swindon another in 1995 in Cheltenham and 2006 in Marlborough.

Mr Rahman is also involved in investment properties, as well as being an investor in many projects in Bangladesh; he is the Director of Dreamland amusement park in Sylhet, first amusement park in Bangladesh and the Director of Valley city resort in Sylhet.

Rahman moved onto making spiritual and religious

music and was selected by Ekushey Television to be the voice of the Adhan (call to prayer). Rahman has sang over 600 songs, which include Hindi and Bangla songs. His best of album Best of Alaur Rahman was released by Serengeti Sirocco. His songs are about the loss of a sense of belonging and the material conditions that underpin his life in Britain. Alaur Rahman has sang over 600 songs, which have been sung in many languages such as Hindi, Bengali, Urdu, Gujrati and more.

Rahman has won numerous awards globally. These have included awards from Zee TV, Channel i, ATN, Bangla TV and Channel S, where he has won awards for being the best singer.

In 1986, Rahman married Rozina Rahman. They have two sons Rabi and Ra'id, and a daughter Aniqa.





Anis Rahman is a practising barrister and a magistrate who was a Whitehall Civil Servant for twenty years. 

He is chairman of Essex based Scintilla Cricket Club - a grassroots outfit run by volunteers which over the course of ten years has enjoyed a meteoric rise to the top, namely achieving several promotions before being crowned Essex County Cricket League Premier Division Champions in 2014.

In terms of recognition Emdad has received Civic Awards and a Volunteer of the Year Award from Alderman David Brewer - the Mayor of the City of London at the time. He was named Londoner of the day in 2011 and through City Hall he featured in a London billboard poster campaign which highlighted volunteering in the city.

Emdad was a London Ambassador and also carried the Paralympic Torch at the London Olympics of 2012. He was made an MBE in the late Queen Elizabeth New Years Honours List. The Canary Wharf Group recognised his achievements with a sporting personality award



The Centre focuses primarily on the development and enhancement of community health, education and business enterprise. The centre has many strategic partnerships with likes of St Paul's Way School, Guinness Trust and Poplar Harca. It's activities have been globally recognised and used as a benchmark for other social organisations and projects. Zenith is still actively involved with the Centre as the Vice President and has been honoured with the title of 'Mother of the Centre'.

Zenith has also worked on various international social and health programmes with NGO's such as VARD and has successfully held knowledge sharing sessions with the worlds largest NGO BRAC on poverty social welfare.

Her work has received many acknowledgments and recognitions in her respected field, such as, the European Community Hero Award by the Bank of America.

She previously sat on the board for both Toy House Library and Kobi Nazrul Centre.

She is a former Labour Councillor for the London Borough of Tower Hamlets.





Tipu Rahman made his journey from Bangladesh to the UK some 28 years ago originally to further his education. Like most students Mr Rahman took a part time job to bolster his finances. Working at his brother's Indian restaurant in Leicester, it was here that Mr Rahman found a new passion which was to mould his future in cooking and creating South Asian food.

Following and during these awards Mr Rahman has been featured in many National newspapers, magazines and also National television which have given him celebrity status within the UK.

In addition to this Mr Rahman is the World record holder for the largest Poppadom Tower reaching a height of five foot eight inches which was achieved under strict observation. He officially cooked his prized dishes for Scout Jamboree which included scouts from 38 different countries. Mr Rahman's recognition as an international Chef showcasing the food of Bangladesh led to the ultimate accolade of being requested to cook for the Honourable Prime Minister of Bangladesh Sheikh Hasina who recognises him as the culinary ambassador for the country.

Mr Rahman is currently serving as a Senior Vice President of the Bangladesh Caterer Association and President of East Midlands Region. In 2015-16 he has successfully presented BCA Chef competition in Northampton College where he was the head of the Chef's Awards Committee, which was covered by the National media such as BBC, ITV and local and National Newspapers.

In 2022, Mr Rahman Has opened a flagship fine dine restaurant TR Lounge in the heart of Gulshan-2, Dhaka, Bangladesh to explore his own creative fusion signature dishes to the food market of Bangladesh.

Mr Rahman has a pride and passion for creating gastronomic dishes and presenting them in style, the Bangladeshi province of Sylhet is known as the province the Curry built, well Mr Rahman is destined to add many more bricks to

Mizanur Rahman Mizan is a well known businessman, community activist and Journalist.

He started charity work since he was a high school student, by giving clothes, food and water to the extreme poor in Syhlet Bangladesh. He is a Former hockey player of the Bangladesh national team as well as he played for two top clubs in Bangladesh called, Dhaka Mohamadan and Dhaka Abahani and was the captain of Dhaka Abahani 1988. He also is a life time member Sylhet Red crescent.

He started charity work and later on set up his own charity called Just Help Foundation which has been running since 2007.

The charity organisation has helped many people in Bangladesh and the organisation is helping with education, providing clean water, sanitation, rickshaw project and building houses for the poor.

The big example of work was the Shihab cancer Appeal who was 7 years old, Hafiz Iqbal heart surgery 21 years old, Azua Enam who had a hole in his heart and was 2 years old, Borsha who was 5 years old and had heart disease, the Burn victims, the poor families support such as help with the wedding of daughters of widows, Bangladesh Sidr Cyclone which hit the south coast of Bangladesh in 2007, Ag Para mosque, Jollarpar mosque, Burhan Uddin Madrasa.

In all of these projects Mizan managed to raise more than £150k, the biggest project being the Just Help Eye hospital, Gowainghat Syhlet. These include over 700 cataract operations and it is completely free of charge for the poor people.

Mizanur Rahman Mizan the founder and chairman of Just Help foundation has been working as a journalist for the past 21 years, he also is involved with different organisations such

as North England Bangladeshi TV Journalist association which he is the president of, chairman of labour friends of Bangladesh (tameside& Greater Manchester) vice chairman of Hyde Jamia Mosque, Bureau Cheif manchester of Channel S, Founder member of Tameside rotary club, NHS trust, interfaith Organasation and also a member of The London Bangla press club as well other respectable organisations. He also played an active role in the community, as a community activist he achieved many recognition from different organisations and was awarded the best community activist award 2008 which was given channel S, Joy tell community award 2015, Burnley Jamia Mosque and Islamic centre lifetime community achievement 2016, Pride in Hyde 2017.

Desh Foundation UK awarded and Mizan the best charity organisation in the UK in 2017, Lifetime sports personality award given by Amana foundation 2016, Hyde Bangladesh welfare association was awarded the best community in 2016 also he has received many recognition from other organisations. Just help foundation has also been active in the UK and has helped with treatment, supporting schools and local clubs to keep young people busy with education and sports so they can have the best future possible.

Every year Mizan runs an A level and GCSE award praising the outstanding students of all culture and backgrounds, he has also set up a youth sports club which has been running successfully for 2 years and the main objective of this club is to keep the youth distracted from drugs and antisocial behaviour by playing sports activities, He also runs his own business called Mizan property Solutions as well as Adnans Restaurant Hyde ,Manchester.

Alhaj Md Sajjadur Rahman was born in Dighal Bak village, Nabigonj, Habi Gonj District in 1945. He has been married to Begum Sadeha Rahman for the past 55 years and has three sons, Abu Nasir, Shuebur & Maqsoodur and one daughter Tahmina. After completing his studies in Bangladesh he moved to the UK in 1963 and resided in Bradford and Liverpool and was employed by Northern Textile Mills whilst studying at Bradford Technical College and was involved in politics with the Labour Party, Trade Unions and dedicated his time to significant community work. He made an immediate impact and established the Howard Street Jame Masjid and set up the East Pakistan Peoples Association.

He was also a keen football enthusiast and followed Liverpool FC and was only a handful of Asians since the 60's to be involved in the game, attending matches, and running grassroots football. He used this is a toolkit to engage the wider community and enhance social integration.

He returned to Bangladesh for a short period and elected as Dighal Bak Union Awami League President after being involved in the setup of the six point movement with Bangho Bandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, and later helped the Awami League to victory in the 1970 East Pakistan general election as one of the key strategists of the Awami League, working closely with Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, Dewan Forid Gazi, Abdur Razak, Abdus Samad Azad, SM Kibria and was the political advisor to Major General M A Rob. He was involved in the liberation movement and was a key member of the Mukhdi Judha Freedom Fighters, putting himself and his family's lives at risk to help start the liberation process which eventually led to the independence of Bangladesh. As a key strategist of the liberation movement, the Awami League hierarchy encouraged him to move back to the UK to help gain support from the West for the independence of Bangladesh, which he helped influence through his involvement in politics in Britain.

He moved to Luton in 1978 and was employed by General Mo-

tors as a production engineer until 1999 after taking early retirement due to ill health. During his time in England, he was involved in community and charity work and helped set up several initiatives including a Bengali School, Sports Clubs, Community & Voluntary Groups and was a member of several organisations as President, Secretary and Treasurer.

He was also a Trustee and a founding member of Bury Park Jame Masjid and Jalalabad Mosque & Islamic Cultural Centre in Luton in which he was President for over two decades. He has been President of Luton Awami League for the past three decades and Chairman of Al Furghan Foundation Trust.

He is currently the Chief Advisor to the Noor-E-Madina Foundation and Chair of a couple of school in Dighal Bak, Nabi Gonj which he founded and financially supported during the past 35 years. Bajloor Rashid MBE is a renowned British Bangladeshi businessman and philanthropist.

Currently, he is the founding president and co-founder of the UK Bangladesh Catalysts of Commerce and Industry (UKBCCI). This influential business organisation helps promote trade between Bangladesh and the UK. Recently he led a trade delegation to Bangladesh which proved to be very successful and mutually beneficial to both nations. Born in Moulvi Bazaar in Bangladesh, he came to the UK in 1978. He gained a reputation in the eighties for his entrepreneurial skill in setting up a number of restaurants with his brother.

This dynamism led to him becoming one of the most prominent figures in the history of the Bangladesh Caterers Association (BCA), with him being their president from 2006 to 2012.

This in turn led to a debate in the House of Commons just days later.

In his long and successful business career, Mr Rashid has been either a Director or Chairman of 20 different successful companies. His business portfolio also includes the wholesale business of rice and spice and his real estate company, Atlantic Properties.

His passionate work ethic has led to him receiving a number of awards over the years.

In 2012, the BB (British Bangladeshi) Power 100 List ranked him as one of the most influential BB individuals in the UK. The following year he was awarded first place in the Community Personality category by the same organisation. He has also been recognised in the BB Power 100 in 2016 and 2017 in the Networks and Association category. Mr Rashid has also received many awards in recognition of his work, including the BCA Honour Award and the Channel S Business Personality Award.

Bajloor Rashid became a Member of the Order of the British Empire in 2012. This was the first time a BCA president had been recognised with an MBE in the New Year's Honours.

As a result of helping communities in the UK and Bangladesh, he was duly recognised by being listed in the Muslim Power 100 in 2018. With a deep concern about environmental issues, Mr Rashid has been at the forefront of many community projects including assisting the plight of communities affected by catastrophic world disasters such as Cyclone Sidr.

Mr Rashid is married and has four grown up children, who are all now in professional careers.



Mohammed Mamun Rashid was born in Bangladesh and came to London for a better life. Upon his arrival to the UK at the age of 17, he faced many obstacles and struggles - but he embraced the challenges and turned them into opportunities.

Mamun Rashid has always been a very motivated entrepreneur, and this can be highlighted through when he started his own business - a garment and tailor company. This turned out to be a very successful enterprise, as it operated for 22 years. In the early 2000s, Mamun's passion turned him towards his local community as he became very socially active in local politics. His love for the community and his people got him very involved with charity, youth work, helping the local mosque and so much more. The support from the people resulted in a local election win, as he was elected as a Councillor in 2006.

Abdus Salam is a community figure both in Moulvibazar and in London. He is the son of Late Mohammed Samroo, a leading figure in the curry industry and one of the founders of BCA, and Mrs Saveda Sufia Khanam, a social activist in Moulvibazar.

His passion for cricket began when he was involved within his locality in the Old Hospital Road cricket team. As his love for cricket grew he began playing with Friends Cricket Club from 1982. From 1987, Abdus came to the U.K, where he joined the Bangladesh Youth Cricket team in London, later joining Abahani cricket club, Surrey. His love of sports extended to football and table tennis also.

Abdus Salam continued being directly involved in Cricket both through playing, and philanthropy. He was a founder member and current treasurer for Rajnagar Welfare Society UK. In 2005 he immersed himself further into sharing cricket with the wider community, becoming the first chairman of London Tigers cricket club. Abdus led the Tigers on a tour of Bangladesh in 2011 during the ICC Cricket World Cup.

Abdus Salam is the founder president of the Bangladesh Cricket Supporters Association (BCSA UK). This is the official supporters' group of the Bangladesh cricket team as recognised by the International Cricket Council. The BCSA UK worked in coalition with the ICC during the Champions Trophy 2017 and ICC Cricket World Cup 2019, both of which were held in the UK. The ICC confirmed that the BCSA sold over 10k tickets to Bangladeshi fans during these events.

Abdus Salam helped found Cricket Players Association

Moulvibazar (CPAM UK), to encourage the previous generation of the Moulvibazar community now in the UK to reconnect though cricket. He became the first CPAM UK president between 2018-2019. He leads by example, is very active, still playing cricket at the age of 56.

Abdus Salam is a founder of the Bangladesh District Cup Cricket Competition UK, now in its fourth year.

Abdus Salam is involved in a range of philanthropy activities, including in his neighbourhood in Moulvibazar, donating cricket equipment, sponsoring the Moulvibazar U14 district cricket team and guiding newly arrived cricketers in the UK to cricket pathway programmes.

Whenever the ECB want to consult on any issues related to Bangladesh, the media team contact Abdus as he has become a well know voice of Bangladeshi cricket in the UK. He appears regularly on TV as a commentator of Bangladeshi cricket.

In May 2023, the BCSA UK supported Essex Country Cricket Club to organise the Bangladesh vs Ireland matches at Chelmsford, Essex. Due to the influence of Abdus Salam, he was given the prestigious honour as the first official Bell Ringer during the ODI between Ireland and Bangladesh. This recognition has never been given to any Bangladeshi person before and that is why 2023 is the year of achievement for Abdus Salam.

Abdus Salam is married to Naznin Nahar Salam and has three children. Tabia, Sakhawath and Affan.

During the liberation movement North West HQ was my restaurant at Shalimar.

Founding General Secretary, Bangladesh Society, Welfare and Community Service, Member of the Lions Club International, Committee Member of the Chester Chamber of Trade and the Nantwich Chamber of Trade. He is also the permanent Member of the Habiganj Society, Dhaka. He is also a life member of Jalabad Asso Dhaka, and life member of Bighab Unnion Shantha Dhaki.



'Ziola' was remixed by the globally well-known DJ Judge Jules for his album 'Dance Wars. Tulip has her own blog where she writes about both British and Bengali politics.







His enthusiasm for education was obvious, as he decided to attend the Mathew Bolton College. There he studied electronic engineering for a year. His positive and encouraging approach towards the Bangladeshi community was without a doubt noticeable and consequently it resulted in him becoming the General Secretary of Bangladeshi Society in Stoke-On-Trent, Staffordshire from 1987-1990. In 1995, Mr Tuahid was given the role of vice chairman and later, the role of General Secretary of "Onuprash" Jatio Kobi Shangaton, an organization created with the aim to help the Bangladeshi community.

Mr Tuahid founded and became the Chairman of the Midland Press Club in 2005. He decided to take up the role of Editor of Bazaar Voice as he had a good background in journalism. In addition, he was the editor of a Bengali magazine aimed at young Bangladeshis, named Paira. 'Jodi Pere Ashe Kobu', a poetry book written by Mr Tuahid, was published in Bangladesh in 2006 and proved to thrive greatly.

At this moment in time, he is the managing editor of the weekly Bangla Voice, the only Bengali newspaper published in the Midlands. Also, he is a representative of the weekly Potrika and the weekly Bangla Mirror, two newspapers involved with the British Bangladeshi community.

Married to Lilma Choudhury, he and his wife have three children named Sheik Hussain, Sheik Salman and Sheik Ferdus. Mr Tuahid lives with his wife and children in Solihull in the West Midlands.



Fahim Talukder, born as only son to Mahfuja Khatun and notable community activist in Birmingham, Advocate Tofayal Ahmed. He is the eldest grandson of prominent businessman Al Haj Abdul Alim of Osamaninagar, Goalabazar. He was one of the very first few British Bangladeshis to enter prestigious King Edwards Grammar Schools in the 1990s. He then went on to finish his education and teaching qualification at St Anne's College, University of Oxford in 2012. He has been in the field of education for nearly a decade, working his way up to be one of the youngest curriculum leaders in the country at the age of 25.

Headhunted in 2019 Fahim moved to the United Arab Emirates where he has been Head of the Politics Faculty at one of the top ranked private institutions in United Arab Emirates, Dubai English Speaking College. During the pandemic, he was part of a team working with H.EDr. Ahmad Abdulla Humaid Abdulla Belhoul Al FalasiMinister of Education in UAE, providing his expertise in improving the National Curriculum and improving teaching and learning standards.

His experiences also include teaching English Language at the prestigious BRAC University to Bangladesh Civil Service Servants, under the guidance of the late Sir Fazle Hasan Abed. Furthermore, he has worked with the Ministry of Education in Bangladesh with the Institution of Governance Studies. Where he has mentored civil servants of Bangladesh in pursuing their higher students and research activities.

Other notable credits include being appointed Lead Examiner for History and Government & Politics for Pearson International in 2021 and is in the process of launching an educational consultancy providing expertise to students in the MENA region in application for Higher Education in the UK, US, Australia and Canada. He is a philanthropist at heart as Fahim has been part of various charity projects in Bangladesh. As a doting father to his two girls, his passion involves working to improve women empowerment in the field of education.

In 1988, Baroness Uddin became the first Bangladeshi woman councillor in UK, representing Shadwell Ward in Tower Hamlets. She is a pioneer of women's work. She is an activist and campaigner for social justice, human rights with particular focus on empowerment of women. This led her to working in Local Government, subsequently becoming a councillor and elected as Deputy Leader of Tower Hamlets council in 1992.

In recognition for her contribution to the community and advancement of women's rights, Baroness Uddin was appointed by the Queen to become the first Bangladeshi and Muslim to enter the House of Lords in 1998.

Baroness Uddin began her activism inspired by the movement in late 70's against the fascist activities in Brick Lane. She became involved in Labour led community coalition countering racism. Consequently immersing in the anti racist movement of the 80's amongst a handful of leading women, which eventually saw the transformation of the East End of London. She led alongside contemporaries, many campaigns which resulted in increase equity in the provision of healthcare, education and housing for residents of Tower Hamlets. With her friends and colleagues she set up the Jagonari, the UK's first purpose built Asian women's education and training centre, as well as contributing to the development of several community led NGOs, many of which over the decades improved opportunities and access to services as well as jobs, particularly for women During her term as deputy leader of Tower Hamlets Council, she led with her colleagues changes to the council's policies to 'reflect the community' within its workforce.

As a member of the House of Lords, Baroness Uddin has worked on the Select Committee on European Affairs and chaired several government Task Forces, leading the work on domestic violence and forced marriage. She was also asked by then Prime Minister to chair the work with women on Community Cohesion and Preventing Extremism, which enabled her to travel across many parts of UK as well as Middle East, Europe and

As the chair of the All Party Parliamentary Group on Bangladesh, in 2004 and 2008 she assisted the Disaster Emergency Response Committee, launching in the Parliament, their fundraising campaign, inviting amongst others Christian Aid, Save the Children Fund, Oxfam, involving the leading Muslim Charities to respond to the disastrous flood and cyclone in Bangladesh.

In 2008 she was asked to Chair of the Black, Asian and minority Ethnic Women Councillors Taskforce, a cross party initiative set up by the Government. In her role as Chair, Baroness Uddin set out and successfully securing the commitment of the Prime Minister and the Opposition Leaders to change the face of political institutions and address the gross underrepresentation of minority women in public life with evident success. Professionally, over a decade she worked in Newham Social Services. More recently with Addaction led the Zurich International funded, Breaking the Cycle Project which worked successfully across UK, with families affected by drugs and alcohol.



Valerie Ann Taylor was born on the 8th February 1944, in Bromley, Kent, UK to parents Marie and William Taylor.

Valerie is a Fellow of the Chartered Society of Physiotherapy (FCSP) and first came to Bangladesh with Voluntary Service Overseas (VSO) in 1969 to work as a physiotherapist in the Christian Hospital, Chandraghona in the Chittagong Hill Tracts, East Pakistan.

Her stay was interrupted by the War of Independence in 1971. During the war Valerie was evacuated but returned to the country in October 1971, two months before the liberation of Bangladesh.

Having grown up living close to the National Spinal Injuries Centre at Stoke Mandeville in England, she was very aware of the need for rehabilitation services for the disabled in Bangladesh.

In 1973 Valerie returned to England to raise funds to establish a rehabilitation centre for paralysed people. She stayed in England for two years before returning in 1975. It took another four years before CRP was able to admit its first patients in 1979. During this time, Valerie worked in the Shaheed Suhrawardy Hospital in Dhaka and it was in the grounds of this hospital that CRP had its first premises, two cement store rooms which were used to treat the first spinally

injured patients. Rather like gypsies, having moved to three locations during the first eleven years, CRP then found a permanent home and moved to Savar in mid 1990 where the head office is situated.

Valerie's achievements have been recognized with various accolades. She received the OBE (Order of the British Empire) in 1995 from Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth; the Bangladesh Independence Award in 2004; Honorary Doctorate Degree (2010), by York St John University, UK and The ONE Award 2013 by Rotary International. Nirafat Anam Memorial Inclusion Award (NAMI Award) 2015 by The Asian Centre for Inclusive Education (ACIE), In 1998 Valerie was granted Bangladeshi citizenship by the Government of Bangladesh.

Valerie has been legal guardian to two Bangladeshi girls for several years. She continues to live adjacent to the CRP-Savar premises with her younger adopted daughter, Poppy. While Joyti, the elder one works as a computer operator in the CRP office and lives next door.





Anwar Uddin has been involved in top level football for over 15 years. He begun his career at premier league club West Ham United where he grew up with world class players including Rio Ferdinand, Frank Lampard and Jermaine Defoe, to name a few. A successful education winning the FA youth cup and being among the first team squad paved the way for a long career playing in all 4 divisions in English Football. Anwar went on to represent Sheffield Wednesday, Bristol Rovers, Dagenham & Redbridge, Barnet and Eastbourne Borough. Anwar was the first British Asian to be appointed as an Assistant Manager (Barnet 2011) and captain of a football league club ( Dagenham 2006 ). He has also clocked up hundreds of first team appearances winning championships and accomplishing a boyhood dream of lifting a trophy at the new Wembley Stadium in Dagenham's triumphant play off win.

Anwar has been extremely productive with his time away from his playing duties and is now a fully qualified coach working towards his A- Licence which is among the highest qualifications in football Coaching. Anwar spent last season working with the West Ham United Academy as a coach and has been recently appointed as Assistant Manager to non league side Maldon & Tipree.

Having now retired as a player Anwar's full time role is the with the Football Supporters' Federation as Di-

versity and Campaigns Manager in partnership with Kick It Out. Anwar's role is to work with the millions of Football fans in making football as inclusive and accessible for all. The role includes travelling around the world with football fans Internationally and domestically, challenging the number of issues supporters may face following football.

This is something that Anwar is now synonymous with having spent 2 and a half years delivering anti discrimination education to footballers of all levels and students all over the country. Anwar undertook this work for the Professional Footballers Association and Show Racism the red card who have also inducted Anwar into the show Racism the Red Card hall of fame, for his contribution to all their anti racism work in education and Football.

Anwar was born and raised in the heart of East London and went to School at Raines Foundation in Bethnal Green. He is part of a big family consisting of 3 sisters and 2 brothers and now lives in Kent with his wife and two boys Kai and Jayden.

Though he is originally from Nabiganj, he resides permanently in Sadipur, Sylhet with his family.

Moin Uddin started his education in Dhigalbak Government Primary School. He went on to further his education in Dhigalbak High School, however, came to the UK with his family before completing his due. On arriving in the UK, he joined Leeds Roundhy High School from where he obtained his GCSE's (then known as GCE O- Levels). Mr Uddin then joined Kingston College to study A-levels, from where he went on to run his own business.

At present he has several businesses predominantly in the Surrey area. He is also the founder and owner of the Rose View Hotel. Rose View is the first five star rated hotel in Sylhet and also has the accolade of being the first five star rated hotel outside of the capital Dhaka.



Prior to Mr Uddin's involvement with BBCGH, he has been actively involved with a number of sociocultural and charitable organisations of Beani Bazar both in the UK and in Bangladesh since a young age. Mr Uddin's UK life began in the early seventies after joining his father who had been here since 1942. Mr Uddin and his father were involved in various retail businesses before establishing the Tower Tandoori Restaurant in the Tower Bridge area. The family were able to successfully establish a mini chain of Indian Restaurants in the late 80s. Today, the Tower Tandoori is known as one of London's oldest Tandoori restaurants and celebrates its 40th Anniversary in

2018. The Farncombe Tandoori in Surrey, another restaurant opened by Mr Uddin and his father celebrates its 35th Year in business in 2018.

Mr Uddin's father was one of the first Bangladeshi landlords in the East End; he has also helped Mr Uddin invest in the Property Market in the UK and Bangladesh. Mr Uddin has since been able to expand his property business globally.

Mohammed Shab Uddin married Nilufa Begum in 1985 and they are blessed with three sons and one daughter. Their sons have all completed higher education and are involved in the family property business and catering businesses. Tower Tandoori is well known for being run by the 3rd generation of the family, eldest son Suhel Ahmed. Third son, Russel Ahmed also plays an important role in helping run the family businesses. 

His father is Syed Muhammed Idris and his mother is Rafia Khatun Chowdhury. Uddin currently lives in Chigwell, Essex, with his wife, Hadi Jannah, and daughter, Shompreeti. His hobbies include reading, gardening, travelling and cooking.

Having studied for his Bachelor of Science in Quantity Surveying Building & Construction, he continued his studies and obtained a Diploma in Construction Management. He started his career working within the construction industry, and continued his career progression in local government working for different local authorities and housing associations. He is currently working for a leading housing association in London at senior management level and is a member of several professional bodies.

Nobab is one of the founder members of the London Bangla Press Club. Established in 1991, it is an important association for Bangladeshi journalists in Britain. In addition to carrying out his role first as Treasurer of the Club, he was President from 2014-16.

Nobab is respected for his voluntary work across various community and charity organisations in London. From 1990 to 1994, he was the General Secretary of the largest Bengali organisation BWAG (Surma Centre) in Camden, North London. Indeed, his role as General Secretary was during a seminal time as the local British Bangladeshi community developed in London and he was instrumental in working with Camden Council to deliver a dedicated building for the Surma Centre.


Nobab is the Chief Adviser of the historic Bangladesh Centre in Notting Hill, an active associate of London Borough Tower

Hamlets 'Boishaki Mela Engagement Group' and is also an Adviser of the 'British Bangladeshi Power & Inspiration 100'. He has loved sport from an early age, representing his school and district at national level in both badminton and athletics in Bangladesh. This keen interest in sports led to him forming the Bengali Sports Council in UK 1988, in support of National Sports Council. He was founder Secretary of this organisation, encouraging and motivating youths to take an active part in sports. The engagement between community and youth centres was instrumental in helping British Bangladeshis integrate into both the wider community during the turbulent 80s in London as well as mainstream British sports culture. His productions appeal directly to Bangladeshis and Nobab is unflinching in reflecting profound social dilemmas and tackling taboo subjects, such as forced marriages and drug use in the British Bangladeshi community.

He has published five books, and edited three, including The Racist Murder of Altab Ali, which was important in highlighting the senseless murder of a Bengali East End, garment worker in 1978.

Dr. Wali Tasar Uddin MBE DBA was born on April 17, 1952, in Moulvibazar, Bangladesh. He was educated in Moulvibazar before moving to the United Kingdom in 1967, where he began working in restaurants and pursued further education.

Over the years, Britannia Spice has won numerous awards: Les Routiers Best Newcomer (2001); Best in Scotland at the British Curry Awards for three consecutive years (2005, 2006, 2007); BIBA Award (2004, 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2014); Sunday Times Travel Magazine: Best Indian Restaurant in Scotland (2001); and 2008 Restaurant of the Year in the Irn Bru Curry Awards. 2014 Bangladesh Caterers Association Restaurant of the Year Award and the 2014 Good Curry Guide Exceptional Restaurant of the Year Award.

His contribution to the restaurant sector was recognized in 2006 with BIBA's Industry Personality of the Year award as well as the Asian Jewel Lifetime Achievement award. Wali has also embraced charitable work, taking on prominent roles as the Senior Adviser for BRAC UK, Joint Convener of the British-Bangladeshis Royal Honored Council (BBRHC), Director of Sylhet Central Dental College, Heart Foundation, and advisor of the Scottish Parliament International Development Committee.

Dr. Uddin is also an active director of the Edinburgh and Leith Chambers of Commerce, the Institute of Directors, and Rotary International. He is also a director of the Council of the Foreign Chambers of Commerce in the UK, a founder member and director of Britain in Europe, and he was Chairman

of the University of East London Business School Advisory Board. The Junior Chamber voted him Young Scot of the Year in 1992. This success in the business world has brought recognition from many sides. In 1984, Dr. Uddin was the first Bangladeshi in Scotland to be made a Justice of the Peace. In 1993, he was appointed as the first Honorary Consul-General of Bangladesh in Scotland, and in 1995, he was made a Member of the British Empire for his services to race relations. He is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts and, in 2003, was included in Debretts' People of Today.

In 2000, he was awarded a Doctorate in Business Administration (Honoris Causa) by Queen Margaret University, Edinburgh. Moreover, Dr. Wali was awarded a Doctor of Letters (D. Litt.) in 2007 by Heriot-Watt University and a Doctor of the University (D. University) by Edinburgh Napier University.

He is the chairman of the Council for Bangladeshis in Scotland, the founder of Edinburgh's Central Mosque, and a trustee of the Shahjalal Mosque and Islamic Center. He is also chairman of the Commonwealth Society of Edinburgh and the BanglaScot Foundation. Additionally, has serves Chairman of the Edinburgh Bangladesh Samity and Edinburgh Mela.

Dr. Uddin, was President and DG of the Bangladesh-British Chamber of Commerce, played a significant role in the success of Expo Bangladesh 2005, the UK's first Bangladesh-specific trade show. A hundred companies from Bangladesh were represented alongside UK-based organizations with an interest in Bangladesh's export trade and non-resident Bangladeshi In Bangladesh, he has working as the Chairman and Chief Coordinator of the Sylhet Women's Medical College and Hospital, a Trustee of the Bangladesh Female Academy, and an advisor to the Atish Dipankar University of Science & Technologies in Dhaka.

Mr. Kamal Yakub as he is commonly known hails from Sylhet and lives in Surrey. He came to the UK as a full time student in 1972 soon after independence of Bangladesh. He passed 'A' Levels in Pure Maths, Applied Maths and Physics from Paddington Technical College London. Later, Mr. Yakub completed a full time 3 year Degree Course at University College London (UCL) and successfully obtained a degree in Engineering in 1977. Worked for some time in Burma Oil Company's Research Centre in Bracknell. In 1980 he started his own restaurant business in Worcester Park, Surrey and has since been in the catering trade till to date with different outlets. Mr. Yakub is the current National President of Bangladesh Caterers Association UK Ltd, popularly known as BCA. This organisation has been running for 58 years since inception and is the oldest and largest of its kind.

Mr Yakub first joined BCA in 1986 and has always remained with BCA as an active member both regionally and nationally. He served as Secretary of 'BCA Surrey Region' and then during the last term Mr. Yakub was the President of BCA Surrey Region. Prior to being elected as the 'National President' of BCA in May 2017 (for a term of 2 years) he had been a Senior Vice President continuously for a few terms in a row. Mr. Yakub held the responsibility as the Convener of BCA's Annual Award & Dinner Committee over the last few years (upto Nov 2016) requiring a substantial amount of activities and experience. During the Presidency of Mr. Mahmadar Rashid, Mr Yakub headed a team to represent BCA to Sheffield Home Office officials where a round table talk was held regarding 'Sector Based Scheme'. Outside BCA, Mr. Yakub has been a Trustee and Secretary of Surrey Muslim Centre in Addlestone, Surrey since 2006.He is also involved in other community related voluntary works. He is a senior adviser for 'Surrey Muslim Funeral Services' which is a voluntary organisation. As a person, he is a man of principle and a thorough gentleman and is liked by both the younger and the older generations.
